- 7005.0705 DEFINITIONS. 9
- 10 Subpart 1. Scope. As used in parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815
- the terms defined in this part have the meanings given. 11
- Subp. 2. Agency. "Agency" means the Minnesota Pollution 12
- Control Agency. 13
- 14 Subp. 3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the
- commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. 15
- 16 Subp. 4. Delegated authority. "Delegated authority" means
- 17 a town, home rule charter or statutory city or metropolitan
- 18 county as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 473.121,
- 19 subdivision 4, authorized by the commissioner to issue open
- burning permits under part 7005.0767. 20
- 21 Subp. 5. Incorporated land. "Incorporated land" means
- 22 land within a home rule charter or statutory city.
- 23 Subp. 6. Land used for farming. "Land used for farming"
- 24 means land that is in agricultural use as defined in Minnesota
- Statutes, section 17.81. 25
- Subp. 7. Local authority. "Local authority" means a local 26
- 27 fire chief, fire marshal, fire warden, or local governmental
- 28 official.
- 29 Subp. 7 8. Nonattainment area. "Nonattainment area" means
- a geographic region that has been: 30
- 31 designated by the agency as violating a state
- 32 ambient air quality standard; or
- 33 designated by the United States Environmental
- 34 Protection Agency as violating a national ambient air quality

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35 standard in Code of Federal Regulations, title 40, section

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- 1 81.324, as amended.
- 2 Subp. 8 9. Open burning. "Open burning" means the burning
- 3 of any matter if the resultant combustion products are emitted
- 4 directly to the atmosphere without passing through a stack,
- 5 duct, or chimney.
- 6 Subp. 9 10. Owner or operator. "Owner" or "operator"
- 7 means a person who owns, leases, operates, controls, or
- 8 supervises an open burning site, or who conducts open burning.
- 9 Subp. 11. Practical. "Practical" means technically
- 10 feasible, available within the general area where the material
- 11 to be burned is located, and available at a cost that is not
- 12 prohibitive for most users.
- 13 Subp. 10 12. Solid waste. "Solid waste" has the meaning
- 14 given it in Minnesota Statutes, section 116.06, subdivision 10.
- 15 7005.0715 OPEN BURNING RESTRICTIONS.
- 16 Subpart 1. Open burning without a permit. Except as
- 17 provided in parts 7005.0785 and 7005.0795, open burning without
- 18 a an agency permit is allowed only on unincorporated land in
- 19 attainment areas, and only if the owner or operator conducts the
- 20 burning for the purposes described in subpart 3, according to
- 21 the conditions in subpart 4, parts 7005.0725, 7005.0775, and
- 22 7005.0805, and prior notice has been given to the local
- 23 authority.
- Subp. 2. Open burning with a permit. Owners or operators
- 25 of permanent tree and brush open burning sites must obtain
- 26 permits under part 7005.0735, and are subject to the
- 27 requirements of subpart 4 and parts 7005.0725, 7005.0735,
- 28 7005.0745, 7005.0755, 7005.0775, 7005.0805, and 7005.0815.
- 29 Owners or operators who conduct open burning for the instruction
- 30 and training of firefighters must obtain permits under part
- 31 7005.0735, and are subject to the requirements of part
- 32 7005.0725, except as otherwise provided in the permit issued by
- 33 the commissioner, and parts 7005.0735, 7005.0745, 7005.0755,
- 34 7005.0766, 7005.0775, and 7005.0805. Owners or operators who
- 35 conduct, cause, or permit open burning on incorporated land or

