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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Solid Waste Reduction and
4 Separation Grant (LOW-TECH) Program

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6 Rules as Adopted

7 9200.6902 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA.

8 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]

9 Subp. 2. **Eligible projects.** Only solid waste reduction
10 projects, solid waste separation projects, and collection
11 systems for separated solid wastes are eligible for grants. To
12 be eligible for funding, a project must be a new project or an
13 expansion of an existing project, and must be designed to
14 operate for a minimum of three years after a grant is received.
15 A project may include household hazardous waste management, but
16 may not consist solely of household hazardous waste management.

17 Subp. 3. and 4. [Unchanged.]

18 Subp. 5. **Implementation costs.** Implementation costs are
19 limited to the costs incurred in the first year of project
20 operation. Eligible implementation costs are:

21 A. capital, operating, and maintenance costs of waste
22 reduction and separation equipment such as source separation
23 collection vehicles, collection trailers, drop boxes, curbside
24 collection bins, and other containers used exclusively for the
25 collection or transport of separated wastes or the management of
26 household hazardous waste; and

29 9200.6903 INFORMATION AND DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED IN GRANT
30 APPLICATION.

31 An application for a solid waste reduction and separation
32 project grant shall include the following information, as
33 required in the application form supplied by the board:

35 R. a work plan that describes how the applicant will

1 implement the project and how the applicant intends to operate
2 the project for the three years following receipt of a grant,
3 including:

6 9200.6904 REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS.

7 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

8 Subp. 3. Evaluation of applications. The board shall
9 evaluate the application. In order to receive funding, the
10 application must demonstrate that:

11 A. [Unchanged.]

12 B. the affected political subdivisions are committed
13 to developing, implementing, and operating the project for a
14 three-year period, providing necessary local financing, and
15 accepting and exercising the government powers necessary for
16 project development, implementation, and operation;

19 9200.6905 LIMITATIONS.

20 Subpart 1. Matching funds required. A grant awarded under
21 parts 9200.6900 to 9200.6906 must be matched by federal, local,
22 private, or other state grants, loans, or contributions, the
23 total of which must equal the amount of the grant applied for.
24 Matching funding may be in the form of cash, goods, or services.
