E. the amount of the grant request as a proportion of the total amount of grant funds available, to the extent that funds can be used to support several different projects; F. the ability of the applicant to proceed expeditiously with the project;

G. the prior experience of the applicant in providing
housing and housing related services to low income people; and
H. the extent to which the organization has low
income persons in its membership.
