- 8 Subpart 1. Use of clinical settings. Whenever a program
- 9 uses a clinical setting to meet the requirements of parts
- 10 6301.1500 to 6301.2200 registered professional nurse faculty
- 11 members must be responsible for determining clinical learning
- 12 activities and for guiding and evaluating students in that
- 13 setting.

- 27 LICENSURE OF PROFESSIONAL AND PRACTICAL NURSES
- 28 6305.0100 DEFINITIONS.
- 29 Subpart 1. Scope. As used in parts 6305.0100 to
- 30 6305.0700, the following terms have the meanings given them.
- 31 [For text of subps 2 to 7, see M.R.]
- 32 Subp. 7a. Disaster. "Disaster" means an occurrence such
- 33 as a tornado, storm, flood, high water, earthquake, drought,
- 34 blizzard, pestilence, fire, explosion, building collapse,

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- 1 commercial transportation wreck, or other situation that causes
- 2 human suffering or create human needs that require substantial
- 3 assistance and exceed the health care resources of the community.
- 4 [For text of subps 8 and 9, see M.R.]
- 5 Subp. 10. Final term of study. "Final term of study"
- 6 means the last academic period (quarter, term, session, or
- 7 semester) that is necessary for an applicant to complete
- 8 graduation requirements. The term must have officially begun at
- 9 least one day before the examination.

- 11 Subp. 15. and 16. [See Repealer.]

- 13 6305.0200 PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY.
- 14 Parts 6305.0100 to 6305.0700 are adopted pursuant to
- 15 Minnesota Statutes, section 148.191. The parts pertain to the
- 16 authorization to practice, the requirements for licensure by
- 17 examination, the requirements for licensure without examination,
- 18 and nullification of applications. Part 6305.0400 applies to
- 19 applicants who have not passed an examination acceptable to the
- 20 board. Part 6305.0500 applies to applicants who have passed an
- 21 examination acceptable to the board.
- 22 6305.0300 AUTHORIZATION TO PRACTICE NURSING.
- 23 Subpart 1. Required authorization. A Minnesota license
- 24 and current registration certificate or a permit is required if
- 25 an individual practices professional nursing as defined in
- 26 Minnesota Statutes, section 148.171, clause (3), or practical
- 27 nursing as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.171,
- 28 clause (5), whether for monetary compensation or as a volunteer,
- 29 or if an individual is a faculty member for an out-of-state
- 30 nursing or nursing assistant program and is supervising nursing
- 31 students or nursing assistant students in Minnesota except as
- 32 provided in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.271. If the permit
- 33 is revoked or expires, whichever occurs first, an applicant must
- 34 not practice nursing until a license has been issued.
- 35 Exceptions as identified in Minnesota Statutes, section

- 1 148.271, include the following:
- A. Nursing assistance in an emergency as referenced
- 3 in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.271, clause (1), is
- 4 interpreted to include nursing service as follows:
- 5 (1) to patients during transport into, through,
- 6 or out of Minnesota including during flights and while at
- 7 airports or depots or during the period of stabilization in
- 8 preparation for transport;
- 9 (2) for disaster relief during a period not to
- 10 exceed seven days; and
- 11 (3) providing nursing services at the scene of an
- 12 accident.
- B. Formal, structured course of study as referenced
- 14 in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.271, clause (6), is
- 15 interpreted to mean that the course is sponsored by an
- 16 educational institution or the educational department of a
- 17 health care facility; has written, measurable objectives; has an
- 18 organized plan of study which includes instructors and, when
- 19 appropriate, clinical supervisors; uses a formalized method of
- 20 evaluating student performance; and issues a document which
- 21 verifies completion of the course.
- 22 C. Nursing program approved by the board as
- 23 referenced in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.271, clause (7),
- 24 is interpreted to include any nursing program in the United
- 25 States or Canada which is approved by the state or province in
- 26 which the program is located. However, the supervising
- 27 instructor must hold a Minnesota registered nurse license and
- 28 current registration.
- 29 Subp. la. Authorized abbreviations. The categories of
- 30 nursing personnel listed below may use abbreviations as follows:
- 31 A. Public health nurse, abbreviated "PHN."
- 32 B. Registered nurse, abbreviated "RN," may only be
- 33 used by a registered nurse who is currently registered in
- 34 Minnesota or an applicant for licensure in Minnesota who holds a
- 35 permit as authorized in subpart 9.
- 36 C. Licensed practical nurse, abbreviated "LPN," may

