For terms not defined in this 17 18 part, the definitions in Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.03, apply unless the context states otherwise. 19 Subp. 2. Director. "Director" means the director of the 20 Office of Waste Management. 21 22 Subp. 3. Office. "Office" means the Minnesota Office of 23 Waste Management established in Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.055. 24 25 Subp. 4. Person. "Person" means an individual, 26 partnership, association, public or private organization, or other legal entity, the state, or an agency, department, or 27

political subdivision of the state. 28

29 Subp. 5. Program. "Program" means the Solid Waste Reduction Grant and Loan Program. 30

Subp. 6. Solid waste. "Solid waste" has the meaning given 31. it in Minnesota Statutes, section 116.06, subdivision 10. 32 Subp. 7. Solid waste reduction. "Solid waste reduction" 33 means an activity that prevents the generation of solid waste 34 35 including:

Subp. 8. Useful life. "Useful life" means the length of
time or number of times that a product may be used or reused in

10 9210.0720 APPLICATION PROCEDURES.

Subpart 1. Notification by director. To initiate the 11 process for awarding grants and loans for solid waste reduction 12 projects, the director shall publish a notice in the State 13 Register advising eligible applicants of the availability of 14 solid waste reduction grants and loans. The notice shall 15 describe the maximum amount of funding available for a project, 16 and establish a deadline by which proposals must be submitted. 17 In the notice, the director may also limit the types of projects 18 for which a grant or loan would be awarded in the funding round 19 initiated by the notice. 20

Subp. 2. Proposals. Following the publication of a notice 21 in the State Register, eligible applicants that seek assistance 22 must submit proposals to the director. Proposals must be 23 received by the director by the deadline established in the 24 notice. Upon the request of the applicant, the office shall 25 handle specific information as nonpublic data pursuant to 26 Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.06, subdivision 13; however, 27 all information developed as a result of a grant or loan shall 28 29 be made available to persons through the office's public information program. 30

Determination of eligibility and completeness. Subp. 3. 5 For all proposals received by the director by the deadline 6 established in the notice, the director shall determine the 7 eligibility of the applicant, the proposed project, the costs 8 identified in the proposal, and the completeness of the proposal. 9. Subp. 4. Notice of determination of eligibility and 10 completeness. The director shall notify the applicant of the 11 director's determination of eligibility and completeness of the 12 proposal. If the director determines that the applicant or the 13 project is ineligible, the director shall reject the proposal 14 and notify the applicant. If the director determines that any 15 of the project costs are ineligible or that the proposal is 16 incomplete, the director shall notify the applicant of the 17 ineligible portion of the costs or of the deficiency. The 18 applicant has 14 days after receiving the notice to correct any 19 inadequacies. Extensions shall be granted if requested in a 20 timely manner and good cause exists for the extension. If the 21 inadequacies are not corrected within the time allowed, the 22 proposal shall be rejected. 23

17 9210.0730 LIMITATIONS.

18 Subpart 1. Reduced grant or loan awards. The director 19 shall ask an applicant to document the impacts of reduced 20 financial assistance before awarding funds less than the 21 eligible amount requested by the applicant or less than the 22 maximum award established in the notice under part 9210.0720, 23 subpart 1. Reduced funds shall be awarded where the director 24 determines that:

A. program resources are insufficient to provide full assistance to all applicants to which the director intends to award grants or loans; or

B. the applicant could operate the project at areduced level and still achieve project objectives.

30 Subp. 2. Limitations on disbursal of funds. No grant or 31 loan funds shall be disbursed until the recipient has executed a 32 written grant or loan agreement with the director.

2 9210.0750 PUBLIC INSTITUTION GRANT PROGRAM.

3 Subpart 1. Scope. This part establishes the conditions 4 under which the director shall award solid waste reduction 5 public institution grants.

6 Subp. 2. Eligible applicants. Eligible applicants are political subdivisions and other public entities, including 7 state, county, and local agencies; school districts, 8 universities, and hospitals; and solid waste management 9 districts established under Minnesota Statutes, sections 115A.62 10 11 to 115A.72. An eligible applicant may apply for a grant on behalf of any person who is not an eligible applicant, but the 12 named recipient shall be the eligible applicant. 13

14 Subp. 3. Eligible projects. Eligible projects are 15 projects that study the technical and economic feasibility of 16 solid waste reduction activities or projects that implement 17 solid waste reduction activities. Projects that study or 18 implement composting or recycling are not considered eligible 19 projects.

B. 75 percent of the costs of implementing a waste reduction project, except that only 50 percent of the cost of purchasing and installing equipment are eligible.

The cost of operating or maintaining equipment, or of purchasing or renting real property, are not eligible costs. Regardless of the amount of eligible costs, no grant shall be awarded for an amount that exceeds the maximum established by the notice under part 9210.0720, subpart 1.
