- 8 Subp. 2. Exclusions. A person who conducts any of the
- 9 following activities is not required to obtain a hazardous waste
- 10 facility permit for that activity:

- 17 Subp. 37a. Household. "Household" has the meaning given
- 18 in Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.96, subdivision 1, paragraph
- 19 (a).
- 20 Subp. 37b. Household hazardous waste. "Household
- 21 hazardous waste" has the meaning given in Minnesota Statutes,
- 22 section 115A.96, subdivision 1, paragraph (b).
- Subp. 37c. Household waste. "Household waste" means any
- 24 material including garbage, trash, and sanitary wastes in septic
- 25 tanks derived from households, including single and multiple
- 26 residences, hotels and motels, bunkhouses, ranger stations, crew
- 27 quarters, campgrounds, picnic grounds, and day-use recreation
- 28 areas.

- 30 7045.0120 EXEMPT WASTES.
- The following wastes may be stored, labeled, transported,
- 32 treated, processed, and disposed of without complying with the
- 33 requirements of this chapter:
- A. household-waste-and-collected-household-hazardous

- 2 met collected household hazardous waste, to the extent that the
- 3 requirements in part 7045.0310 are met, and household waste;

- 5 7045.0310 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR WASTE COLLECTED AS RESULT OF
- 6 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.
- 7 Subpart 1. Applicability. A-person An operator who
- 8 establishes or operates all or part of a household hazardous
- 9 waste management program is only required to comply with the
- 10 requirements in this part with respect to collected household
- 11 hazardous waste. "Household hazardous waste management program"
- 12 means:
- 13 A. a program established to accept or collect
- 14 household hazardous waste from households, except as otherwise
- 15 provided in part 7045.0685;
- B. a program established by a resource recovery
- 17 facility to segregate household hazardous waste from household
- 18 waste; or
- C. a program established by a solid waste disposal
- 20 facility to segregate household hazardous waste from household
- 21 waste during processing activities.
- 22 Subp. 2. Notification. A-person An operator who intends
- 23 to establish or operate all or part of a household hazardous
- 24 waste management program shall ensure that the information
- 25 required in items A to K is submitted to the commissioner at
- 26 least 30 days before initiating the household hazardous waste
- 27 management program. This notification is not required for
- 28 collection sites for which a permit is required under part
- 29 7001.0520.
- The notification shall provide a complete description of
- 31 the program including, as applicable:
- A. the name, address, and telephone number of persons
- 33 operators establishing the program;
- 34 B. the location of all household hazardous waste
- 35 collection sites;

- 1 C. the duration and operating hours of the program;
- D. the intended program service area;
- 3 E. the manner in which waste will be collected,
- 4 stored, treated, transported, and disposed of;
- 5 F. the amount of time the person operator intends to
- 6 store collected waste at individual collection sites;
- 7 G. a description of the physical structures to be
- 8 used to collect and store collected waste;
- 9 H. a description of personnel safety training to be
- 10 given;
- I. a description of the safety and emergency
- 12 procedures established for the program;
- J. any other information necessary to describe all
- 14 aspects of the program; and
- 15 K. the name and address of all waste transporters and
- 16 the facilities which will treat or dispose of the waste.
- 17 Persons Operators who submit a notification and
- 18 subsequently change any aspect of the program as described in
- 19 the notification must submit, within 30 days of making the
- 20 change, an amended notification to the commissioner fully
- 21 describing the program changes.
- Subp. 3. Management requirements. A-person An operator
- 23 who establishes or operates all or part of a household hazardous
- 24 waste management program shall ensure that collected waste is
- 25 managed in compliance with the hazardous waste generator
- 26 requirements in parts 7045.0205 to 7045.0304, except as modified
- 27 in items A to H.
- A. The person operator need not comply with the
- 29 disclosure and management plan requirements of parts 7045.0220,
- 30 7045.0230, and 7045.0240 to 7045.0249.
- 31 B. The person operator need not obtain a generator
- 32 identification number as required in part 7045.0221, unless or
- 33 until the person operator transports or offers for transport
- 34 household hazardous waste for off-site treatment, storage, or
- 35 disposal at a permitted hazardous waste facility.
- 36 C. The person operator need not meet the personnel