- 1 only be used by a licensed practical nurse who is currently
- 2 registered in Minnesota or an applicant for licensure in
- 3 Minnesota who holds a permit as authorized in subpart 9.
- 4 D. Registered nurses and licensed practical nurses
- 5 who are licensed in Minnesota but who are not currently
- 6 registered may use the abbreviation "RN" and "LPN" respectively
- 7 for personal identification provided it is not used for monetary
- 8 gain.
- 9 E. Nursing assistants who are on the long-term care
- 10 registry of the board are nursing assistants/registered,
- 11 abbreviated "NA/R."

- Subp. 4. Eligibility for permit to practice nursing with
- 14 direct supervision. The board shall grant an applicant who is
- 15 not the subject of a pending investigation or disciplinary
- 16 action a permit to practice nursing under the direct supervision
- 17 of a registered nurse if the applicant:
- [For text of items A to F, see M.R.]
- 19 G. has graduated from an approved program as
- 20 specified in part 6305.0400, subpart 4 or 5; and
- 21 [For text of item H, see M.R.]
- [For text of subp 5, see M.R.]
- 23 Subp. 6. Permit to practice nursing without direct
- 24 supervision. The board shall grant an applicant who is not the
- 25 subject of a pending investigation or disciplinary action a
- 26 permit to practice nursing that does not require direct
- 27 supervision if the applicant:
- [For text of items A to D, see M.R.]
- 29 Subp. 7. Length of permits. The permit authorizing
- 30 practice under the direct supervision of a registered nurse
- 31 expires eight weeks after the administration of the examination
- 32 or upon the applicant's notification by the board of failure on
- 33 the examination, whichever occurs first. The board may extend
- 34 this permit an additional eight weeks if the applicant's results
- 35 are delayed due to a processing delay by another nurse licensing
- 36 agency or if the applicant has come under investigation by the

- 1 board after the issuance of the initial permit until the matter
- 2 is resolved for the applicant who is under investigation by the
- 3 board.
- 4 The permit authorizing practice without direct supervision
- 5 expires six months after the date of issue, but the board shall
- 6 extend this permit if licensure cannot occur because of a
- 7 processing delay by another nurse licensing agency.
- 8 Subp. 8. Revocation of permit. The board shall revoke a
- 9 permit in the following situations.
- 10 A. The board shall revoke a permit if the permit
- 11 holder:
- (1) does not write the scheduled examination;
- 13 (2) has been notified of the results of the
- 14 examination;
- 15 (3) is licensed by the board;
- 16 (4) did not write in another jurisdiction an
- 17 examination acceptable to the board;
- 18 (5) did not pass an examination in another
- 19 jurisdiction with a score acceptable to the board;
- 20 (6) is not eligible for licensure; or
- 21 (7) did not graduate.
- B. The board may act to decide whether to revoke a
- 23 permit if the board determines that:
- 24 (1) an applicant for licensure by examination did
- 25 not meet the graduation requirements in part 6305.0400, subpart
- 26 4 or 5;
- 27 (2) an applicant for licensure without
- 28 examination presented fraudulent evidence of licensure in
- 29 another jurisdiction or Canadian province; or
- 30 (3) an applicant has engaged in conduct which
- 31 constitutes grounds for denial of a license.
- 32 Subp. 9. Designated titles. The permit holder who is an
- 33 applicant for registered nurse licensure by examination shall
- 34 use the title "graduate nurse," abbreviated "GN." The permit
- 35 holder who is an applicant for registered nurse licensure
- 36 without examination shall use the title registered nurse,

