- 7 9560.0650 MAINTENANCE STANDARDS.
- 8 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]
- 9 Subp. 2. [See Repealer.]
- 10 Subp. 3. Agency contract care. When foster care is
- 11 provided for a child by a provider licensed under parts
- 12 9545.0010 to 9545.0260 through contract with a public or private
- 13 agency, foster care maintenance payments and difficulty of care
- 14 payments shall be determined according to the rate schedules in
- 15 subpart 1 and parts 9560.0653 to 9560.0655. If the local social
- 16 services agency is contracting for administrative or social
- 17 services costs, the payments to the contracting agency shall be
- 18 in addition to the rates established in subpart 1 and parts
- 19 9560.0653 to 9560.0655.
- Subp. 4. and 5. [Unchanged.]
- 21 Subp. 6. Reassessment. The agency shall reassess a child:
- 22 A. at the end of 12 months;
- B. at the request of a foster parent;
- C. when a child is placed in a different facility; or
- D. if a child's level of need changes.
- 26 9560.0651 DIFFICULTY OF CARE ASSESSMENTS AND PAYMENTS.
- 27 Parts 9560.0652 to 9560.0656 provide criteria for assessing
- 28 the difficulty of care and the payment rate for a child in
- 29 foster care.
- 30 9560.0652 DEFINITIONS.
- 31 Subpart 1. Scope. The terms used in parts 9560.0653 to
- 32 9560.0656 have the meanings given them in this part.
- 33 Subp. 2. Activities of daily living. "Activities of daily
- 34 living" means activities of basic self-care, including eating,

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- 1 dressing, grooming, hygiene, and toileting.
- Subp. 3. Mental retardation. "Mental retardation" means
- 3 the condition of a person with mental retardation as defined in
- 4 part 9525.0015, subpart 20.
- 5 Subp. 4. Mental illness. "Mental illness" has the meaning
- 6 given in Minnesota Statutes, section 245.462, subdivision 20.
- 7 9560.0653 DIFFICULTY OF CARE PAYMENTS.
- 8 The local social services agency shall make payments in
- 9 addition to the basic maintenance standards of part 9560.0650,
- 10 subpart 1, for children with mental, physical, or emotional
- 11 handicaps who require additional supervision or assistance in
- 12 behavior management, activities of daily living, management of
- 13 medical problems, or interaction with the natural parents and
- 14 the community. The local social services agency shall assess
- 15 each child under this part and the difficulty of care levels in
- 16 part 9560.0654.
- 17 9560.0654 DIFFICULTY OF CARE ASSESSMENTS.
- 18 Subpart 1. General. Within the highest appropriate level
- 19 and the respective point range of subparts 2 to 7, a single
- 20 point value shall be assigned based on the age of the child, the
- 21 number of conditions requiring special care, and the degree of
- 22 difficulty of caring for each condition.
- Subp. 2. Level A. A child eligible for difficulty of care
- 24 payments under part 9560.0653:
- 25 A. shall be assessed at level A if the child requires
- 26 a moderate amount of additional supervision or assistance,
- 27 including that required by:
- 28 (1) dependency, passivity, or lack of
- 29 responsiveness and ability to relate to others;
- 30 (2) abnormal seeking of affection or attention;
- 31 (3) problems with separation from the natural
- 32 parents or attachment to the foster parents;
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 (4) psychosomatic complaints;
- 34 (5) night terrors;
- 35 (6) stress reactions, such as minor

1 destructiveness;

2	(7) chemical abuse;
3	(8) immaturity or poor social skills;
4	(9) problems with authority figures;
5	(10) chronic disorders with some physical
6	incapacity;
7	(11) a physical handicap, although the child is
8	self sufficient;
9	(12) presence of long-term infections;
LO	(13) delayed development;
L1	(14) need for help with hygiene, eating,
12	toileting, and dressing beyond that normally required at the
L3	child's age level;
L 4	(15) need for a special diet prescribed by a
L5	physician;
L6	(16) need for weekly therapy for medical,
L7	physical, or emotional problems, truancy or behavior problems,
L8	in which the foster parent participates with the child;
L9	(17) need for home tutoring provided by the
20	foster parent if the child is learning disabled or requires
21	remedial education;
22	(18) need for supervision of family visits;
23	(19) other conditions or behaviors that are
24	equivalent to the requirement for additional supervision
25	appropriate to subitems (1) to (18); and
26	B. within level A, shall be assigned no fewer than
27	one and no more than 35 difficulty of care points.
28	Subp. 3. Level B. A child eligible for difficulty of care
29	payments under part 9560.0653:
30	A. shall be assessed at level B if the child requires
31	a significant amount of additional supervision or assistance,
32	including that required by:
33	(1) need for a structured behavioral program;
34	(2) difficulty with peers;
35	(3) lack of verbal responsiveness;
36	(4) fear of or hostility to adults or authority

