- 7 9000.0050 [Emergency] PURPOSE.
- 8 Parts 9000.0100 to 9000.0190 [Emergency] and 9000.0200
- 9 establish filing procedures for unlicensed mental health service
- 10 providers. The purpose of the filing procedures is to establish
- 11 a central registry of persons who provide or purport to provide
- 12 mental health services.
- 13 9000.0100 [Emergency] DEFINITIONS.
- Subpart 1. Scope. For purposes of parts 9000.0100 to
- 15 9000.0190 [Emergency], and 9000.0200 the following terms have
- 16 the meanings given them.
- Subp. 2. to 7. [Unchanged.]
- 18 9000.0110 [Emergency] REQUIREMENT TO FILE.
- 19 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]
- Subp. 3. Requirement to file within 120 days. A provider
- 21 who is providing mental health services on the effective date of
- 22 parts 9000.0100 to 9000.0190 [Emergency] and 9000.0200 must
- 23 apply to file with the board within 120 days after the effective
- 24 date of parts 9000.0100 to 9000.0190 [Emergency] and 9000.0200.
- A provider who wishes to provide mental health services
- 26 after the effective date of parts 9000.0100 to 9000.0190
- 27 [Emergency] and 9000.0200 must apply to the board and receive
- 28 acknowledgment of the filing as provided in part 9000.0130
- 29 [Emergency] before providing services.
- 30 Subp. 4. Late fees. A provider who is providing mental
- 31 health services when parts 9000.0110 to 9000.0190 [Emergency]
- 32 and 9000.0200 become effective, and who fails to file within the
- 33 120-day limit in subpart 3, must pay the late filing fee and the
- 34 regular filing fee specified in part 9000.0200.

- 1 9000.0120 [Emergency] PROCEDURE FOR FILING.
- 2 Subpart 1. Application. The application for filing must:
- A. be made to the board on the forms provided by the
- 4 board;
- 5 B. include an affirmation from the applicant that the
- 6 statements are true and correct to the best of the applicant's
- 7 knowledge and belief;
- 8 C. be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee
- 9 specified in part 9000.0200;
- D. be accompanied by a written authorization for the
- ll board to make inquiries to the appropriate regulatory agency in
- 12 any other state where the applicant has provided mental health
- 13 service, about the applicant's malpractice history, if any;
- 14 E. be accompanied by a written authorization for the
- 15 board to inquire about the malpractice history of the applicant
- 16 at the National Clearing House for Licensure, Enforcement, and
- 17 Regulation; and
- 18 F. be completed in sufficient detail for the board to
- 19 determine if the applicant meets the requirements for filing.
- 20 The board may ask the applicant to provide additional
- 21 information necessary to clarify incomplete or ambiguous
- 22 information submitted in the application.
- 23 Subp. 2. [Unchanged.]
- 24 9000.0130 [Emergency] ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF FILING.
- When an applicant has satisfied the requirements of filing,
- 26 the board will issue a written "Acknowledgment of Filing" to the
- 27 applicant. The "Acknowledgment of Filing" is a written
- 28 statement that the applicant has met the requirements for filing
- 29 under parts 9000.0100 to 9000.0190 [Emergency] and 9000.0200.
- 30 This acknowledgment is personal and is not transferable to
- 31 another person. It may not be displayed or published in any way.
- 32 9000.0140 [Emergency] DENIAL OF FILING.
- 33 Subpart 1. Grounds for denial. An application for filing
- 34 may be denied by the board if:

- A. to D. [Unchanged.]
- 2 E. the applicant fails to authorize the board, as
- 3 required in part 9000.0120 [Emergency], subpart 1, item D, to
- 4 obtain information from the appropriate regulatory agency in any
- 5 other state or foreign government where the individual has
- 6 provided mental health services; or
- 7 F. [Unchanged.]
- 8 Subp. 2. [Unchanged.]
- 9 Subp. 3. Notice of denial. The board must notify an
- 10 applicant, in writing, of a denial of an application for filing
- 11 and the reasons for the denial. If the board denies an
- 12 application for filing for reasons described in subpart 2, the
- 13 board's notice must meet the requirements of Minnesota Statutes,
- 14 section 364.05. An application submitted after a denial is a
- 15 new application and must be accompanied by a new filing fee.
- 16 9000.0160 [Emergency] RENEWAL OF FILING.
- 17 Subpart 1. Renewal notice. At least 31 days before the
- 18 date the filing ends, according to part 9000.0150 [Emergency],
- 19 the board shall send a renewal notice to the last known address
- 20 of the provider. The notice must inform the provider of the
- 21 requirement to renew the provider's filing and pay the current
- 22 renewal fee by the deadline determined in subpart 2. If the
- 23 provider does not receive the notice, the provider is still
- 24 obligated to complete a renewal application and pay the renewal
- 25 fee specified in part 9000.0200 within the deadline in subpart
- 26 2. The renewal application must be made on the forms provided
- 27 by the board.
- Subp. 2. Renewal deadline. The provider must submit to
- 29 the board the renewal application and the annual renewal fee
- 30 required in part 9000.0200. The renewal application must be
- 31 submitted or postmarked on or before the date the filing ends
- 32 according to part 9000.0150 [Emergency]. The renewal
- 33 application must include an affirmation by the provider that the
- 34 statements on the form are true and correct to the best
- 35 knowledge and belief of the provider.

- 1 Subp. 3. Late fees. A provider seeking renewal must pay
- 2 the renewal fee and the late fee if the application for renewal
- 3 is submitted or postmarked after the time period specified in
- 4 subpart 2.
- 5 The late fee must accompany applications of practicing
- 6 mental health service providers not made within 90 days of the
- 7 effective date of this part.
- 8 Subp. 4. Expiration of filing. A filing expires if it is
- 9 not renewed with the board within the deadline specified in
- 10 subpart 2. A filing may be reissued following expiration only
- 11 if the provider submits a new application and pays the regular
- 12 and the late filing fees required in part 9000.0200.
- 13 9000.0190 [Emergency] VARIANCES.
- 14 Subpart 1. Grounds for variance; variance application. A
- 15 filer or applicant may petition the board for a time limited
- 16 variance from provisions in parts 9000.0100 to 9000.0190
- 17 [Emergency] and 9000.0200, except for a provision that
- 18 incorporates a statutory requirement. The petition must be in
- 19 writing. The board shall grant a variance if the filer or
- 20 applicant specifies alternative practices or measures equivalent
- 21 to or superior to those in the rule in question and provides
- 22 evidence that:
- 23 A. the rationale for the rule in question can be met
- 24 or exceeded by the specified alternative practices or measures;
- B. adherence to the rule would impose an undue burden
- 26 on the filer or applicant; and
- 27 C. the granting of the variance will not adversely
- 28 affect the public welfare.
- Subp. 2. to 6. [Unchanged.]
- 30 9000.0200 FEES.
- 31 Fees for filing as a mental health provider are as follows:
- 32 A. the fee for an application is \$50;
- B. the fee for renewal of filing is \$50; and
- .34 C. the fee for late filing is \$25.

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- 1 REPEALER. The permanent amendments to emergency rules
- 2 contained in these rules are repealed on the date the emergency
- 3 rules they amend are no longer in effect.