- l abbreviated "RN." The permit holder who is an applicant for
- 2 licensed practical nurse licensure by examination shall use the
- 3 title "graduate practical nurse," abbreviated "GPN." The permit
- 4 holder who is an applicant for licensed practical nurse
- 5 licensure without examination shall use the title "licensed
- 6 practical nurse," abbreviated "LPN."
- 7 6305.0400 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE BY EXAMINATION.
- 8 Subpart 1. Licensure application. An applicant shall
- 9 obtain the application forms for licensure and instructions for
- 10 filing from the board. An applicant shall respond to questions
- ll on the application that relate to the grounds for disciplinary
- 12 action in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.261. An applicant
- 13 shall submit true information. Falsification or omission of
- 14 information provides grounds for disciplinary action. The
- 15 application must be notarized. If an application is received
- 16 without a fee, it shall be returned to the applicant.
- [For text of subp 2, see M.R.]
- Subp. 3. Further evidence. The board may require further
- 19 information of the applicant in order to determine whether the
- 20 applicant has engaged in conduct warranting disciplinary action
- 21 as set forth in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.261.
- Subp. 4. Graduation from approved professional nursing
- 23 program. An applicant who has graduated from an approved
- 24 professional nursing program is eligible for licensure as a
- 25 registered nurse if the applicant's nursing education includes
- 26 classroom and clinical instruction. The learning activities
- 27 must have been provided according to either item A or B.
- [For text of items A and B, see M.R.]
- [For text of subp 5, see M.R.]
- 30 Subp. 6. Transcripts necessary for applicants educated in
- 31 foreign countries. An applicant who has graduated from a
- 32 program in another country shall submit a transcript in addition
- 33 to the affidavit of graduation required in subpart 8. The
- 34 applicant shall also submit a course description if the entries
- 35 on the transcript are not self-explanatory as to course

- 1 content. In lieu of the course description, an official of the
- 2 program may complete a form provided by the board. On a
- 3 notarized form, the official must attest to the applicant's
- 4 participation in classroom and clinical instruction consistent
- 5 with the required learning activities in part 6315.0400, subpart
- 6 4, for registered nurse applicants or subpart 5 for licensed
- 7 practical nurse applicants. If the transcript and course
- 8 description are not in English, a translation must be done by an
- 9 agency or individual specified by the board. The cost of this
- 10 translation must be paid by the applicant.
- If an official transcript cannot be submitted because of
- 12 political unrest or alleged governmental reprisal if the school
- 13 releases the documents or if the original school records were
- 14 destroyed because of a disaster or record destruction decision,
- 15 or the school is closed, the board will accept one of the
- 16 following:
- A. verification of the applicant's nursing education
- 18 from the Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing Schools;
- 19 B. verification of the applicant's nursing education
- 20 from a licensing authority;
- 21 C. verification of the applicant's nursing education
- 22 from a credentialing body for refugees which was established by
- 23 a national or international nursing or governmental
- 24 organization;
- D. a copy of a transcript of the applicant's nursing
- 26 education from a college or university that accepted the
- 27 applicant for further study, the copy certified as a true and
- 28 correct copy of the transcript in the files and records of the
- 29 college or university; or
- 30 E. a copy of the transcript of the applicant's
- 31 nursing education from another licensing authority, the copy
- 32 certified as a true and correct copy of the transcript in the
- 33 files and records of the licensing authority.
- 34 If the entries on an official transcript are not
- 35 self-explanatory as to course content and further educational
- 36 information cannot be obtained because of political unrest,