- 1 in a nonattainment area must obtain permits under part
- 2 7005.0735, and are subject to the requirements of subpart 3 and
- 3 parts 7005.0725, 7005.0735, 7005.0745, 7005.0755, and
- 4 7005.0805. Owners or operators who conduct, cause, or permit
- 5 open burning in forest areas or on forest land as defined in
- 6 Minnesota Statutes, section 88.01, subdivisions 6 and 7, must
- 7 obtain permits from the Minnesota Department of Natural
- 8 Resources if a permit is required by Minnesota Statutes,
- 9 sections 88.16 and 88.17.
- 10 Subp. 3. Purposes for burning. Open burning is allowed if
- 11 conducted for the following purposes:
- 12 A. elimination of fire or health hazards that cannot
- 13 be abated by any other practical means;
- B. disposal of vegetative matter for purposes of
- 15 managing forests, prairies, or wildlife habitats;
- 16 C. ground thawing for utility repair and
- 17 construction;
- D. disposal of trees, brush, grass, and other
- 19 vegetative matter in the development and maintenance of land and
- 20 rights-of-way where chipping, composting, or other alternative
- 21 methods are not practical;
- 22 E. activities-in-accordance-with-Department-of
- 23 Agriculture-practices consistent with Minnesota Statutes,
- 24 section 18.024, the disposal of diseased shade trees as
- 25 described in parts 1505.0230 and 1505.03207-and-Minnesota
- 26 Statutes,-section-19.56; or
- 27 F. disposal of diseased or infested nursery stock,
- 28 diseased bee hives under Minnesota Statutes, section 19.56, or
- 29 dunnage as required under part 1505.1430; or
- 30 G. the disposal of burnable building material such as
- 31 unpainted or untreated lumber, wood shakes, or other unpainted
- 32 or untreated wood products generated by construction,
- 33 where recycling, reuse, chipping, or other alternative disposal
- 34 methods are not practical.
- 35 Subp. 4. Conditions. Open burning must be conducted
- 36 according to the requirements in items A to \pm J.

- 1 A. The prevailing wind at the time of the burning
- 2 must be away from nearby residences and occupied buildings.
- 3 Wind-speed-must-not-exceed-15-miles-per-hour.
- B. The burning must be conducted at-least-3θθ-feet
- 5 from-a-highway-or-public-road as far away from a road as
- 6 possible and controlled so that a traffic hazard is not created.
- 7 C. The burning must not be located-within-600-feet-of
- 8 an-occupied-building-or-residence-other-than-those-located-on
- 9 the-property-on-which-the-burning-is-conducted-unless-written
- 10 permission-is-obtained-from-those-occupants-within-the-600-feet
- 11 conducted consistent with article 11.101(b) of the Minnesota
- 12 Uniform Fire Code as adopted in part 7510.3120.
- D. The burning must not be conducted within one mile
- 14 of an airport or landing strip unless the affected airport or
- 15 landing strip is notified prior to burning.
- 16 E. The burning must not be conducted during the
- 17 duration of an agency-declared air pollution episode alert,
- 18 warning, emergency, or significant harm episode as outlined in
- 19 parts 7005.2950 to 7005.3006; Minnesota Statutes, section
- 20 116.11; Code of Federal Regulations, title 40, part 51, subpart
- 21 H; or Code of Federal Regulations, title 40, section 52.1220
- 22 (c)(1).
- F. The person conducting the open burning shall give
- 24 notice to the local authority and to the local Department of
- 25 Natural Resources representative and-the-local-authority when
- 26 within an area under Department of Natural Resources
- 27 jurisdiction prior to any open burning. The notice must include
- 28 the time and location of the fire.
- 29 G. Propane gas torches or other clean gas burning
- 30 devices causing minimal pollution must be used to start the
- 31 burning.
- 32 H. The person conducting the open burning must be
- 33 present at the burn site from the commencement of the burning
- 34 until the fire is completely extinguished and if a permit is
- 35 required shall have a copy of the permit at the burning site at
- 36 all times.

