- 3709.0230 CHIROPRACTIC ASSISTANT. 6
- 7 Subpart 1. May teach. A teacher who has a chiropractic
- assistant instructor license may teach in the chiropractic 8
- assistant program and-may-also-teach-courses-in: 9
- 10 A:--body-mechanics-in-the-workplace;-and
- 11 B---therapeutic-massage.
- Subp. 2. Other requirements. The applicant must meet the 12
- requirements in part 3709.0100. 13
- Subp. 3. Educational and occupational experience 14
- requirement. The applicant must have the educational and 15
- occupational experience described in item A, B, or C. The 16
- education must be from an accredited postsecondary institution. 17
- A. Licensed chiropractor and 4,000 hours of verified 18
- 19 occupational experience in a chiropractic office or chiropractic
- hospital. This experience must include office procedures, 20
- 21 insurance coverage, physical agents application, X-ray, and
- examinations. 22
- B. Diploma from a two-year chiropractic technician or 23
- chiropractic assistant program and 6,000 hours of verified 24
- 25 occupational experience as a technician or assistant in a
- chiropractic office or chiropractic hospital. The experience 26
- must include office procedures, insurance coverage, physical 27
- agents application, and assisting the chiropractor with X-ray 28
- and examinations. **2**9
- 30 Diploma from a one-year chiropractic technician or
- chiropractic assistant program or American Chiropractic 31
- Registered Radiologist technician program and 7,000 hours of 32
- verified occupational experience as a technician or assistant in 33
- a chiropractic office or chiropractic hospital. The experience 34
- must include office procedures, insurance coverage, physical .35

- 3 Subp. 4. Occupational recency substitution. Teaching
- 4 experience at an accredited postsecondary institution, or at an
- 5 industrial or military setting may be substituted for 1,500 of
- 6 the 2,000 hours required in part 3709.0100, subpart 1, item A,
- 7 if the teaching is done during the five-year period. The
- 8 teaching must be in chiropractic assisting, chiropractic
- 9 technician, or chiropractic medicine practice. Two hours of
- 10 teaching equal one hour of occupational experience.
- 11 3709.0240 EKG/CARDIAC TECHNICIAN.
- 12 Subpart 1. May teach. A teacher who has an EKG/cardiac
- 13 technician license may teach in the EKG/cardiac technician
- 14 program and may also teach cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
- Subp. 2. Other requirements. The applicant must meet the
- 16 requirements in part 3709.0100.
- 17 Subp. 3. Occupational experience requirement. The
- 18 applicant must have current cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- 19 instructor certification and 8,000 hours of verified
- 20 occupational experience in one of the following:
- 21 A. registered nurse in critical care using 12 lead
- 22 cardiograms, exercise stress testing of clients, care of clients
- 23 with pacemakers, and interpreting basic and advanced cardiac
- 24 rhythms; or
- B. supervisory EKG/cardiac technician.
- Subp. 4. Substitution for occupational experience. An
- 27 applicant may substitute the education described under item A,
- 28 B, C, or D for up to 4,000 hours of occupational experience
- 29 required in subpart 3. The education must be from an accredited
- 30 postsecondary institution.
- A. A bachelor's or higher degree in medicine,
- 32 nursing, or cardiac technology may be substituted for 4,000
- 33 hours.
- B. An associate degree in nursing, perfusionist, echo
- 35 cardiac sonographer, EKG/cardiac technician, cardiac technology,

- 1 biomedical equipment, cardiopulmonary, medical laboratory,
- 2 medical technology, medical imaging, or radiography, or a
- 3 bachelor's degree in biomedical science or medical technology
- 4 may be substituted for 2,000 hours.
- 5 C. A diploma in nursing, perfusionist, EKG/cardiac
- 6 technology, or cardiac technician may be substituted. A
- 7 one-year program equals 1,050 hours. A two- or three-year
- 8 program equals 2,100 hours.
- 9 D. The completion of courses for credit or clock
- 10 hours for credit in cardiac care, cardiac conditions, or cardiac
- 11 equipment use and maintenance may be substituted. One hour of
- 12 instruction equals one hour of occupational experience. One
- 13 quarter credit equals 20 hours of occupational experience. One
- 14 semester credit equals 30 hours of occupational experience.
- Subp. 5. Occupational recency substitution. Teaching
- 16 experience at an accredited postsecondary institution, or at an
- 17 industrial or military setting, or public safety agency may be
- 18 substituted for 1,500 of the 2,000 hours required in part
- 19 3709.0100, subpart 1, item A, if the teaching is done during the
- 20 five-year period. The teaching must be in cardiac technology.
- 21 Two hours of teaching equal one hour of occupational experience.
- 22 3709.0250 PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT.
- 23 Subpart 1. May teach. A teacher who has a physical
- 24 therapist assistant instructor license may teach in the physical
- 25 therapist assistant program and may also teach courses in
- 26 anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, exercise
- 27 physiology, kinesiology, neuroanatomy and neurophysiology, and
- 28 physical disability/rehabilitation.
- 29 Subp. 2. Other requirements. The applicant must meet the
- 30 requirements in part 3709.0100.
- 31 Subp. 3. Occupational and educational experience
- 32 requirement. The applicant must have the following experiences:
- A. a bachelor's or higher degree in physical therapy
- 34 from an American Physical Therapy Association accredited
- 35 institution;