- 1 alleged governmental reprisal if the school releases the
- 2 information, or if the records have been destroyed, the board
- 3 shall accept the verifications of item A or C.
- 4 [For text of subp 7, see M.R.]
- 5 Subp. 8. Affidavit of graduation. An applicant shall have
- 6 an affidavit of graduation completed and signed by an official
- 7 of the nursing program. The completed affidavit must bear the
- 8 seal or stamp of the program. For an applicant who has
- 9 graduated from a program in another country, if the school does
- 10 not notarize or does not complete the affidavit, the transcript
- 11 may be accepted in lieu of the notarization. An applicant must
- 12 submit the affidavit before the examination unless the applicant
- 13 will be writing the examination before graduation. An applicant
- 14 who graduates after writing an examination shall submit the
- 15 affidavit after graduation but before licensure. An applicant
- 16 who fails an examination shall submit the affidavit before
- 17 reexamination.
- 18 If the board finds after the examination has been written
- 19 that the affidavit of graduation was completed in error, the
- 20 applicant's permit shall be considered void. The examination
- 21 results shall not be released nor action taken on the
- 22 application until the applicant has graduated. Graduation
- 23 requirements must be met no later than the next available school
- 24 term following notification of nongraduation. If there is
- 25 evidence that the applicant was aware of nongraduation status
- 26 before the examination and did not inform the board, the matter
- 27 may be handled through a disciplinary proceeding.

- 29 Subp. 10. Fees. The board shall charge the following fees.
- 30 A. The licensure fee is \$75 for an applicant for
- 31 registered nurse licensure and \$50 for an applicant for licensed
- 32 practical nurse licensure. This fee must be paid to the board
- 33 and must be received before evaluation of an applicant's
- 34 qualifications for examination and licensure.
- 35 B. The examination fee is set by the examination
- 36 vendor and must be submitted to the agency specified by the

- 1 board each time an applicant wants to be scheduled to write an
- 2 examination.
- 3 C. The reexamination fee is \$50 for an applicant for
- 4 registered nurse licensure and \$40 for an applicant for licensed
- 5 practical nurse licensure. The fee must be paid to the board.
- D. A late filing fee of \$50 must be remitted to the
- 7 board if one or more of the following materials is not properly
- 8 postmarked or delivered by the deadline:
- 9 (1) licensure application and fee;
- 10 (2) examination application and fee;
- 11 (3) reexamination application and fee.
- 12 E. Personal checks are not accepted. Each remittance
- 13 must be in the form of United States currency, cashier's check,
- 14 or money order.
- F. If for any reason a license is not issued, fees
- 16 are not refundable.
- 17 Subp. 11. Deadline for submitting material. The deadline
- 18 for submitting all required applications and fees is 56 calendar
- 19 days preceding an examination. The board shall use the postmark
- 20 and address to determine compliance. If the required
- 21 applications and fees are not received on time, the applicant
- 22 must pay a late filing fee.
- 23 Late applications and fees, and the late filing fee if
- 24 applicable, must be received no later than 4:30 p.m. two working
- 25 days before the examination. All other documents must be
- 26 received no later than 4:30 p.m. the day before an examination.
- 27 Subp. 12. Written examination. The licensure examinations
- 28 are the examinations of the National Council of State Boards of
- 29 Nursing, Inc. An applicant must receive a pass on the National
- 30 Council Licensure Examination.
- 31 [For text of items A to F, see M.R.]
- 32 G. An applicant who fails an examination may apply
- 33 for reexamination on a reexamination application supplied by the
- 34 board and must obey all other applicable rules. An applicant
- 35 shall respond to questions on the application that relate to the
- 36 grounds for disciplinary action listed in Minnesota Statutes,