- I. Fires must not be allowed to smolder with no flame
- 2 present, except when conducted for the purpose of managing
- 3 forests, prairies, or wildlife habitats.
- J. Fires set or allowed to burn for the purpose of
- 5 managing forests, prairies, or wildlife habitats must be managed
- 6 according to a prescribed burn plan approved by the managing
- 7 agency.
- 8 7005.0725 OPEN BURNING PROHIBITIONS.
- 9 Subpart 1. Prohibited materials. No person shall conduct,
- 10 cause, or permit open burning of oils, rubber, plastics,
- 11 chemically treated materials, or other materials which produce
- 12 excessive or noxious smoke such as tires, railroad ties,
- 13 chemically treated lumber, composite shingles, tar paper,
- 14 insulation, composition board, sheetrock, wiring, paint, or
- 15 paint filters.
- 16 Subp. 2. Hazardous wastes. No person shall conduct,
- 17 cause, or permit open burning of hazardous waste as classified
- 18 in chapter 7045 and Minnesota Statutes, section 116.06,
- 19 subdivision 13, except as specifically provided in part
- 20 7045.0542, subpart 9.
- 21 Subp. 3. Industrial solid waste. No person shall conduct,
- 22 cause, or permit open burning of solid waste generated from an
- 23 industrial or manufacturing process or from a service or
- 24 commercial establishment.
- 25 Subp. 4. Demolition debris. No person shall conduct,
- 26 cause, or permit open burning of burnable building material
- 27 generated from demolition of commercial or institutional
- 28 structures. A farm building is not a commercial structure.
- 29 Subp. 5. Salvage operations. No person shall conduct,
- 30 cause, or permit salvage operations by open burning.
- 31 Subp. 6. Motor vehicles. No person shall conduct, cause,
- 32 or permit the processing of motor vehicles or-scrap-metals by
- 33 open burning.
- 34 Subp. 7. Garbage. No person shall conduct, cause, or
- 35 permit open burning of discarded material resulting from the

- 1 handling, processing, storage, preparation, serving, or
- 2 consumption of food, unless specifically allowed under part
- 3 7005.0795.
- 4 Subp. 8. Burning ban. No person shall conduct, cause, or
- 5 permit open burning during a burning ban put into effect by a
- 6 local authority, county, or a state agency.
- 7 7005.0735 PERMITS REQUIRED.
- 8 Subpart 1. Permits required. No person shall conduct,
- 9 cause, or permit open burning on incorporated land or in a
- 10 nonattainment area without obtaining an open burning permit from
- 11 the commissioner or a delegated authority under part 7005.0767.
- 12 No person shall conduct, cause, or permit open burning at a
- 13 permanent tree and brush open burning site as described in part
- 14 7005.0815 or for instruction and training of firefighters as
- 15 described in part 7005.0766 without obtaining an open burning
- 16 permit from the commissioner.
- 17 Subp. 2. Permit conditions. The commissioner or delegated
- 18 authority shall issue an open burning permit if the commissioner
- 19 or delegated authority finds that the burning is for one of the
- 20 purposes in part 7005.0715, subpart 3, 7005.0766, or 7005.0815,
- 21 and that the burning will be conducted according to the
- 22 requirements of parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815. The commissioner
- 23 or delegated authority may impose other reasonable conditions in
- 24 the permit on the conduct of the open burning if needed for the
- 25 prevention of pollution or nuisance conditions. The burning
- 26 shall be conducted during the dates established in the permit
- 27 and conducted under the conditions of the permit.
- Subp. 3. Application process. In areas where there is no
- 29 delegated authority, the applicant shall obtain a permit
- 30 application from the commissioner. After completing the
- 31 application, the applicant shall submit the application to the
- 32 local authority for its approval. Following the local authority
- 33 approval, the application shall be submitted to the commissioner
- 34 for a decision whether to issue a permit.
- In areas where there is a delegated authority, the

- 1 applicant shall obtain a permit application from the delegated
- 2 authority. After completing the application, the applicant
- 3 shall submit the application to the local authority for its
- 4 approval. Following the local authority approval, the
- 5 application shall be submitted to the delegated authority for a
- 6 decision whether to issue a permit.
- 7 The application process for permanent tree and brush open
- 8 burning sites is described in part 7005.0815, subparts 7 and 8.
- 9 To obtain a permit for fire training, an application must
- 10 be submitted by the fire department or other entity seeking to
- 11 conduct fire training directly to the commissioner by May 15 of
- 12 each year. The application must describe the fire department's
- 13 or other entity's annual training plans and identify the
- 14 <u>estimated number of structures that will need</u> to be burned for
- 15 training purposes.
- 16 Subp. 4. Information requests. The commissioner or
- 17 delegated authority may request, and the applicant shall
- 18 provide, any information additional to that required in the
- 19 application form which the commissioner or delegated authority
- 20 needs to determine if the open burning can be conducted in
- 21 compliance with all-applicable-rules parts 7005.0705 to
- 22 7005.0815.
- 23 Subp. 5. Permittees. The permit application must be
- 24 signed by all owners and operators, and the commissioner or
- 25 delegated authority shall designate all owners and operators as
- 26 copermittees when issuing the permit.
- 27 7005.0745 PERMIT DENIAL.
- The commissioner shall deny a permit application submitted
- 29 pursuant to parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815 if:
- 30 A. a reasonable, practical alternative method of
- 31 disposal of the material is available, such as chipping, or
- 32 composting, or other-method;
- 33 B. the burning cannot be conducted according to the
- 34 conditions established in parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815; or
- 35 C. a nuisance condition would result from the burning.

