- 8 Subp. 2. Exclusions. A person who conducts any of the
- 9 following activities is not required to obtain a hazardous waste
- 10 facility permit for that activity:

- 17 Subp. 37b. Household battery. "Household battery" means a
- 18 disposable or rechargeable dry cell, generated by a household
- 19 and commonly used as a power source for household products.
- 20 "Household battery" includes nickel-cadmium, alkaline, mercuric
- 21 oxide, silver oxide, zinc oxide, zinc-air, lithium, and
- 22 zinc-carbon batteries, but excludes lead-acid batteries.

- 24 Subp. 102a. Waste household battery. "Waste household
- 25 battery" means a household battery which is discarded before use.
- Subp. 102b. Waste oil. "Waste oil" means virgin oil that
- 27 is discarded before use.

- 29 7045.0120 EXEMPT WASTES.
- The following wastes may be stored, labeled, transported,
- 31 treated, processed, and disposed of without complying with the
- 32 requirements of this chapter:
- 33 A. Household waste, including:
- 34 (1) collected household hazardous waste to the

- 1 extent that the requirements of part 7045.0310 are met; and
- 2 (2) collected spent or waste household batteries
- 3 to the extent that the requirements of part 7045.0686 are met;

- 5 7045.0686 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR MANAGEMENT OF SPENT OR WASTE
- 6 HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES.
- 7 Subpart 1. Scope. The requirements of this part apply to
- 8 operators who collect, store, transport, or reclaim spent or
- 9 waste household batteries as a part of a household battery
- 10 management program.
- 11 A. "Household battery management program" means:
- 12 (1) a program established to accept or collect
- 13 spent or waste household batteries;
- 14 (2) a program established by a resource recovery
- 15 facility to segregate spent or waste household batteries from
- 16 household waste; or
- 17 (3) a program established by a solid waste
- 18 disposal facility to segregate spent or waste household
- 19 batteries from household waste during processing activities.
- B. Operators who collect, transport, or store spent
- 21 or waste household batteries which are sent for recycling but
- 22 who do not reclaim them are subject to regulation under subparts
- 23 2 and 3, but are not otherwise subject to regulation under parts
- 24 7045.0205 to 7045.1380, and chapter 7001 for such collection,
- 25 transportation, and storage.
- 26 _ C. Operators who collect, transport, or store spent
- 27 or waste household batteries which are not recycled are subject
- 28 to regulation under subpart 3 and part 7045.0310.
- D. Operators who collect, transport, store, and also
- 30 reclaim spent or waste household batteries are subject to
- 31 regulation under subparts 2 to 4.
- 32 Subp. 2. Notification. An operator who intends to
- 33 establish or operate all or part of a household battery
- 34 management program shall ensure that the information required in
- 35 items A to K is submitted to the commissioner at least 30 days

- 1 before initiating the household battery management program. If
- 2 household batteries are speculatively accumulated as defined in
- 3 part 7045.0020, a permit is required under chapter 7001 instead
- 4 of this notification.
- 5 The notification shall provide a complete description of
- 6 the program including, as applicable:
- 7 A. the name, address, and telephone number of the
- 8 operators establishing the program;
- 9 B. the location of all household battery collection
- 10 sites;
- 11 C. the duration and operating hours of the program;
- D. the intended program service area;
- 13 E. the manner in which household batteries will be
- 14 collected, stored, and disposed of or recycled;
- 15 F. the amount of time the operator intends to store
- 16 household batteries at individual collection sites;
- G. a description of the containers used to collect
- 18 and store household batteries;
- 19 H. the name and address of all facilities which will
- 20 dispose of or recycle the household batteries;
- 21 I. a description of how the operator will manage
- 22 cracked or leaking household batteries;
- J. a description of how the operator will clean up
- 24 spills resulting from leaking household batteries; and
- 25 K. any other information necessary to describe all
- 26 aspects of the program.
- Operators who submit a notification and subsequently change
- 28 any aspect of the program as described in the notification must
- 29 submit, within 30 days of making the change, an amended
- 30 notification to the commissioner fully describing the program
- 31 changes.
- 32 Subp. 3. Standards for storage. Spent or waste household
- 33 batteries must be stored according to items A to C.
- 34 A. Storage of spent or waste household batteries
- 35 shall be in vented, corrosion resistant containers.
- 36 B. Storage of containers of spent or waste household

- l batteries shall be subject to the requirements of part
- 2 7045.0526, subparts 2 to 6 and 9.
- 3 C. If the storage of spent or waste batteries meets
- 4 the criteria of speculative accumulation as defined in part
- 5 7045.0020, the storage is also subject to the following
- 6 requirements: parts 7045.0452 to 7045.0456; 7045.0460 to
- 7 7045.0470; 7045.0478 to 7045.0534; 7045.0544; 7045.0552 to
- 8 7045.0562; 7045.0566 to 7045.0578; 7045.0584 to 7045.0632; and
- 9 the permitting requirements of chapter 7001 for hazardous waste
- 10 storage facilities.
- 11 Subp. 4. Standards for operators of facilities that store
- 12 spent or waste household batteries before reclaiming. The
- 13 operators of facilities that store batteries before reclaiming
- 14 them are subject to regulation under parts 7045.0452 to
- 15 7045.0456; 7045.0460 to 7045.0470; 7045.0478 to 7045.0534;
- 16 7045.0544; 7045.0552 to 7045.0562; 7045.0566 to 7045.0578;
- 17 7045.0584 to 7045.0632; and the permitting requirements of
- 18 chapter 7001 for hazardous waste storage facilities.