- 1 section 148.261. The board may require further information of
- 2 the applicant in order to determine whether the applicant has
- 3 engaged in conduct warranting disciplinary action. An applicant
- 4 must submit true information. Falsification or omission of
- 5 information provides grounds for denial of a license. The
- 6 application must be notarized. If an application is received
- 7 without a fee, it shall be returned to the applicant.
- 8 H. An applicant may write the examination for
- 9 Minnesota licensure specified in this subpart in another
- 10 jurisdiction if the board authorizes the applicant to do so and
- 11 the jurisdiction is willing to administer the examination. The
- 12 applicant must meet any procedural requirements and pay any fees
- 13 set by the other jurisdiction.
- 14 6305.0500 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE WITHOUT EXAMINATION.
- 15 Subpart 1. Proof of licensure in another jurisdiction or
- 16 Canada. To be licensed to practice nursing in Minnesota without
- 17 writing an examination, an applicant must submit proof, on a
- 18 form provided by the board, that the applicant is licensed in
- 19 another jurisdiction or Canadian province and has passed an
- 20 examination acceptable to the board as listed in subparts 11 and
- 21 12. Proof of licensure must be obtained from the jurisdiction
- 22 or Canadian province in which the applicant wrote an acceptable
- 23 examination as well as the jurisdiction or Canadian province in
- 24 which the applicant was most recently employed. Proof of
- 25 licensure must be obtained from the jurisdiction in which the
- 26 applicant was first licensed, if this is different from the
- 27 jurisdiction in which the applicant was licensed based on an
- 28 acceptable examination.
- Subp. 2. Licensure application. An applicant shall obtain
- 30 the application forms and instructions for filing from the board.
- 31 An applicant shall respond to questions on the application that
- 32 relate to the grounds for disciplinary action listed in
- 33 Minnesota Statutes, section 148.261. An applicant shall submit
- 34 true information. Falsification or omission of any information
- 35 provides grounds for denial of a license. The application must

- 1 be notarized. If an application is received without a fee, it
- 2 shall be returned to the applicant. Application for licensure
- 3 begins on the date when an application and fee are received by
- 4 the board.
- 5 Subp. 3. Fee. The fee for licensure is \$55. This fee
- 6 must be paid to the board and must be received before evaluation
- 7 of an applicant's qualifications for licensure. Personal checks
- 8 are not accepted. Remittance must be in the form of United
- 9 States currency, cashier's check, or money order. If for any
- 10 reason a license is not issued, the fee is not refundable.
- 11 Subp. 4. Further evidence. The board may require further
- 12 information of the applicant in order to determine whether the
- 13 applicant has engaged in conduct warranting disciplinary action
- 14 as set forth in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.261.
- 15 [For text of subp 5, see M.R.]
- 16 Subp. 6. Waiver of graduation requirement. The board
- 17 shall waive the requirement of graduation from an approved
- 18 nursing program if:
- 19 [For text of item A, see M.R.]
- B. an applicant for licensed practical nurse
- 21 licensure has been licensed by another jurisdiction and passed
- 22 an acceptable examination as specified in subpart 12 and has had
- 23 at least 4,000 clock hours of employment as a licensed practical
- 24 nurse in the 60 calendar months preceding application for
- 25 licensure in Minnesota.
- Subp. 7. Current nursing education or experience. An
- 27 applicant who has been employed in nursing or who has graduated
- 28 from an approved nursing program during the two years
- 29 immediately preceding application for licensure is exempt from
- 30 the continuing education requirements in subparts 8 and 9.
- 31 Employment references must be submitted to verify employment
- 32 dates. An affidavit of graduation or evidence from the nurse
- 33 licensing agency in another jurisdiction or Canadian province
- 34 must be submitted to verify the graduation date.
- 35 Subp. 8. Continuing education for registered nurses. An
- 36 applicant for registered nurse licensure must participate in

- 1 continuing education activities as follows:
- 2 A. If the applicant has not been employed as a
- 3 registered nurse during the two years immediately preceding
- 4 receipt by the board of the application, the applicant must
- 5 participate in continuing education activities which meet the
- 6 criteria in part 6310.2800 and must submit an affidavit of
- 7 continuing education. The continuing education participation
- 8 must have occurred within the 24 months preceding board action
- 9 on the application for licensure.
- 10 B. If an applicant for registered nurse licensure has
- 11 not been employed as a registered nurse at least 320 hours
- 12 within the four years preceding receipt by the board of the
- 13 application for licensure, the applicant shall successfully
- 14 complete a refresher course and submit an affidavit of
- 15 completion. The refresher course must be completed within the
- 16 24 months immediately preceding board action on the application
- 17 for licensure.
- 18 Subp. 9. Continuing education for practical nurses. An
- 19 applicant for licensed practical nurse licensure must
- 20 participate in continuing education as follows:
- 21 A. If the applicant has not been employed as a
- 22 licensed practical nurse during the two years immediately
- 23 preceding receipt by the board of the application, the applicant
- 24 must participate in at least 15 clock hours of nursing-related
- 25 continuing education courses. The continuing education may be
- 26 part of an orientation program provided by an employer or
- 27 potential employer. The continuing education must have occurred
- 28 within the 24 months preceding board action on the application
- 29 for licensure. The applicant must submit an affidavit of
- 30 continuing education.
- 31 B. If an applicant for licensed practical nurse
- 32 licensure has not been employed as a licensed practical nurse at
- 33 least 320 hours within the four years preceding receipt by the
- 34 board of the application for licensure, the applicant shall
- 35 successfully complete a refresher course and submit an affidavit
- 36 of completion. The refresher course must be completed within

