7 7502.0600 PERSONS WHO MAY INTERPRET BLOOD OR URINE TESTS.

8 A person who meets the educational and occupational
9 standards in items A and B may interpret blood or urine tests:

10 A. educational qualifications: a bachelor's or
11 higher degree in chemistry, biochemistry, biology, biological
12 sciences, pharmacology, criminalistics, forensic science,
13 toxicology, or medical technology;

14 B. occupational qualifications: employment or
15 self-employment as a criminalist, crime laboratory analyst,
16 forensic scientist, toxicologist, pathologist, chemist,
17 biochemist, medical technologist, medical laboratory technician,
18 or medical laboratory assistant.
