2 Subpart 1. Amount of reduction. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 115C.09, subdivision 2, the board shall reduce 3 4 the amount of reimbursement to be made to a noncompliant responsible person as follows: 5

A. For failure to comply with state and federal rules 6 7 and regulations applicable to the tank, the board shall reduce the amount of reimbursement by ten to 25 percent upon 8 consideration of the likely environmental impact of the failure 9 10 to comply. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the board shall reduce the amount of reimbursement by five percent, with a 11 minimum reduction of \$200, for failure to register a tank 12 pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 115-061 116.48. 13

B. For failure to report a release as required by 14 Minnesota Statutes, section 115.061, the board shall reduce the 15 amount of reimbursement by ten to 25 percent upon consideration 16 of the likely environmental impact of the failure to report. 17

C. For failure to cooperate with the agency in 18 responding to the release, the board shall reduce the amount of 19 reimbursement by 25 to 50 percent upon consideration of the 20 likely environmental impact of the failure to cooperate. 21

22 D. For failure to exercise due care with regard to 23 operation of the tank, the board shall reduce the amount of reimbursement by 25 to 50 percent upon consideration of the 24 likely environmental impact of the failure to exercise due care. 25

Subp. 2. Cumulative application. The reduction percentages specified in subpart 1 shall be applied on a 27 cumulative basis. 28

Subsequent applications. An eligible responsible 11 person or volunteer who has already obtained partial 12 reimbursement from the board and who has incurred additional or 13 continuing eligible costs due to the same release may reapply if: 14 A. the amount of the person's original reimbursement 15 was less than 90 percent of the eligible costs or \$1,000,000, 16 whichever is less. 17 B. the eligible costs submitted on a subsequent 18 application are not related to any new releases at the site. 19 The total reimbursement to a responsible person or volunteer for 20 a release shall not exceed 90 percent of the total eligible 21 costs or \$1,000,000, whichever is less, regardless of the number 22 of applications for reimbursement submitted by the responsible 23 24 person or volunteer. A person who signs an application 26 for reimbursement shall make the following certification: "I 27 certify under penalty of law that this document and all 28 attachments were prepared under my direction or supervision in 29 accordance with a system designed to assure that qualified 30 personnel properly gather and evaluate the information 31 submitted. Based on my inquiry of the person or persons who 32 manage the system, or those persons directly responsible for 33 gathering the information, the information submitted is, to the 34 best of my knowledge and belief, true, accurate, and complete. 35

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I certify that if I have submitted invoices for costs that 1 I have incurred but that remain unpaid, I will pay those 2 invoices within 30 days of receipt of reimbursement from the 3 board. I understand that if I fail to do so, the board may 4 demand return of all or any portion of reimbursement paid to me 5 and that if I fail to comply with the board's demand, that the 6 board may recover the reimbursement, plus administrative and 7 legal expenses in a civil action in district court. I 8 understand that I may also be subject to a civil penalty." 9

Additionally, if the responsible person is not an individual, the person authorized under subpart 4 shall make the following certification: "I further certify that I am authorized to sign and submit this application on behalf of (entity)."

Subp. 6. Report of the commissioner. Upon notification by 15 the board's staff that a complete application has been received, 16 the commissioner shall, in a timely manner, provide the board 17 with a written report on the applicant's compliance or 18 noncompliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 115C.09, 19 subdivision 2, paragraphs (b) and (c). The report shall include 20 documentation supporting the commissioner's findings. The 21 commissioner shall file the report with the board no later than 22 15 days after notification. 23

In addition, the board may, as it deems necessary, request additional information from the commissioner or can request participation of agency staff at a board meeting. All responses to requests for information shall be delivered in a timely manner. The board may delegate these powers to its staff.
