3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Pharmacy Regulation

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5 Rules as Adopted

6 6800.1250 APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE.

7 Subpart 1. **Submitting.** Applicants for licensure by
8 examination shall submit a completed application for examination
9 including affidavits of internship, a copy of applicant's birth
10 certificate, and a recent photograph. All applicants shall show
11 evidence of graduation with a bachelor of science degree or
12 doctor of pharmacy degree, as the first professional
13 undergraduate degree in pharmacy, from a college of pharmacy or
14 a department of pharmacy of a university approved by the board
15 and meeting at least the minimum standards set by the American
16 Council on Pharmaceutical Education in the current edition of
17 its accreditation manual. The evidence shall be shown by
18 submitting an official final transcript showing the date on
19 which degree was conferred. The above-listed documents together
20 with a check for \$200 must be submitted to the board at least 45
21 days prior to the examination. An applicant who is a graduate
22 of a school or college of pharmacy located outside the United
23 States, which has not been recognized and approved by the board,
24 but who is otherwise qualified to apply for a license to
25 practice pharmacy in this state, is considered to have satisfied
26 the requirements of graduation if the applicant verifies to the
27 board the applicant's academic record and the applicant's
28 graduation ~~and-meets-other-requirements-as-the-board-may~~
29 ~~establish.~~ Before taking the licensing examination, a foreign
30 graduate applicant shall pass the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate
31 Equivalency Examination, which is recognized and approved by the
32 board, given by the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination
33 Commission and demonstrate proficiency in the English language
34 by passing the Test of English as a Foreign Language, which is
35 recognized and approved by the board, given by the Educational

1 Testing Service as a prerequisite to taking the licensure
2 examination.

3 Subp. 2. Retaking exam. Any applicant who has failed to
4 pass the examination required by Minnesota Statutes, section
5 151.06, 151.07, 151.10, or 151.12, may retake the examination
6 within the next ensuing 14 months, provided that no applicant
7 who has failed in three examinations shall be permitted to take
8 a further examination, except upon petition setting forth facts
9 acceptable to the board. The applicant shall, at least 45 days
10 before an examination, notify the board in writing of the
11 intention to retake the examination, certifying that information
12 furnished on the original application remains true and correct,
13 or reporting any changes therein, including additional education
14 and experience, and shall submit a fee of \$200 payable to the
15 Minnesota Board of Pharmacy. The board reserves the right to
16 request a full and complete application.

18 6800.1600 CONTINUING EDUCATION ADVISORY TASK FORCE.

19 The continuing education advisory task force shall consist
20 of not more than ten members. Three members of the advisory
21 task force shall be pharmacists designated by the Minnesota
22 State Pharmaceutical Association, three members shall be
23 pharmacists designated by the Minnesota Society of Hospital
24 Pharmacists, two members shall be pharmacists designated by the
25 College of Pharmacy of the University of Minnesota, and two
26 members shall be designated by the board. The continuing
27 education advisory task force shall meet at least quarterly and
28 shall annually elect a chair and vice-chair from its
29 membership. The executive director of the board of pharmacy
30 shall act as secretary to the task force.

31 6800.4210 SCHEDULE I CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

32 Schedule I shall consist of the drugs and other substances,
33 by whatever official name, common or usual name, chemical name,
34 or brand name designated, listed in this part.

35 A. Opiates. Unless specifically excepted or unless

1 listed in another schedule, any of the following opiates,
 2 including their isomers (whether optical, positional, or
 3 geometric), esters, ethers, salts, and salts of isomers, esters,
 4 and ethers, whenever the existence of such isomers, esters,
 5 ethers, or salts is possible within the specific chemical
 6 designation:

 8 (2) Allylprodine;
