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6 Rules as Adopted

7 3700.0285 SWINE PRODUCTION MANAGEMENT.

8 Subpart 1. **May teach.** A teacher who has a swine
9 production management license may teach in the swine production
10 management program and may also teach courses in:

11 A. swine specific content;

12 B. agriculture commodity marketing and purchasing;

13 and

14 C. agricultural employee and employer relationships.

15 Subp. 2. **Other requirements.** The applicant must meet the
16 requirements under part 3700.0100 and the requirements for a
17 teacher in the agricultural occupational area under part
18 3700.0200.

19 Subp. 3. **Educational and occupational experience**
20 **requirement.** The applicant must have either:

21 A. a bachelor's degree or above with a major in an
22 agricultural field and 4,000 hours of occupational experience as
23 an owner/operator, manager, supervisor, or service
24 representative in the swine production areas of breeding,
25 farrowing, nursery, and finishing; or

26 B. two years of postsecondary education from an
27 accredited postsecondary institution in swine production
28 management and 6,000 hours of occupational experience as an
29 owner/operator, manager, supervisor, or service representative
30 in the swine production areas of breeding, farrowing, nursery,
31 and finishing.

32 Subp. 4. **Substitution for occupational experience.**

33 Teaching experience at an accredited postsecondary institution
34 or industrial setting may be substituted for 1,500 of the 2,000
35 hours of recent occupational experience if the teaching is done

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1 during the five-year period. The teaching must be in primary
2 program content in swine production management. Two hours of
3 teaching equal one hour of recent occupational experience.
