- 6 3600.0010 DEFINITIONS.
- 7 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]
- 8 Subp. 2. Board. "Board" means the board of the Minnesota
- 9 Center for Arts Education established in Minnesota Statutes,
- 10 section 129C.10, subdivision 1.
- 11 Subp. 3. Director. "Director" means the individual
- 12 appointed by the board under Minnesota Statutes, section
- 13 129C.10, subdivision 4, paragraph (a), clause (1), to administer
- 14 the Center for Arts Education.
- Subp. 4. Full-time high school program. "Full-time high
- 16 school program" means the Center for Arts Education full-time
- 17 pilot interdisciplinary academic and arts program for 11th and
- 18 12th grade pupils, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section
- 19 129C.10, subdivision 3, paragraph (f), clause (1).

- 22 3600.0020 HOW THIS CHAPTER APPLIES.
- Parts 3600.0010 to 3600.0070 prescribe the application,
- 24 arts review, and evaluation processes for pupils wanting
- 25 admission to the full-time high school program. Participants in
- 26 center programs under Minnesota Statutes, section 129C.10,
- 27 subdivision 5, are not included in the application, arts review,
- 28 and evaluation process in parts 3600.0010 to 3600.0070.
- 29 3600.0030 APPLICATION PROCESS.
- 30 Subpart 1. Eligible applicants. An eligible applicant is
- 31 a pupil who would be considered a resident entitled to a free
- 32 education under Minnesota Statutes, section 120.06, as of
- 33 December 15 of each year, who meets the following requirements:
- A. For the full-time high school program, pupils who

- 1 will be in the 11th grade the following September.
- B. [Unchanged.]
- 3 Subp. 2. Application forms for the full-time high school
- 4 program. Eligible applicants may apply for admission to the
- 5 full-time high school program by completing application forms.
- 6 The center must supply the forms by October 1 each year.
- 7 Application forms will be available at the center's central
- 8 office, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- 9 Additionally, the center will mail forms to all high school
- 10 buildings in the state. Application forms must be mailed back
- 11 to the center, and be postmarked by December 15, to be
- 12 considered for admission into the full-time high school program.
- Subp. 3. Other information required. An applicant to the
- 14 full-time high school program must submit a school record and
- 15 two recommendations. The recommendations must be submitted on
- 16 forms provided by the center. One recommendation must be from
- 17 an academic source selected by the applicant's school
- 18 principal. The other recommendation must be from an artistic
- 19 reference chosen by the applicant.
- Subp. 4. Number of applications. An individual may apply
- 21 up to two times for admission into the full-time high school
- 22 program.
- 23 3600.0040 ARTS REVIEW PROCESS.
- 24 Subpart 1. Participation; place. Applicants to the
- 25 full-time high school program must participate in an arts review
- 26 process. Reviews will be held in three locations, one in the
- 27 metropolitan area, one in northern Minnesota, and one in
- 28 southern Minnesota, from January to mid March each year.
- 29 Locations will be determined by the board.
- 30 Subp. 2. Arts review team. The board must appoint six
- 31 arts review teams. Teams must have three members each: one
- 32 professional educator, one professional artist, and one staff
- 33 member from the center. Team members will be replaced by the
- 34 board as necessary.
- 35 Subp. 3. Areas of review. An applicant must be reviewed

- 1 in the primary area of specialty designated on the application,
- 2 within the following categories: dance, literary arts, media
- 3 arts, music, theater arts, and visual arts. An applicant may
- 4 apply to be reviewed in more than one specialty area. If
- 5 application is made for review in more than one specialty area,
- 6 the applicant must be reviewed in each area in which the
- 7 director determines the applicant has reviewable artistic
- 8 potential.
- 9 Subp. 4. Arts review evaluation. The arts review team
- 10 will evaluate applicants' artistic potential in three broad
- 11 areas:
- A. skills/proficiency, which is the ability to
- 13 effectively communicate the arts specialty area, 30 possible
- 14 points;
- B. creativity/imagination, which is the ability to
- 16 develop inventive, personal, concise expressions within the arts
- 17 specialty area, 30 possible points; and
- C. attitude, which is the level of motivation,
- 19 commitment, and energy for activities within the arts specialty
- 20 area, 40 possible points.
- 21 An applicant must score at least 20 points in
- 22 skills/proficiency, 20 points in creativity/imagination, and 25
- 23 points in attitude in order to be considered further for
- 24 admission.
- 25 Subp. 5. Arts review activities. Applicants will be
- 26 evaluated by the arts review team in the following activities:
- 27 A. Demonstration of an example or examples of the
- 28 applicants' previous arts activities, products, and abilities.
- 29 The arts review team will evaluate the demonstration with the
- 30 following criteria:
- 31 (1) to what degree do the applicants possess a
- 32 potential for rapid acquisition of skills needed to effectively
- 33 communicate their arts specialties, (skills/proficiency), zero
- 34 to 15 points;
- 35 (2) at what level do the applicants demonstrate a
- 36 personal creative expression within their arts specialty areas,