figures; 1 (5) infrequent running away overnight; 2 (6) lying or stealing; 3 (7) chemical abuse; 4 5 (8) expression of suicidal thoughts or gestures; (9) chronic medical disorders or developmental 6 delay, including mental retardation, with significant incapacity 7 8 and need for motivation or skill development; 9 (10) a program of physical therapy prescribed by a professional for up to one hour per day to be provided by a 10 foster parent; 11 12 (11) speech and hearing problems, such as those 13 that require a communication board or sign language; (12) presence of infections, which present a risk 14 to the family; 15 (13) need for help with eating, toileting, 16 hygiene, and dressing significantly beyond that normally 17 required of the child's age level; 18 (14) need for help with braces, prosthetics, or 19 20 casts; 21 (15) truancy, school performance, or behavior problems requiring increased contact by the foster parents with 22 the school, court, or other agencies; 23 24 (16) sexual acting out; 25 (17) need to assist the child in relating to the natural parents; 26 (18) need to supervise family visits in the 27 foster home; 28 (19) attention deficit disorder; 29 30 (20) other conditions or behaviors that are equivalent to the requirement for additional supervision 31 appropriate to subitems (1) to (19); and 32 B. within level B, shall be assigned no fewer than 36 33 and no more than 70 difficulty of care points. 34 Subp. 4. Level C. A child eligible for difficulty of care 35 36 payments under part 9560.0653:

1 shall be assessed at level C if the child requires an extensive amount of additional supervision or assistance, 2 including that required by: 3 (1) unsocialized or withdrawn behavior; 4 5 (2) self destructive or self-defeating behavior with suicidal expressions and gestures; 6 7 (3) attention deficit disorder; 8 (4) frequent running away; 9 (5) sexual or physical abuse inflicted upon the 10 child; (6) destructive acting-out, either physically or 11 12 sexually; 13 (7) repeated violations of law concerning persons 14 or property; 15 (8) chemical abuse; (9) problems with authority figures; 16 (10) chronic medical disorders or severe 17 developmental delay including mental retardation, with 18 incapacity which may require frequent hospitalizations; 19 (11) a severe physical handicap, and the child is 20 not ambulatory or is oppositional; 21 (12) feeding problems, including swallowing or 22 23 vomiting after meals; 24 (13) a program of physical therapy prescribed by a professional for between one and two hours per day to be 25 provided by a foster parent; 26 (14) need for help in hygiene, eating, toileting, 27 28 dressing, and diapering, beyond that normally required for the child's age; 29 (15) need for therapy for medical, physical, or 30 31 emotional problems, which the foster parent attends with the child at least twice weekly; 32 33 (16) truancy, behavior, or school performance problems requiring extensive contact by the foster parents with 34 the school, court, or other agencies; 35 36 (17) need for parenting education for the natural

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parents by the foster parents during visitations; 2 (18) need to protect child from threatening 3 natural parents; (19) other conditions or behaviors that are 4 5 equivalent to the requirement for additional supervision appropriate to subitems (1) to (18); and 6 B. within level C, shall be assigned no fewer than 71 7 8 and no more than 105 difficulty of care points. Subp. 5. Level D. A child eligible for difficulty of care 9 payments under part 9560.0653: 10 11 shall be assessed at level D if the child requires an exceptional amount of additional supervision or assistance, 12 13 including that required by: 14 (1) phobic or compulsive behaviors; 15 (2) inappropriate sexual aggressiveness, self-mutilation, or extreme vulnerability; 16 17 (3) self-destructive or self-defeating behavior with suicidal expressions and gestures; 18 19 (4) assaultive behavior; (5) antisocial personality disorder; 20 21 (6) chemical abuse; 22 (7) a recent suicidal attempt; 23 (8) a severe disability with multiple handicaps; (9) developmental delay including mental 24 25 retardation; (10) attention deficit disorder with 26 27 hyperactivity; (11) need for frequent supervision of an 28 appliance, such as a shunt or ilial conduit; 29 30 (12) lack of bowel or bladder control, if child is over 12 years of age; 31 32 (13) a program of physical therapy prescribed by a professional for between two and three hours per day to be 33 provided by a foster parent; 34 35 (14) uncontrollable seizures;

