- 7 RECYCLABLE MATERIAL MARKET DEVELOPMENT 8 GRANT AND LOAN PROGRAMS
- 9 9210.0600 SCOPE AND AUTHORITY.
- Parts 9210.0600 to 9210.0645 implement the recyclable
- 11 material market development grant and loan programs created and
- 12 described under Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.48, by
- 13 establishing the substantive criteria and procedural conditions
- 14 under which the director may award grants or loans for
- 15 recyclable material market development projects.
- 16 9210.0610 DEFINITIONS.
- 17 Subpart 1. Scope. The terms defined in this part apply to
- 18 parts 9210.0600 to 9210.0645. For terms not defined in this
- 19 part, the definitions in Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.03,
- 20 apply, unless the context requires otherwise.
- 21 Subp. 2. Director. "Director" means the director of the
- 22 Office of Waste Management.
- 23 Subpr-3--Highest-end-user--"Highest-end-use"-means-the
- 24 remanufacture-or-transformation-of-a-recyclable-material-into-a
- 25 product-most-similar-to-the-product-from-which-the-recyclable
- 26 material-was-derived:
- 27 Subp. 4. 3. Office. "Office" means the Minnesota Office
- 28 of Waste Management established in Minnesota Statutes, section
- 29 115A.055.
- 30 Subp. 5. 4. Postconsumer material. "Postconsumer material"
- 31 means material generated by a business or a consumer that has
- 32 served its intended end use and has been separated from solid
- 33 waste for collection and recycling.
- 34 Subp. 6. 5. Preconsumer material. "Preconsumer material"
- 35 means material generated after completion of a manufacturing

- l process that has not been used by a final consumer and would
- 2 normally be disposed of as solid waste. This definition does
- 3 not include postconsumer material or residual material generated
- 4 during a manufacturing process that is commonly reused by the
- 5 generator.
- 6 Subp. 7. 6. Project. "Project" means all components of an
- 7 organized undertaking described in a proposal.
- 8 Subp. 8. 7. Recipient. "Recipient" means an applicant
- 9 selected by the director to receive a grant or loan under parts
- 10 9210.0600 to 9210.0645.
- 11 Subp. 9. 8. Recyclable material. "Recyclable material"
- 12 means preconsumer or postconsumer material that can presently be
- 13 recycled or that demonstrates potential to be recycled.
- 14 Refuse-derived fuel or other material that is used as fuel for
- 15 incineration is not a recyclable material.
- 16 Subp. ±θ- 9. Recycled products. "Recycled products" means
- 17 products containing preconsumer or postconsumer material.
- 18 Supp. 11. 10. Research institution. "Research institution"
- 19 means a public or private nonprofit organization whose
- 20 activities include directed research and scientific
- 21 investigations.
- 22 Subp. 12. Solid waste. "Solid waste" has the meaning
- 23 given it in Minnesota Statutes, section 116.06, subdivision 10.
- 24 9210.0615 PURPOSE.
- The short-term objective of the program is to increase the
- 26 demand for and use of recyclable material, thus maximizing land
- 27 disposal abatement. The long-term objective of the program is
- 28 to facilitate the development of recycling activities that
- 29 represent-the-highest-end-use-of-recyclable-material conserve
- 30 resources.
- 31 9210.0620 APPLICATION PROCEDURES.
- 32 Subpart 1. Notification by director. To initiate the
- 33 process for awarding grants and loans for recyclable material
- 34 market development projects, the director shall publish a notice
- 35 in the State Register advising eligible applicants of the