- 1 (creativity/imagination), zero to ten points; and
- 2 (3) to what extent do the applicants demonstrate
- 3 commitment, energy, and motivation to their arts specialty
- 4 areas, (attitude), zero to ten points.
- 5 B. Spontaneous individual and group activities that
- 6 highlight individual creativity and group interaction. These
- 7 activities will be related to the applicants' specialty areas.
- 8 The arts review team must evaluate the activities according to
- 9 the following criteria:
- 10 (1) to what degree do the applicants' responses
- 11 demonstrate personal, imaginative expressions,
- 12 (creativity/imagination), zero to five points; and
- 13 (2) to what extent do the applicants demonstrate
- 14 a willingness to participate energetically, (attitude), zero to
- 15 ten points.
- 16 C. Solution to an arts oriented assignment. Two
- 17 weeks before the arts review meeting, the center will send
- 18 applicants an arts oriented assignment specific to their
- 19 specialty areas. Applicants will bring the solution to the
- 20 assignment to the arts review meeting and present it to the arts
- 21 review team. The arts review team will evaluate the solution
- 22 according to the following criteria:
- (1) to what extent does the solution demonstrate
- 24 skill and proficiency effectiveness, (skills/proficiency), zero
- 25 to 15 points; and
- 26 (2) to what extent does the solution represent an
- 27 imaginative, creative solution, (creativity/imagination), zero
- 28 to 15 points.
- D. [Unchanged.]
- 30 3600.0050 FINAL REVIEW TEAM.
- 31 The final review team will examine all application
- 32 materials including the arts review team evaluations, and will
- 33 select pupils for placement. The final review team includes the
- 34 director, two program associates from the center selected by the
- 35 director and the following persons selected by the board: a

- 1 Minnesota performing artist, a Minnesota visual artist, a
- 2 Minnesota literary artist, two educators from the Minnesota
- 3 public school system, and a psychologist.
- 4 3600.0060 EVALUATION BY THE FINAL REVIEW TEAM.
- 5 Subpart 1. Applicants' school records. Applicants' school
- 6 records must be evaluated by the final review team designated in
- 7 part 3600.0050. They must examine three factors in the school
- 8 records: consistent failing or below average grades, severe
- 9 drops in grades, and consistent high absentee rates. If any of
- 10 these three factors appear, the final review team will request
- ll additional information from the applicants and the applicants'
- 12 home schools to determine if these factors would make placement
- 13 in the full-time high school program inappropriate. If the
- 14 information is not received within two weeks after the center's
- 15 request, a decision will be based on the information previously
- 16 provided.
- 17 Subp. 2. Recommendations. The final review team must read
- 18 the applicants' recommendations to determine the applicants'
- 19 attitudes about prior learning in the academic and arts areas.
- 20 The final review team may assign from zero to five points for
- 21 each recommendation. The final review team will assign points
- 22 in the area of attitude according to what extent the
- 23 recommendations demonstrate an applicant's motivation and
- 24 commitment to learning.
- Subp. 3. Arts review process results. If an applicant
- 26 remains in the process after evaluation of information in
- 27 subpart 1, all information gathered as described in parts
- 28 3600.0040, subparts 4 and 5, and 3600.0060, subpart 2, will be
- 29 placed on a matrix, assigned a numerical rating, and totaled for
- 30 a final score. This process will be done by the final review
- 31 team. The final review team will chart scores on the matrix
- 32 according to the congressional districts of all applicants. An
- 33 equal number of applicants must be selected from each
- 34 congressional district. If a congressional district does not
- 35 have enough qualified applicants to fill its quota, the

- l remaining positions shall be distributed equally to qualified
- 2 applicants from other congressional districts.