- 1 7005.0755 PERMIT REVOCATION.
- A permit is subject to revocation by the commissioner, if:
- A. a reasonable, practical method of disposal of the
- 4 material is found;
- 5 B. a fire hazard exists or develops during the course
- 6 of the burning;
- 7 C. the permittee violates parts 7005.0705 to
- 8 7005.0815; or
- 9 D. any of the conditions of the permit are violated;
- 10 or
- E. a nuisance condition has resulted from the burning.
- 12 7005.0765 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES JURISDICTION.
- Designated Department of Natural Resources forest officers
- 14 or fire wardens are authorized to accept applications and issue,
- 15 deny, enforce, and revoke open burning permits on behalf of the
- 16 commissioner for locations within their jurisdiction.
- 17 7005.0766 FIRE TRAINING.
- 18 Subpart 1. Structure burn training. Except for owners or
- 19 operators conducting fire training in specialized industrial
- 20 settings pursuant to applicable federal, state, or local
- 21 standards, owners or operators conducting open burning for the
- 22 purpose of instruction and training of firefighters with regard
- 23 to structures must follow the techniques described in Structural
- 24 Burn Training Procedures for the Minnesota Technical College
- 25 System used-in-the-training-of-firefighting-personnel-at
- 26 Minnesota-vocational-technical-colleges-or-other-qualified
- 27 training-facilities. This document is written and published by
- 28 the Regional State Fire Training Coordinator Staff, June 1987,
- 29 and is incorporated by reference. It is not subject to frequent
- 30 change. This publication is available at the Minnesota State
- 31 Law Library and at the Fire Information, Research, and Education
- 32 Center, 550 Cedar Street, Saint Paul, Minnesota 55101.
- 33 Subp. 2. Restrictions. Flammable or combustible liquids
- 34 shall not be burned during fire training unless liquid fuels or

- 1 arson investigation training is being conducted. The use of
- 2 small amounts of uncontaminated diesel fuel or kerosene for
- 3 ignition of live burn fires is not prohibited.
- 4 Subp. 3. Liquid fuels training. Fire training shall be
- 5 conducted according to the conditions in items A to C when
- 6 liquid fuels are burned.
- 7 A. The fuel must be completely contained within a
- 8 lined structure, such as a cement- or metal-lined container.
- 9 B. The amount of fuel to be burned must be the
- 10 minimum amount necessary to conduct the training.
- 11 C. If fuel is released from the lined structure, or
- 12 if soil or groundwater contamination is suspected to have
- 13 resulted from the burn, the spill must be reported and recovered
- 14 as required under Minnesota Statutes, section 115.061.
- Subp. 4. Conditions. Fire training must be conducted
- 16 according to parts 7005.0715, subpart 4, items E to H, and
- 17 7005.0725, except as specifically authorized by the permit
- 18 issued by the commissioner.
- 19 7005.0767 DELEGATED AUTHORITY.
- 20 Subpart 1. Delegated authority to issue permits. A town
- 21 or home rule charter or statutory city or metropolitan county
- 22 may issue permits for open burning other than for fire training
- 23 or permanent tree and brush burning conducted according to parts
- 24 7005.0705 to 7005.0805, if delegated authority is obtained as
- 25 provided in subpart 2. Permits must be issued on a form
- 26 approved by the commissioner and records must be maintained of
- 27 all open burning permits issued.
- Subp. 2. Obtaining authority. To obtain authority to
- 29 issue open burning permits, a town or home rule charter or
- 30 statutory city or metropolitan county must adopt parts 7005.0705
- 31 to 7005.0805 as a local ordinance governing open burning. After
- 32 adopting this ordinance, the town or home rule charter or
- 33 statutory city or metropolitan county must submit the following
- 34 to the commissioner:
- 35 A. a written statement requesting the authorization;