- 1 availability of market development grants and loans. The notice
- 2 shall describe the procedure for awarding grants and loans and
- 3 establish a deadline by which proposals must be submitted. In
- 4 the notice, the director may also limit the types of projects
- 5 for which a grant or loan would be awarded in the funding round
- 6 initiated by the notice and may specify the maximum amount of
- 7 funding to be awarded to a project.
- 8 Subp. 2. Proposals. Following the publication of a notice
- 9 in the State Register, eligible applicants that seek assistance
- 10 must submit proposals to the director. Proposals must be
- ll received by the director by the deadline established in the
- 12 notice. Upon the request of the applicant, the office shall
- 13 handle specific information as nonpublic data pursuant to
- 14 Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.06, subdivision 13.
- 15 A. Proposals for grant assistance under part
- 16 9210.0635 must contain the information set out in part
- 17 9210.0635, subpart 6.
- 18 B. Proposals for grant or loan assistance under part
- 19 9210.0640 must contain the information set out in part
- 20 9210.0640, subpart 7.
- 21 C. Proposals for grant assistance under part
- 22 9210.0645 must contain the information set out in part
- 23 9210.0645, subpart 6.
- Subp. 3. Determination of eligibility and completeness.
- 25 For all proposals received by the director by the deadline
- 26 established in the notice, the director shall determine the
- 27 eligibility of the applicant, the proposed project, and the
- 28 costs identified in the proposal and shall determine the
- 29 completeness of the proposal.
- 30 Subp. 4. Notice of determination of eligibility and
- 31 completeness. The director shall notify the applicant of the
- 32 director's determination of eligibility and completeness of the
- 33 proposal. If the director determines that the applicant or the
- 34 project is ineligible, the director shall reject the proposal
- 35 and notify the applicant. If the director determines that any
- 36 of the project costs are ineligible or that the proposal is

- 1 incomplete, the director shall notify the applicant of the
- 2 ineligible portion of the costs or of the deficiency. The
- 3 applicant has 14 days after receiving the notice to correct any
- 4 inadequacies identified by the director. Extensions shall be
- 5 granted if requested in a timely manner and good cause exists
- 6 for the extension. If the inadequacies are not corrected within
- 7 the time allowed, the proposal shall be rejected.
- 8 Subp. 5. Evaluation of proposal. The director shall
- 9 evaluate each proposal that is determined to be eligible and
- 10 complete according to items A to C.
- 11 A. Proposals for grant assistance under part
- 12 9210.0635 shall be evaluated using the criteria set out in part
- 13 9210.0635, subpart 7.
- B. Proposals for grant or loan assistance under part
- 15 9210.0640 shall be evaluated using the criteria set out in part
- 16 9210.0640, subpart 8.
- 17 C. Proposals for grant assistance under part
- 18 9210.0645 shall be evaluated using the criteria set out in part
- 19 9210.0645, subpart 7.
- 20 Subp. 6. Award of grants or loans. The director shall
- 21 award grants or loans for those projects that the director
- 22 determines will be the most beneficial in facilitating the
- 23 development of markets for recyclable material and recycled
- 24 products. The director shall notify those applicants that do
- 25 not receive grant or loan awards. An applicant that does not
- 26 receive an award may resubmit a proposal upon future notice by
- 27 the director under subpart 1.
- Subp. 7. No grant or loan awards. If the director
- 29 determines that no proposal will provide sufficient assistance
- 30 to the state in achieving its market development goals, the
- 31 director may decide not to award any grant or loan. The
- 32 director may then reinitiate the process for awarding grants and
- 33 loans by publishing a notice under subpart 1.
- 34 Subp. 8. Consultation. In the director's evaluation of a
- 35 proposal, the director shall solicit and consider any
- 36 recommendations provided by the Market Development Coordinating

- 1 Council established in Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.12,
- 2 subdivision 1, paragraph (d).
- 3 9210.0625 LIMITATIONS.
- 4 Subpart 1. Reduced grant or loan awards. The director
- 5 shall ask an applicant to document the impacts of reduced
- 6 financial assistance before finalizing an award for less than
- 7 the eligible amount requested by an applicant or less than the
- 8 maximum award established in the notice under part 9210.0620,
- 9 subpart 1. Reduced funds shall be awarded where the director
- 10 determines:
- 11 A. program resources are insufficient to provide full
- 12 assistance to all applicants to which the director intends to
- 13 award grants or loans; or
- B. the applicant could operate the project at a
- 15 reduced level and still achieve project objectives.
- Subp. 2. Limitations on disbursal of funds. No grant or
- 17 loan funds shall be disbursed until the director has:
- A. determined the total estimated cost of the
- 19 project;
- 20 B. ascertained that financing of the project cost is
- 21 assured by the recipient;
- 22 C. received commitments from the recipient to
- 23 implement the project; and
- D. executed a written grant or loan agreement with
- 25 the recipient and, if applicable, the recipient has submitted
- 26 final design plans for projects under the Capital Grant and Loan
- 27 Program in part 9210.0640.
- 28 9210.0630 GRANT AND LOAN AGREEMENTS.
- A grant or loan agreement shall:
- A. incorporate by reference the proposal submitted to
- 31 the director;
- 32 B. provide that any cost overruns incurred in the
- 33 development and implementation of the proposed project shall be
- 34 the sole responsibility of the recipient;
- 35 C. require that the recipient provide periodic