- 1 training, preparedness, prevention, and contingency planning
- 2 requirements of part 7045.0292, subpart 1, item H.
- 3 D. The person operator may only transport or offer
- 4 for transport household hazardous waste for off-site activities
- 5 to a facility that either has a hazardous waste permit or has
- 6 obtained the commissioner's approval under subpart 6.
- 7 E. If the person operator transports or offers for
- 8 transport household hazardous waste for off-site activities at a
- 9 facility that has obtained the commissioner's approval under
- 10 subpart 6, the person operator:
- 11 (1) may, in lieu of a manifest, prepare and use a
- 12 shipping paper containing all the information required on a
- 13 manifest in part 7045.0261, excluding the identification number,
- 14 to comply with the requirements of parts 7045.0205 to 7045.0304;
- 15 (2) may, in lieu of designating a facility or
- 16 alternate facility as required in part 7045.0261, subpart 2,
- 17 designate a facility approved under subpart 6 on the shipping
- 18 paper prepared under subitem (1);
- 19 (3) must either designate another facility
- 20 approved under subpart 6 or instruct the transporter to return
- 21 the waste, if the transporter is unable to deliver the household
- 22 hazardous waste to the facility designated on the shipping
- 23 paper; and
- 24 (4) need not comply with the waste management
- 25 requirements of part 7045.0275, subpart 1.
- 26 F. If the person operator intends to store household
- 27 hazardous waste for more than 90 days after the accumulation
- 28 start date as provided in part 7045.0292, the person operator
- 29 must obtain the approval of the commissioner as set out in
- 30 subpart 6, but no facility permit is required unless the person
- 31 operator treats or disposes of the waste on-site.
- 32 G. The person operator need not comply with the
- 33 record keeping requirements of part 7045.0294, subparts 2 and 3.
- 34 H. The person operator need not comply with the
- 35 annual reporting requirements of part 7045.0296.
- 36 Subp. 4. Additional requirements. In addition to the

- 1 requirements in subpart 3, a-person an operator who establishes
- 2 or operates all or part of a household hazardous waste
- 3 management program, shall also comply with the requirements for
- 4 personnel training, ignitable, reactive, or incompatible wastes,
- 5 preparedness and prevention, arrangements with local authorities
- 6 for emergencies, contingency planning, emergency procedures, and
- 7 postemergency procedures in parts 7045.0454, subparts 1 to 3;
- 8 7045.0456, subparts 1 and 2; 7045.0462; 7045.0464; 7045.0468;
- 9 7045.0470; and 7045.0572, respectively.
- 10 Subp. 5. Transportation requirements. A-person An
- 11 operator or other persons who transports transport waste
- 12 collected as a result of a household hazardous waste management
- 13 program shall transport collected waste in compliance with the
- 14 requirements in items A to C.
- A. A transporter may not accept household hazardous
- 16 waste from any person operator who establishes or operates all
- 17 or part of a household hazardous waste management program unless
- 18 the waste is accompanied by either a manifest signed by the
- 19 generator according to parts 7045.0205 to 7045.0304 or a
- 20 shipping paper prepared according to subpart 3, item E, subitem
- 21 (1).
- B. If the designated facility to which the household
- 23 hazardous waste is destined has a hazardous waste facility
- 24 permit, the transporter shall comply with all of the hazardous
- 25 waste transporter requirements in parts 7045.0351 to 7045.0397.
- 26 C. If the designated facility to which the household
- 27 hazardous waste is destined is a facility that has obtained
- 28 approval from the commissioner under subpart 6, the transporter
- 29 shall comply with the hazardous waste transporter requirements
- 30 in parts 7045.0351 to 7045.0395, except:
- 31 (1) part 7045.0361; and
- 32 (2) a shipping paper prepared according to
- 33 subpart 3, item E, subitem (1), may be used, in lieu of a
- 34 manifest, to comply with the requirements of parts 7045.0351 to
- 35 7045.0395.
- 36 D. An operator who transports waste for hire in

- 1 Minnesota must obtain for-hire operating authority from the
- 2 Minnesota Transportation Regulation Board as required by
- 3 Minnesota Statutes, chapter 221.
- Subp. 6. Storage of collected wastes. A-person An
- 5 operator who stores household hazardous waste for more than 90
- 6 days must comply with the requirements of items A to E.
- 7 A. No person operator may store household hazardous
- 8 waste for more than 90 days after the accumulation start date as
- 9 provided in part 7045.0292, without the approval of the
- 10 commissioner. A person operator may request approval from the
- 11 commissioner to store household hazardous waste for more than 90
- 12 days.
- B. A-person An operator intending to store household
- 14 hazardous waste for more than 90 days must submit a request for
- 15 approval to the commissioner at least 30 days before initiating
- 16 a household hazardous waste program. The commissioner shall
- 17 approve the request if the commissioner determines that, based
- 18 on the information contained in the request, the storage and
- 19 management practices employed at the storage facility will
- 20 appropriately protect human health and the environment from any
- 21 adverse effects associated with the household hazardous waste.
- 22 C. If the commissioner approves a request, the person
- 23 operator shall manage the waste in compliance with the
- 24 applicable standards in part 7045.0526 for the use and
- 25 management of containers, but no hazardous waste facility permit
- 26 is required unless the person operator treats or disposes of the
- 27 waste on-site.
- D. If the commissioner does not approve a request,
- 29 the person operator must transport or arrange to transport the
- 30 household hazardous waste for off-site activities at a facility
- 31 that either has a hazardous waste permit or has obtained the
- 32 commissioner's approval under this subpart. Persons Operators
- 33 who store household hazardous waste for more than 90 days
- 34 without the commissioner's approval are in violation of this
- 35 chapter.
- 36 E. If the person operator has not submitted a request

- 1 as required under item B, or if the commissioner does not
- 2 approve a request, the commissioner may still grant a storage
- 3 extension if household hazardous waste must remain on-site for
- 4 longer than 90 days due to unforeseen, temporary, and
- 5 uncontrollable circumstances as provided in part 7045.0292,
- 6 subpart 3.