- B. physical therapist registration in the state of
- 2 Minnesota; and
- 3 C. 4,000 hours of verified occupational experience as
- 4 a registered physical therapist in at least two of the
- 5 following: acute care setting, outpatient physical therapy,
- 6 long-term care, or rehabilitation setting.
- 7 Subp. 4. Occupational recency substitution. Teaching
- 8 experience at an American Physical Therapy Association
- 9 accredited institution may be substituted for 1,500 of the 2,000
- 10 hours required in part 3709.0100, subpart 1, item A, if the
- 11 teaching is done during the five-year period. The teaching must
- 12 be in physical therapy or physical therapy assistant. Two hours
- 13 of teaching equal one hour of occupational experience.
- 14 3709.0260 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATION (911).
- Subpart 1. May teach. A teacher who has a public safety
- 16 communication (911) license may teach in the public safety
- 17 communication (911) program and may also teach emergency
- 18 communications.
- 19 Subp. 2. Other requirements. The applicant must meet the
- 20 requirements in part 3709.0100.
- Subp. 3. Occupational experience requirement. The
- 22 applicant must have 8,000 hours of verified occupational
- 23 experience as an operator dispatcher or supervisor in a public
- 24 safety communications center with a minimum of 6,000 of the
- 25 8,000 hours doing the job of an operator dispatcher. Operator
- 26 dispatcher includes level III operator dispatcher or
- 27 communication training operator (CTO). Supervisor includes lead
- 28 dispatcher, head dispatcher, communications manager, assistant
- 29 supervisor, or shift supervisor.
- 30 Subp. 4. Substitution for occupational experience. An
- 31 applicant may substitute the education described under item A,
- 32 B, C, or D for up to 4,000 hours of occupational experience
- 33 required under subpart 3. The education must be from an
- 34 accredited postsecondary institution.
- A. A bachelor's or higher degree in law enforcement,

- l criminal justice, or corrections may be substituted for 4,000
- 2 hours.
- B. An associate degree in law enforcement or public
- 4 safety communications, or a bachelor's degree or higher in
- 5 public administration may be substituted for 2,000 hours.
- 6 C. A diploma in law enforcement or public safety
- 7 communication may be substituted. A one-year program equals
- 8 1,050 hours. A two- or three-year program equals 2,100 hours.
- 9 D. The completion of courses for credit or clock
- 10 hours for credit in the use of public safety emergency
- 11 telecommunications equipment may be substituted. One hour of
- 12 instruction equals one hour of occupational experience. One
- 13 quarter credit equals 20 hours of occupational experience. One
- 14 semester credit equals 30 hours of occupational experience.
- 15 Subp. 5. Occupational recency substitution. Teaching
- 16 experience at an accredited postsecondary institution, or at an
- 17 industrial or military setting, or public safety agency may be
- 18 substituted for 1,500 of the 2,000 hours required in part
- 19 3709.0100, subpart 1, item A, if the teaching is done during the
- 20 five-year period. The teaching must be in public safety
- 21 communication. Two hours of teaching equal one hour of
- 22 occupational experience.
- 23 3709.0270 RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY.
- Subpart 1. May teach. A teacher who has a radiologic
- 25 technology license may teach in the radiologic technology
- 26 program.
- 27 Subp. 2. Other requirements. The applicant must meet the
- 28 requirements in part 3709.0100.
- Subp. 3. Occupational and educational experience
- 30 requirement. The applicant must:
- 31 A. have a two-year certificate, associate degree or
- 32 above in radiologic technology;
- B. be credentialed in radiography by the American
- 34 Registry of Radiologic Technologists; and
- 35 C. have 6,000 hours of verified occupational

- 1 experience as a certified radiographer in a medical setting.
- 2 Subp. 4. Occupational recency substitution. Teaching
- 3 experience at a postsecondary institution in an accredited
- 4 program of radiographic technology may be substituted for 1,500
- 5 of the 2,000 hours required in part 3709.0100, subpart 1, item
- 6 A, if the teaching is done during the five-year period. The
- 7 teaching must be in radiologic technology. Two hours of
- 8 teaching equal one hour of occupational experience.