- l written reports to the director on the implementation and
- 2 results of the project;
- 3 D. identify the interest rate and repayment
- 4 obligations for a loan recipient;
- 5 E. authorize the director to rescind the grant and
- 6 require the grant recipient to repay the grant in full if the
- 7 director determines that, due to the bad faith of the grant
- 8 recipient, a project has not been developed and implemented in
- 9 accordance with the terms and conditions of the grant agreement;
- 10 F. authorize the director to determine that the loan
- ll recipient is in default and require the loan recipient to
- 12 immediately repay the loan in full if the director determines
- 13 that, due to the bad faith of the loan recipient, a project has
- 14 not been developed and implemented in accordance with the terms
- 15 and conditions of the loan agreement;
- 16 G. authorize the director to cease making further
- 17 disbursements to the recipient and to recover unspent funds if
- 18 the director determines that, for reasons other than bad faith,
- 19 a project has not been developed and implemented in accordance
- 20 with the terms and conditions of the grant or loan agreement and
- 21 amendment to the agreement is not justified;
- 22 H. require that the recipient perform and complete
- 23 project activities in accordance with the work schedule in the
- 24 proposal submitted to the director and incorporated into the
- 25 grant or loan agreement;
- I. require that the recipient maintain detailed
- 27 records of all expenditures related to the agreement; and
- J. establish other conditions or terms needed to
- 29 manage or implement the grant or loan agreement.
- 30 9210.0635 COUNTY GRANT PROGRAM.
- 31 Subpart 1. Scope. This part establishes the conditions
- 32 under which the director shall award recyclable material market
- 33 development program grants to counties.
- 34 Subp. 2. Eligible applicants. Eligible applicants are
- 35 counties that have submitted plans under Minnesota Statutes,

- 1 section 115A.551, subdivision 6, as amendments to their approved
- 2 comprehensive solid waste management plans or solid waste master
- 3 plans. Eligible counties may apply for funds on behalf of any
- 4 person, but named recipients shall be the counties.
- 5 Subp. 3. Eligible projects. Eligible projects are
- 6 projects in Minnesota that enhance the quality of the supply of
- 7 recyclable materials, create or expand the capacity to use
- 8 recyclable materials in a manufacturing process, or increase the
- 9 demand for recycled products.
- 10 Subp. 4. Eligible costs. Eligible costs are limited to 25
- 11 percent of the capital costs of the project and 75 percent of
- 12 other project costs.
- Subp. 5. Maximum grant. The maximum grant award is
- 14 \$100,000, unless the notice provided by the director under part
- 15 9210.0620, subpart 1, establishes a lesser maximum grant.
- 16 Subp. 6. Proposal. An eligible applicant shall submit a
- 17 proposal in the form specified by the director. A proposal must
- 18 include the following information:
- 19 A. the names, qualifications, and addresses of the
- 20 applicant and other project participants, including other
- 21 counties participating in the proposed project;
- B. a description of the proposed project, including:
- 23 (1) a description of project activities and an
- 24 implementation schedule;
- 25 (2) location of the project;
- 26 (3) type, quantity, and source of recyclable
- 27 material and recycled products relevant to the project; and
- 28 (4) current status of the project;
- 29 C. information demonstrating that the project will
- 30 comply with applicable regulations, including a list of permits
- 31 required for the project;
- D. an itemized description of the project costs,
- 33 including the total estimated cost, total grant eligible cost,
- 34 and the amount of grant funding requested;
- 35 E. an itemized description of project financing,
- 36 including applicant contributions, other government

