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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to License Renewal and

4 Reciprocity Fees

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6 Rules as Adopted

7 6800.1150 ANNUAL RENEWAL, FEES, AND POSTING.

8 Each pharmacist license shall expire on March 1 of each
9 year and shall be renewed annually by filing an application for
10 license renewal on or before February 1 of each year, together
11 with a fee of \$65. Any pharmacist license renewal application
12 submitted after March 1 shall be subject to a late filing fee of
13 \$25 in addition to the renewal fee.

14 Each pharmacist shall post his or her license or renewal in
15 a conspicuous place within the pharmacy in which he or she is
16 practicing his or her profession. For community pharmacies,
17 this place shall be a place which is readily visible to the
18 public.

19 6800.1300 RECIPROCITY.

20 Subpart 1. Applications. Applications for reciprocal
21 licensure (licensure as a pharmacist on the basis of licensure
22 as a pharmacist in another state) together with a fee of \$165
23 shall be filed with the secretary of the board at least 30 days
24 before the date the application is to be considered by the
25 board. The board will consider applications for reciprocity in
26 at least January and June of each calendar year.

27 Subp. 2. Eligibility. To be found eligible for
28 consideration by the board:

29 A. Applicant must have practiced in the profession
30 for at least one year after licensure in another state which is
31 an active member of the National Association of Boards of
32 Pharmacy before the applicant will be deemed eligible to
33 reciprocate to Minnesota.

34 B. Applicant, if examined and licensed before January
35 1, 1973, shall show that he or she has acquired 2,080 hours of

1 practical pharmacy experience under the instruction of a
2 licensed pharmacist.

3 C. Applicant, if examined and licensed after January
4 1, 1973, shall show that the applicant has acquired 1,500 hours
5 of practical pharmacy experience under the instruction of a
6 licensed pharmacist; said 1,500 hours to be acquired after the
7 successful completion of the third year of the standard
8 five-year pharmacy curriculum, 400 hours of which may be
9 acquired: concurrently with college attendance, in clinical
10 pharmacy programs, or in demonstration projects which have been
11 approved by the Tripartite Committee on Internship and the board
12 of the active member state from which the applicant applies.

13 Subp. 3. Substitution for internship. Defects in
14 internship experience will not preclude an applicant from being
15 deemed eligible provided that the applicant shall have practiced
16 as a licensed pharmacist for one year, plus one week at 40 hours
17 per week for each week or portion thereof that the applicant is
18 deficient in internship experience, (for example, the number of
19 weeks in excess of one year the applicant has practiced as a
20 licensed pharmacist before applying for reciprocity must be
21 equal to or greater than the number of weeks or portions thereof
22 that the applicant is deficient in internship experience).

23 Subp. 4. to 6. [Unchanged.]
