- 6 4500.1200 CHANGE OF OFFICE SOUGHT BY CANDIDATE.
- 7 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]
- 8 Subp. 3. Public financing agreement. A candidate may sign
- 9 a public financing agreement for each office sought until
- 10 September 1 of the general election year. Signing a public
- 11 financing agreement by September 1 automatically rescinds a
- 12 previously filed agreement for another office.
- 13 4500.1500 JUDICIAL CANDIDATE.
- 14 Subpart 1. Aggregate contributions. Contributions to a
- 15 candidate for district court or-county-court which in aggregate
- 16 exceed \$100 shall be disclosed in accordance with requirements
- 17 set forth in Minnesota Statutes, section 10A.20, subdivision 3,
- 18 clause (b).
- 19 Subp. 2. Contributions from one source. Contributions to
- 20 a candidate for district court of-county-court from any one
- 21 source totaling more than \$400 received between the last day
- 22 covered in the last report prior to an election and the election
- 23 shall be reported to the board in person, by telegram or
- 24 mailgram, or by certified mail sent within 48 hours after
- 25 receipt and also in the next required report.
- 26 4500.2500 JOINT LIMITS FOR GOVERNOR AND LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR.
- 27 Subpart 1. Public financing agreement. Following their
- 28 joint endorsement or filing for office, candidates for governor
- 29 and lieutenant governor must jointly sign the public financing
- 30 agreement if they wish to participate in public financing.
- 31 Subp. 2. [Unchanged.]
- 32 4505.0300 LATE FILING FEES.
- The board shall send a delinquency notice by certified mail
- 34 to a public official or candidate within ten business days after

- 1 a filing date. A certified letter returned by the post office
- 2 to the board as refused is considered received by the addressee
- 3 on the date refused. The late filing fee begins accumulating on
- 4 the eighth day after refusal. A certified letter returned to
- 5 the board as undelivered or refused must be forwarded by first
- 6 class mail to the public official or candidate. An undelivered
- 7 notice of late filing is considered received by the recipient
- 8 five business days after the first class mailing. A late filing
- 9 fee must be charged through the business day preceding the day
- 10 of filing of a late statement. A late filing fee may not be
- 11 assessed for Saturday, Sunday, or legal holidays.
- 12 4510.1200 LATE FILING FEES.
- The late filing fee shall commence the eighth day following
- 14 receipt of a late filing notice, unless the eighth day falls on
- 15 Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday. The late filing fee shall
- 16 then commence the next business day. A late filing fee shall
- 17 not be assessed for Saturday, Sunday, or legal holidays.
- 18 A certified letter returned to the board by the United
- 19 States Post Office marked "refused" shall be deemed to have been
- 20 received by the addressee on the date of refusal.
- 21 Except as provided in the preceding paragraph, a certified
- 22 letter returned to the board by the United States Post Office
- 23 undelivered for any reason shall be forwarded by first class
- 24 mail to the lobbyist, addressed to the lobbyist at the address
- 25 shown on his latest registration statement or disbursement
- 26 report. An undelivered notice of late filing is considered
- 27 received by the recipient five business days after the first
- 28 class mailing.
- 29 A late filing fee shall be charged through the business day
- 30 preceding the day of filing of a late statement or late periodic
- 31 report.
- 32 4515.0300 APPLICABILITY OF THE CONFLICTS OF INTEREST PROVISIONS.
- Any public official who, in the discharge of official
- 34 duties, would be required to take action or make a decision
- 35 which would substantially affect the official's financial

- l interests, or those of an associated business, as that term is
- 2 defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 10A.01, subdivision 4,
- 3 must file a potential conflict of interest notice, unless the
- 4 effect on the official is no greater than on other members of
- 5 the official's business classification, profession, or
- 6 occupation.
- 7 4525.0200 COMPLAINTS OF VIOLATIONS.
- 8 Subpart 1. to 5. [Unchanged.]
- 9-----Subp. 6. Hearings. At any time during an investigation of
- 10 a complaint, the board may hold a contested case hearing before
- ll making a finding on the complaint.
- 12 4525.0500 INVESTIGATIONS AND AUDITS.
- 13 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]
- Subp. 3. Contested case hearing. At any time during an
- 15 investigation or audit, the board may hold a contested case
- 16 hearing before making a finding on any investigation or audit.