- 1 contributions, private contributions, and, if applicable, any
- 2 projected revenues from the project;
- F. information demonstrating, where applicable, the
- 4 technical feasibility of the project, including preliminary
- 5 design and engineering plans;
- 6 G. information demonstrating, where applicable, how
- 7 the applicant will secure the supply of and demand for
- 8 recyclable material and recycled products; and
- 9 H. a resolution from each county participating in the
- 10 project that demonstrates that, if a grant is awarded, it will
- 11 implement the project, provide necessary local financing, and
- 12 accept and exercise the governmental powers necessary to develop
- 13 and operate the project.
- 14 The director may request additional information from the
- 15 applicant if it is necessary to clarify and evaluate the
- 16 proposal.
- 17 Subp. 7. Evaluation of proposals. The director shall
- 18 evaluate each proposal that is determined to be eligible and
- 19 complete. The director shall base this evaluation on the
- 20 following factors:
- 21 A. the technical and economic feasibility of the
- 22 proposed project;
- B. the applicant's ability and intention to implement
- 24 the proposed project in a timely manner upon receipt of a grant
- 25 award;
- C. the proposed project's compliance with federal,
- 27 state, and local regulations;
- D. the consistency of the proposed project with state
- 29 market development priorities;
- 30 E. the extent to which the proposed project would
- 31 benefit the market development efforts of more than one county;
- F. the extent to which the applicant has achieved
- 33 significant land disposal abatement through source separation of
- 34 recyclable materials;
- 35 G. the-extent-to-which-the-proposed-project
- 36 represents-the-highest-end-use-for-each-recyclable-material;

- 1 Hr the extent to which the proposed project would use
- 2 postconsumer material; and
- 3 # H. the extent to which the proposed project
- 4 provides information transferable to other persons throughout
- 5 the state.
- 6 9210.0640 CAPITAL GRANT AND LOAN PROGRAM.
- 7 Subpart 1. Scope. This part establishes the conditions
- 8 under which the director shall award recyclable material market
- 9 development program grants and loans for capital investment
- 10 projects.
- 11 Subp. 2. Eligible applicants. Eligible applicants are
- 12 private organizations.
- Subp. 3. Eligible projects. Eligible projects are
- 14 projects in Minnesota that create or expand capacity to use
- 15 recyclable materials as a feedstock in a manufacturing process
- 16 or to transform recyclable materials into other usable products.
- 17 Subp. 4. Eligible costs. Eligible costs are limited to
- 18 the capital costs of the proposed project.
- 19 Subp. 5. Maximum grant. A project may receive a grant for
- 20 up to 25 percent of the total eligible costs of the project or
- 21 \$500,000, whichever is less, unless the notice provided by the
- 22 director under part 9210.0620, subpart 1, establishes a lesser
- 23 maximum grant.
- Subp. 6. Maximum loan. A project may receive a loan for
- 25 up to 50 percent of the total eligible costs of the project or
- 26 \$2,000,000, whichever is less, unless the notice provided by the
- 27 director under part 9210.0620, subpart 1, establishes a lesser
- 28 maximum loan.
- 29 Subp. 7. Proposal. An eligible applicant shall submit a
- 30 proposal in the form specified by the director. A proposal must
- 31 include the following information:
- 32 A. the names, qualifications, and addresses of the
- 33 applicant and other project participants;
- B. a description of the proposed project, including:
- 35 (1) a list of project activities and an

- implementation schedule; 2 (2) location of the project; 3 (3) type, quantity, and source of recyclable material and recycled products relevant to the project; and 4 5 (4) current status of the project; 6 information demonstrating that the project will comply with applicable regulations, including a list of permits 7 required for the project; 8 9 D. a financial report, including: 10 a five-year business plan; 11 (2) an itemized description of the project costs, 12 including the total estimated cost, total eligible cost, and the amount of grant or loan funding requested; 13 14 (3) an itemized description of project financing, 15 including applicant contributions, other government contributions, private contributions, and projected revenues 16 17 from the project; 18 (4) a credit history of the organization; and 19 (5) financial statements for the last three 20 years; 21 E. information demonstrating the technical feasibility of the project, including preliminary design and 22 23 engineering plans, if applicable; and 24 a market analysis for the proposed project, 25 including information demonstrating that the applicant has secured the supply of and demand for recyclable material and 26 recycled products necessary for sustained market development. 27 The director may request additional information from the 28 29 applicant if it is necessary to clarify and evaluate the proposal. 30 Subp. 8. Evaluation of proposals. The director shall