(15) a tracheotomy with need for suctioning;

1	(16) a gastrostomy;
2	(17) heavy weight, needing lifting;
3	(18) disabilities requiring feeding and diapering
4	or dressing and hygiene performed by a foster parent;
5	(19) need for therapeutic visits for physical,
6	mental, or emotional problems, attended by a foster parent more
7	often than twice weekly;
8	(20) need for relief of the foster parent by
9	another adult;
10	(21) other conditions or behaviors that are
11	equivalent to the requirement for additional supervision
12	appropriate to subitems (1) and (20); and
13	B. within level D, shall be assigned no fewer than
14	106 and no more than 140 difficulty of care points.
15	Subp. 6. Level E. A child eligible for difficulty of care
16	payments under part 9560.0653:
17	A. shall be assessed at level E if the child requires
18	an extraordinary amount of supervision or assistance, including
19	that required by:
20	(1) frequent and recent suicide attempts;
21	(2) frequent and recent arsonist behavior;
22	(3) high risk of danger to the child or others by
2 3	the child;
24	(4) life threatening illness with a guarded
25	prognosis or expectation of death, which may require frequent
26	hospitalization;
27	(5) need for a heart monitor;
28	(6) need for tracheotomy suctioning;
29	(7) need for gavage feeding;
30	(8) need for intravenous feeding or intestinal
31	massage;
3 2	(9) need for extensive burn care;
33	(10) a program of physical therapy prescribed by
34	a professional for between three and four hours per day to be
35	provided by a foster parent; or
36	(11) other conditions or behaviors that are

- 1 consistent with the requirement for additional supervision
- 2 appropriate to subitems (1) to (10); and
- B. within level E, shall be assigned no fewer than
- 4 141 and no more than 175 difficulty of care points.
- 5 Subp. 7. Level F. A child eligible for difficulty of care
- 6 payments under part 9560.0653:
- 7 A. shall be assessed at level F if the child requires
- 8 supervision or assistance in excess of that of Level E under
- 9 subpart 6; and
- B. within level F, shall be assigned no fewer than
- 11 176 and no more than 225 difficulty of care points.
- 12 9560.0655 DIFFICULTY OF CARE PAYMENT RATE.
- Subpart 1. Payment rate. Except as provided by subpart 2,
- 14 the local social services agency shall make payments to the
- 15 foster care provider at the rate of \$3.70 per month for each
- 16 point assessed under part 9560.0654.
- 17 Subp. 2. Existing placements. In a placement for which a
- 18 difficulty of care payment was established and was being made
- 19 prior to the effective date of parts 9560.0650 to 9560.0656, and
- 20 the payment is greater than the payment which would be made
- 21 under subpart 1, the local social services agency shall continue
- 22 to pay the greater amount until the child's difficulty of care
- 23 changes or the placement terminates.
- Subp. 3. Annual revision of payment rate. By November 1
- 25 of each year following the effective date of parts 9560.0650 to
- 26 9560.0656, the commissioner shall review and revise the
- 27 difficulty of care payment rate in subpart 1 based on USDA
- 28 Estimates of the Cost of Raising a Child, published by the
- 29 United States Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Resources
- 30 Service, Publication 1411. The revision shall be the average
- 31 percentage by which costs increase for the age ranges
- 32 represented in the USDA Estimates of the Cost of Raising a
- 33 Child. The USDA Estimates of the Cost of Raising a Child is
- 34 subject to annual revision.
- 35 9560.0656 DOCUMENTATION.

- 1 Subpart 1. Assessment instrument. The local social
- 2 services agency shall document the assessment of the difficulty
- 3 of care under parts 9560.0653 and 9560.0654 using a written
- 4 assessment instrument consistent with parts 9560.0653 and
- 5 9560.0654. The case record shall include a description of each
- 6 condition on which the assessment is based.
- 7 Subp. 2. Approval of assessment instrument. The
- 8 assessment instrument required by subpart 1 must be approved by
- 9 the commissioner.

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- 11 EFFECTIVE DATE. Parts 9560.0651 to 9560.0656 and the
- 12 amendments to part 9560.0650, are effective December-25,-1988
- 13 January 1, 1989.

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- REPEALER. Minnesota Rules, part 9560.0650, subpart 2, is
- 16 repealed.
