7 1700.2700 REQUIREMENT FOR CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION.

8 All domestic and feral swine imported into Minnesota must
9 be accompanied by a certificate issued by an accredited
10 veterinarian, except: slaughter swine consigned to a public
11 stockyard; slaughter swine consigned to a market operating under
12 a permit from the board; feeder swine consigned to a
13 state-federal approved swine market as defined in part
14 1715.0590, subpart 10, from a farm of origin in an adjacent
15 state; and swine going directly to slaughter at a slaughtering
16 establishment having federal inspection.

17 1715.0760 MOVEMENTS INTO MARKETS.

18 Subpart 1. to 4a. [Unchanged.]

19 Subp. 4b. Feeder pigs from markets in other states.

20 Feeder pigs originating from other states may only enter the
21 market if there is a certificate of veterinary inspection and a
22 permit meeting the requirements of part 1715.0705, subpart 3.

23 Subp. 4c. Feeder pigs from farms of origin in other states.

24 Feeder pigs originating from farms of origin in adjacent states
25 may enter if the seller presents an official pseudorabies
26 monitored herd test record or feeder pig monitoring herd card.

27 Subp. 4d. Feeder pigs from farm of origin in low
28 prevalence states. Feeder pigs originating from a farm of
29 origin in a low prevalence state may enter the market if the
30 consigner furnishes proof of residence and proof of origin of
31 the feeder pigs.