- 32 evaluate each proposal that is determined to be eligible and
- complete. The director shall base this evaluation on the 33
- following factors: 34
- A. the technical and economic feasibility of the 35

- B. the applicant's financial capacity and managerial
- 2 ability, and the applicant's intention to implement the project
- 3 in a timely manner upon receipt of a grant or loan award;
- 4 C. the proposed project's compliance with federal,
- 5 state, and local regulations;
- D. the consistency of the proposed project with state
- 7 market development priorities; and
- 8 E. the-extent-to-which-the-proposed-project
- 9 represents-the-highest-end-use-for-each-recyclable-material; and
- 10 Fr the extent to which the proposed project would use
- 11 postconsumer material.
- 12 9210.0645 DIRECTED RESEARCH AND FEASIBILITY STUDY GRANT PROGRAM.
- 13 Subpart 1. Scope. This part establishes the conditions
- 14 under which the director shall award recyclable material market
- 15 development program grants for directed research and feasibility
- 16 study projects.
- 17 Subp. 2. Eligible applicants. Eligible applicants are
- 18 research institutions and private organizations.
- 19 Subp. 3. Eligible projects. Eligible projects are limited
- 20 to the following:
- 21 A. development of performance data on recycled
- 22 products that are or could be manufactured in Minnesota;
- B. feasibility studies for the development of
- 24 manufacturing capacity to use recyclable materials from
- 25 Minnesota as a feedstock; and
- 26 C. directed research on products that could be
- 27 manufactured using recyclable materials from Minnesota as a
- 28 feedstock or on manufacturing processes that could use
- 29 recyclable materials from Minnesota as a feedstock.
- 30 Subp. 4. Eligible costs. Eligible costs for research
- 31 institutions are limited to 100 percent of the project costs,
- 32 including labor and supplies necessary to implement the
- 33 project. Eligible costs for private organizations are limited
- 34 to 50 percent of the project costs, including labor and supplies
- 35 necessary to implement the project.

- 1 Subp. 5. Maximum grant. The maximum grant award is
- 2 \$100,000, unless the notice provided by the director under part
- 3 9210.0620, subpart 1, establishes a lesser maximum grant.
- 4 Subp. 6. Proposal. An eligible applicant shall submit a
- 5 proposal in the form specified by the director. A proposal must
- 6 include the following information:
- 7 A. the names, qualifications, and addresses of the
- 8 applicant and other project participants;
- 9 B. a description of the proposed project, including:
- 10 (1) a list of project activities and an
- 11 implementation schedule;
- 12 (2) location of the project;
- 13 (3) type, quantity, and source of recyclable
- 14 material and recycled products relevant to the project; and
- 15 (4) description or identification of persons that
- 16 may benefit from project activities and results;
- 17 C. the projected economic viability of implementing
- 18 project results;
- D. an itemized description of the project costs,
- 20 including the total estimated cost, total grant eligible cost,
- 21 and the amount of grant funding requested; and
- 22 E. an itemized description of the project financing,
- 23 including applicant contributions, other government
- 24 contributions, and private contributions.
- The director may request additional information from the
- 26 applicant if it is necessary to clarify and evaluate the
- 27 proposal.
- Subp. 7. Evaluation of proposals. The director shall
- 29 evaluate each proposal that is determined to be eligible and
- 30 complete. The director shall base this evaluation on the
- 31 following factors:
- 32 A. the technical and economic feasibility of the
- 33 proposed project;
- 34 B. the applicant's ability and intention to implement
- 35 the project in a timely manner upon receipt of a grant award;
- 36 C. the extent to which the proposed project promotes

- 1 market development activities for recyclable materials and
- 2 recycled products;
- D. the consistency of the proposed project with state
- 4 market development priorities;
- 5 E. the-extent-to-which-the-proposed-project-promotes
- 6 the-highest-end-use-for-each-recyclable-material;
- 7 Fr the extent to which the proposed project promotes
- 8 the use of postconsumer material; and
- 9 G. F. the extent to which the project provides
- 10 information transferable to other organizations and the absence
- 11 of available information in the proposed area of study.
