3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Elevator Permit and Fee
4 Requirement

6 Rules as Adopted

7 5226.0100 PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT OR INSTALL ELEVATORS AND
8 ESCALATORS.

9 A person, firm, or corporation that constructs, installs,
10 or performs alterations to elevators or escalators, pursuant to
11 the American Society of Mechanical Engineers/American National
12 Standards Institute A17.1 Safety Code for Elevators and
13 Escalators, shall file an application for a permit with the
14 Department of Labor and Industry, or with a municipality that is
15 authorized by law to issue a permit, before beginning
16 construction, installation, or alteration. The department's
17 fees for a permit to construct or install elevators or
18 escalators are:

19 A. Filing fee (application for permit), \$50; and \$200
20 if the application is received after construction has been
21 initiated.

22 B. Inspection fee; 0.01 (one percent) of the total
23 cost of the project for labor and materials for construction and
24 installation of the elevator or escalator including related
25 electrical and mechanical equipment. The total inspection fee
26 shall not exceed \$1,000 per unit. The costs of special
27 decorative fixtures may be deducted from the cost of the project
28 up to a maximum of five percent of the total cost of the project
29 upon approval of the commissioner.

30 C. Filing fee (application for permit), \$50; and
31 inspection fee \$50 for each altered unit.

32 D. Vertical reciprocating conveyors, (American
33 Society of Mechanical Engineers/American National Standards
34 Institute Standard B20.1) are subject to filing and inspection
35 fees for new and altered installations, but are exempt from

1 routine inspection by an elevator inspector.

2 5226.0200 FEE FOR ROUTINE INSPECTION OF ELEVATORS AND ESCALATORS.

3 The inspection fee for existing hydraulic and traction
4 elevators, escalators, endless belt lifts, and similar devices:

5 A. up to five floors or levels served, \$50;

6 B. six to ten floors or levels served, \$60;

7 C. 11 to 20 floors or levels served, \$70;

8 D. 21 or more floors or levels served, \$80; and

9 E. wheelchair and related accessibility lifts,

10 dumbwaiters, escalators (each direction or individual unit),
11 docklifts, handpowered elevators, and moving walks (each
12 direction or individual unit) and other related equipment not
13 otherwise specified in this part, \$50.

14 5226.0300 CONTRACTOR LICENSE FEE.

15 The fee for examination and license of an elevator
16 contractor is \$125 for a new license and \$110 for a renewal
17 license. The contractor is responsible for carrying all
18 appropriate insurance, meeting all bonding requirements, and
19 meeting all federal, state, and local law and code requirements.