- B. the name of the person or persons authorized to
- 2 issue the permits on behalf of the town or home rule charter or
- 3 statutory city or metropolitan county and a certified copy of
- 4 the motion passed by the town or home rule charter or statutory
- 5 city or metropolitan county designating such person or persons;
- 6 and
- 7 C. a copy of the local ordinance adopting parts
- 8 7005.0705 to 7005.0805.
- 9 Subp. 3. Revocation of delegated authority. The
- 10 commissioner shall revoke the authority to issue open burning
- ll permits if:
- A. permits are issued in violation of parts 7005.0705
- 13 to 7005.0805;
- B. permits are issued on forms that have not been
- 15 approved by the commissioner;
- 16 C. permits are issued by persons who have not been
- 17 authorized by the delegated authority or whose names have not
- 18 been provided to the commissioner;
- D. the delegated authority fails to maintain records
- 20 of open burning permits issued; or
- 21 E. the delegated authority requests removal of the
- 22 authority.
- 23 7005.0775 COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.
- Open burning must be conducted according to parts 7005.0705
- 25 to 7005.0815, local ordinances, state fire marshal rules, and
- 26 statutes and rules of other state agencies, regardless of
- 27 whether a permit is required by parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815.
- 28 Nothing in parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815 shall be construed to
- 29 allow open burning in those areas in which open burning is
- 30 prohibited by other laws, rules, regulations, or ordinances
- 31 which are more restrictive.
- 32 7005.0785 RECREATIONAL FIRES.
- Fires set for recreational, ceremonial, food preparation,
- 34 or social purposes are allowed and do not require an agency
- 35 permit. Fires The material to be burned must be limited to a

- 1 pile no larger than three feet in diameter by three feet high.
- 2 Only unpainted and untreated wood, coal, or charcoal may be
- 3 burned.
- 4 7005.0795 OPEN BURNING ON FARMS.
- 5 A person who operates land used for farming may burn solid
- 6 waste generated from the person's household or as part of the
- 7 person's farming operation without an agency permit, as provided
- 8 by Minnesota Statutes, section 17.135. The burning of the solid
- 9 waste must comply with the conditions established in part
- 10 7005.0715, subpart 4, the prohibitions established in part
- 11 7005.0725, and the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, section
- 12 17.135.
- 13 7005.0796 OPEN BURNING OF LEAVES.
- A town or home rule charter or statutory city located
- 15 outside the metropolitan area as defined in Minnesota Statutes,
- 16 section 473.121, subdivision 2, by adoption of an ordinance, may
- 17 permit open burning of dried leaves within the boundaries of the
- 18 town or city, as provided by Minnesota Statutes, section
- 19 116.082. The burning of dried leaves must comply with the
- 20 conditions established in parts 7005.0715, subpart 4, 7005.0725,
- 21 7005.0775, and 7005.0805.
- 22 7005.0805 LIABILITY.
- The granting of an open burning permit or allowance of open
- 24 burning without a permit under any provisions of parts 7005.0705
- 25 to 7005.0815 does not excuse a person from consequences,
- 26 damages, or injuries which may result from the open burning.
- 27 7005.0815 PERMANENT TREE AND BRUSH OPEN BURNING SITES.
- 28 Subpart 1. Permanent sites. The commissioner shall issue
- 29 permits authorizing continuous use of a site for open burning
- 30 following the procedures and subject to the conditions
- 31 established in this part and parts 7005.0725, 7005.0735,
- 32 7005.0745, 7005.0755, and 7005.0805.
- 33 Subp. 2. Tree and brush burning only. Only trees, tree
- 34 trimmings, or brush shall be permitted to be burned at a