- 1 the 24 months immediately preceding board action on the
- 2 application for licensure.
- 3 Subp. 10. Affidavit of graduation. An applicant must
- 4 submit an affidavit of graduation, signed by an official of the
- 5 nursing program and bearing the seal or stamp of the program.
- 6 If an official school transcript is submitted, it shall be
- 7 accepted in lieu of an affidavit of graduation. An affidavit is
- 8 not required if the licensing authority in another jurisdiction
- 9 or Canadian province verifies graduation from an approved
- 10 program. If a licensed practical nurse applicant has not
- ll graduated from an approved program, the applicant shall send his
- 12 or her employer a form supplied by the board for documentation
- 13 of 4,000 clock hours of employment. The form must be completed
- 14 by the employer and returned to the board. The board shall
- 15 determine if the employment fulfills the requirement of
- 16 Minnesota Statutes, section 148.211, subdivision 4.
- 17 Subp. 11. Acceptable examinations for registered nurses.
- 18 The requirement of having passed a written examination
- 19 acceptable to the board for registered nurse licensure is
- 20 fulfilled if an applicant has:
- 21 A. passed a state-constructed examination or the
- 22 State Board Test Pool Examination for Registered Nurses
- 23 (SBTPE-RN) before 1957;
- B. passed the SBTPE-RN after December 31, 1956, and
- 25 before July 1, 1982, with a scaled score of at least 350 on each
- 26 of the five parts;
- C. passed NCLEX-RN after June 30, 1982, and before
- 28 February 1, 1989, with a scaled score of 1,600; or
- D. passed NCLEX-RN after January 31, 1989, with a
- 30 designation of pass.
- 31 Subp. 12. Acceptable examinations for practical nurses.
- 32 The requirement of having passed a written examination
- 33 acceptable to the board for licensed practical nurse licensure
- 34 is fulfilled if an applicant has:
- 35 A. passed a state-constructed examination or the
- 36 State Board Test Pool Examination for Practical Nurses

- 1 (SBTPE-PN) before 1960;
- B. passed the SBTPE-PN after December 31, 1959, and
- 3 before January 1, 1970, with a scaled score of at least 370;
- 4 C. passed the SBTPE-PN after December 31, 1969, and
- 5 before October 1, 1982, with a scaled score of at least 400;
- D. passed NCLEX-PN after September 30, 1982, and
- 7 before October 1, 1988, with a scaled score of at least 350; or
- 8 E. passed NCLEX-PN after September 30, 1988, with a
- 9 designation of pass.
- 10 Subp. 13. Insufficient score. An applicant for licensure
- 11 whose examination score does not meet the Minnesota score
- 12 requirement in subpart 11 or 12 must write the examination
- 13 currently used in Minnesota, achieve the passing score
- 14 established for the current examination, and meet the
- 15 requirements in part 6305.0400, subparts 2, 10, 11, and 12.
- 16 REGISTRATION OF PROFESSIONAL AND PRACTICAL NURSES
- 17 6310.2600 DEFINITIONS.

- 19 Subp. 5. Continuing education report form. "Continuing
- 20 education report form" means the printed document provided by
- 21 the board for use in reporting the information required in parts
- 22 6310.2800 to 6310.2900.
- 23 Subp. 5a. Deferment. "Deferment" means postponement of
- 24 participation in and reporting of all or part of the continuing
