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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Household Hazardous Waste

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5 Rules as Adopted

6 7001.3300 GENERAL INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS FOR FINAL APPLICATION.

7 The applicant shall submit to the commissioner four copies
8 of the final application and supporting materials for any solid
9 waste management facility. The applicant must use a horizontal
10 scale of one inch equals 200 feet in all drawings and plans,
11 unless otherwise specified. The applicant must mark all plans
12 and reports with the initial date prepared. All subsequent
13 revisions must be dated and include a notation of what revisions
14 were made. The application must contain:

16 Q. a construction inspection, quality control, and
17 quality assurance plan showing a detailed inspection schedule
18 for construction completed at the site; the sampling procedures
19 including number and tests completed; the procedures for
20 interpretation and submission of inspection and test results to
21 the commissioner; and all other material required to comply with
22 parts 7035.2525 to 7035.2875;

23 R. a household hazardous waste management plan
24 according to part 7035.2535, subpart 6; and

25 S. any additional information that the commissioner
26 determines is necessary to decide whether the facility will meet
27 all applicable Minnesota and federal statutes and rules during
28 permit issuance.

29 7035.0300 DEFINITIONS.

31 Subp. 43a. Household hazardous waste. "Household
32 hazardous waste" has the meaning given in Minnesota Statutes,
33 section 115A.96, subdivision 1, paragraph (b).

35 Subp. 96a. Segregated household hazardous waste.

1 "Segregated household hazardous waste" means household hazardous
2 waste that is separated from other solid waste or arrives at a
3 solid waste management facility separated from other solid waste.

5 7035.2535 GENERAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITY REQUIREMENTS.

7 Subp. 6. Household hazardous waste management. A solid
8 waste management facility operator, not including a transfer
9 facility operator, must develop a plan by June 30, 1992,
10 addressing household hazardous wastes and must include in the
11 plan an explanation of how it will comply with the requirements
12 of items A to C.

13 A. The facility operator must provide a summary of
14 the approved county plan for household hazardous waste education
15 programs and management and a discussion of how the operator
16 will participate in county activities and coordinate with that
17 plan.

18 B. The facility operator shall participate with the
19 operator's county in education programs or projects which will
20 promote the identification and reduction of household hazardous
21 waste use in the home and which will promote the proper handling
22 and disposal of this waste. Such projects undertaken by the
23 facility operator must be coordinated with county projects
24 whenever possible and literature or other public information
25 must be consistent with the county's household hazardous waste
26 public education programs. In addition to activities conducted
27 in conjunction with the county's program, facility
28 activities ~~may~~ must include:

29 (1) providing public information on dates and
30 times of household hazardous waste collections in the facility's
31 service area;

32 (2) providing public information to help identify
33 household hazardous waste; ~~or~~ and

34 (3) providing public information on ways to
35 reduce household hazardous waste generation.

1 The information in subitems (1) to (3) must be made
2 available at the facility for public use, for the county, and
3 for other entities that are associated with solid waste
4 management in the facility's service area.

5 C. Household hazardous waste that is segregated from
6 other solid waste and managed at the facility must be managed
7 according to part 7045.0310 or applicable hazardous waste
8 generator standards.

9 7045.0310 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR WASTE COLLECTED AS RESULT OF
10 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.

12 Subp. 7. **Treatment.** Operators conducting treatment of
13 collected household hazardous wastes are subject to the
14 requirements of items A to C.

15 A. An operator intending to perform any treatment not
16 specified in item B must submit a request for approval to the
17 commissioner. The commissioner shall approve the request if the
18 commissioner determines that the requirements of item C have
19 been satisfied and that all other management practices at the
20 collection site are adequate to protect human health and the
21 environment.

22 B. Treatment methods which do not require approval of
23 the commissioner are bulking of:

- 24 (1) paints;
25 (2) solvents;
26 (3) motor oil; and
27 (4) antifreeze.

28 ~~When~~ While bulking is being done, the personnel training and
29 safety procedures required in subpart 4 must specifically
30 address how this activity will be conducted.

31 C. All other methods of waste treatment must be
32 identified in the notification required under subpart 2 and the
33 commissioner's approval obtained for those specific
34 activities before any of those activities are begun. In
35 addition to the information required in subpart 2, the

- 1 notification must provide the following information:
- 2 (1) the name of the person appointed to direct
- 3 and oversee the treatment process;
- 4 (2) a statement that individuals conducting
- 5 treatment must have performed the specific treatment procedure
- 6 at least once prior to performing that treatment procedure at a
- 7 household hazardous waste collection site; ~~and~~
- 8 (3) a detailed description of the treatment
- 9 activity and an explanation of how human health and the
- 10 environment will be protected; and
- 11 (4) evidence of liability insurance.