- 1 permanent open burning site.
- Subp. 3. Alternatives to burning. Only trees, tree
- 3 trimmings, or brush that cannot be disposed of by an alternative
- 4 method such as chipping, composting, or other method, shall be
- 5 permitted to be burned at a permanent open burning site.
- 6 Subp. 4. Location. A permanent open burning site must not
- 7 be located within:
- 8 A. 1,000 feet of an occupied building unless written
- 9 permission is obtained from the building owner and occupant;
- B. 1,000 feet of a public roadway;
- 11 C. one mile of an airport or landing strip unless
- 12 written permission is obtained from the affected airport or
- 13 landing strip;
- D. 300 feet of a stream, river, lake, or other water
- 15 body unless berms or other measures are used to ensure that ash
- 16 or organic material does not enter the water body; or
- E. a wetland as defined in part 7035.0300, subpart
- 18 119.
- 19 Subp. 5. Site operation. A permanent open burning site
- 20 must be developed and operated according to items A to J.
- 21 A. A qualified attendant must be on duty at all times
- 22 when the site is open for disposal of material to be burned and
- 23 for the duration of any fire on the site.
- B. Access to the site must be controlled through a
- 25 gate that is locked when the attendant is not on duty.
- 26 C. A permanent sign indicating the times of
- 27 operation, rates, the penalty for nonconforming dumping, and
- 28 other pertinent information of use to the public must be posted
- 29 at the site entrance.
- 30 D. Burning and ash storage areas must be designated
- 31 and maintained.
- 32 E. Surface water drainage must be diverted around and
- 33 away from the burning and ash storage areas.
- 34 F. Burning must be conducted according to the
- 35 conditions in part 7005.0715, subpart 4, items A to E and G.
- 36 G. Twenty-four-hour Prior notice must be given to the

- 1 local authority of the time and duration of each burn.
- 2 H. Fugitive ash emissions must be controlled and ash
- 3 residue must be collected periodically and disposed of in a
- 4 permitted sanitary-landfill solid waste land disposal facility
- 5 or other method allowed by applicable statutes and rules.
- 6 I. The fire must not be allowed to smolder with no
- 7 flame present.
- J. Fugitive dust emissions from access roads and the
- 9 site must be controlled as required by part 7005.0550.
- 10 Subp. 6. Site termination. A permanent open burning site
- 11 must be terminated in compliance with items A to D.
- 12 A. All unburned materials must be removed and
- 13 disposed of in-an-appropriate-manner through burning at another
- 14 permitted burnsite or by other method allowed by applicable
- 15 statutes, rules, and ordinances.
- B. All ash must be removed to a permitted sanitary
- 17 landfill-or solid waste land disposal facility or disposed of by
- 18 other method allowed by applicable statutes, rules, and
- 19 rules ordinances.
- C. Areas affected by burning must be covered with
- 21 soil and seeded to prevent erosion and to restore the site to a
- 22 natural condition.
- D. A sign must be posted informing the public that
- 24 the site has been closed, and listing the closest disposal site
- 25 alternative.
- Subp. 7. Application process. Applicants for a permanent
- 27 open burning site permit shall submit a complete application on
- 28 a form provided by the commissioner. This application must be
- 29 submitted at least 90 days before the date of the proposed
- 30 operation of the permanent open burning site. The application
- 31 must be submitted to the commissioner and must contain:
- 32 A. the name, address, and telephone number of all
- 33 owners of the site proposed for use as the permanent open
- 34 burning site;
- 35 B. if the operator for the proposed permanent open
- 36 burning site is different from the owner, the name, address, and

- 1 telephone number of the operator;
- 2 C. a general description of the materials to be
- 3 burned, including the source and estimated quantity;
- D. a topographic or similarly detailed map of the
- 5 site and surrounding area within a one mile circumference
- 6 showing all structures that might be affected by the operation
- 7 of the site; and
- 8 E. any other information relevant to the operation of
- 9 the site, or as requested by the commissioner to determine if
- 10 the site can be operated in compliance with all-applicable-rules
- 11 parts 7005.0705 to 7005.0815.
- 12 Subp. 8. Permittees. The permit application must be
- 13 signed by all owners and operators of the proposed permanent
- 14 open burning site, and the commissioner shall designate all
- 15 owners and operators as copermittees when issuing the permit.
- 16 INSTRUCTION TO REVISOR. In the next edition of Minnesota Rules,
- 17 the revisor shall change the reference from "parts 7005.0700 to
