Educational and occupational experience 15 requirement. The applicant must meet the following requirements: 16 be a graduate of a dental or dental hygiene 17 Α. program accredited by the American Dental Association (ADA) 18 19 Commission on Dental Accreditation; B. be licensed to practice as a dentist or dental 20 hygienist by the Minnesota Board of Dentistry; 21 22 C. have a bachelor's degree or above with a major in a health science or health occupation discipline; and 23 have 4,000 hours of occupational experience as a 24 D. 25 licensed dentist or dental hygienist in clinical practice providing direct dental hygiene patient care. A minimum of 26 2,000 of the hours must be in adult care and include the recency 27 requirement of subpart 2. 28 Subp. 4. Substitution for recent occupational experience. 29 The applicant may substitute teaching experience in primary 30 program content in an accredited ADA dental hygiene program for 31 up to 1,500 of the 2,000 hours required in part 3700.0400, 32 provided that experience occurred within the last five years. 33 Two hours of teaching equal one hour of occupational experience. 34
