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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Fees

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5 Rules as Adopted

6 1800.0500 FEES.

7 Subpart 1. **Requirements.** Application for examination for
8 certification as engineer-in-training, or licensure, including
9 renewal of licensure, as an architect, professional engineer,
10 land surveyor, or landscape architect, shall be accompanied by a
11 fee in the amount provided for in this part. The fee for
12 examination for certification as land surveyor-in-training shall
13 be paid upon approval of the application by the board.

15 Subp. 3. **Initial licensure and renewal.** The fee for
16 licensure, or renewal of licensure, as an architect,
17 professional engineer, land surveyor, or landscape architect is
18 \$58 per biennium. The initial license fee is prorated at
19 six-month intervals during each biennium. The fee for months 24
20 to 18 is \$58; for months 18 to 12, \$43.50; for months 12 to 6,
21 \$29; and for months 6 to 0, \$14.50. The renewal fee shall be
22 paid biennially on or before June 30 of each even-numbered
23 year. The board may delete from the roster of licensees the
24 name of any licensee who fails to timely pay the required
25 renewal fee. The renewal fee, when paid by mail, is not timely
26 paid unless it is postmarked on or before June 30 of each
27 even-numbered year.

29 Subp. 5. **Certification or licensure examination fee.** The
30 fee for examination for certification or licensure as an
31 architect, professional engineer, land surveyor, or landscape
32 architect is as follows:

33 A. Architect Registration Examination (ARE), 1990
34 \$385, 1991 \$475.

35 B. Professional engineer:

- 1 (1) fundamentals of engineering examination, \$30;
- 2 (2) principles and practice of engineering
- 3 examination, \$70.

4 An applicant for examination in more than one branch of
 5 engineering shall submit a separate examination fee for each
 6 additional branch of engineering for which the applicant has
 7 applied for examination.

8 An applicant, currently licensed as a professional engineer
 9 (civil) may apply for registration as a professional engineer
 10 (structural) by submitting an examination fee of \$110 for 1990
 11 and \$170 for 1991 and thereafter.

15 Subp. 6. Reexamination fees. The fee for retaking all or
 16 any part of any examination for certification or licensure is as
 17 follows each time the examination, or any part of it, is retaken:

18 A. Architect, uniform architect registration
 19 examination:

- 21 (2) division B, site design;
 - 22 (a) written, 1990 \$25, 1991 \$35;
 - 23 (b) graphics, 1990 \$60, 1991 \$70;

 25 \$100;
- 26 (4) division D/F, structural technology, general
 27 and long span, 1990 \$35, 1991 \$45;
- 28 (5) division E, structural technology, lateral
 29 forces, 1990 \$20, 1991 \$30;
- 30 (6) division G, mechanical, plumbing, electrical,
 31 and life safety, 1990 \$40, 1991 \$50;
- 32 (7) division H, materials and methods, 1990 \$40,
