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- 7 Rules as Adopted
- 8 7535.0100 DEFINITIONS.
- 9 Subpart 1. Scope. The terms used in this chapter have the
- 10 meanings given them in this part.
- 11 Subp. 2. Building. "Building" means a structure designed
- 12 primarily for human use or occupancy including businesses,
- 13 offices, educational facilities, medical facilities, residences,
- 14 and institutions. Decks, overhangs, porches, or similar
- 15 attached structures are considered part of the building.
- 16 Building does not include appurtenances required to operate or
- 17 maintain pipeline systems.
- Subp. 3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the
- 19 commissioner of public safety.
- 20 Subp. 4. Other development. "Other development" means
- 21 commercial, industrial, or agricultural development when it
- 22 results in the construction of a building or place of public
- 23 assembly.
- Subp. 5. Pipeline. "Pipeline" has the meaning given it in
- 25 Minnesota Statutes, section 299J.02, subdivision 11.
- Subp. 6. Pipeline easement. "Pipeline easement" means the
- 27 existing easement or the-negotiated a subsequent easement
- 28 resulting from a-blanket the negotiation of a change in the

- 30 Subp. 7. Place of public assembly. "Place of public
- 31 assembly" means a site that is occupied by 20 or more persons on
- 32 at least five days a week for ten weeks in any 12-month period.

- 34 7535.0200 PURPOSE.
- 35 The purpose of this chapter is to set out a model ordinance

- 1 requiring a setback from pipeline sites where residential or
- 2 other development may occur.
- 3 7535.0300 SCOPE.
- 4 This chapter applies to statutory or home rule charter
- 5 cities, towns, and counties that have planning and zoning
- 6 authority under Minnesota Statutes, sections 366.10 to 366.19,
- 7 394.21 to 394.37, or 462.351 to 462.365, and in which a pipeline
- 8 is located.
- 9 7535.0400 ADOPTION OF SETBACK ORDINANCE.
- 10 Subpart 1. Deadline. By August 1, 1991, each jurisdiction
- 11 described in part 7535.0300 shall adopt an approved setback
- 12 ordinance that meets or exceeds the minimum standards set out in
- 13 this chapter.
- 14 Subp. 2. Application. The model setback ordinance must be
- 15 applied to any jurisdiction that has not adopted an approved
- 16 setback ordinance by August 1, 1991.
- 17 Subp. 3. Approval process. Each jurisdiction shall submit
- 18 a copy of its proposed ordinance to the commissioner. The
- 19 proposed ordinance must be compared to the definitions and model
- 20 setback ordinance in parts 7535.0100 and 7535.0500 to ensure
- 21 that the proposed setback meets or exceeds the minimum standards
- 22 set out in the model. The commissioner's written decision on
- 23 the proposed ordinance will be sent to the jurisdiction within
- 24 90 days of receipt. The decision must specify approval of the
- 25 ordinance or areas of deficiency and recommended modifications.
- 26 7535.0500 MODEL SETBACK ORDINANCE.
- 27 Subpart 1. Purpose. The purpose of a model setback
- 28 ordinance set out in this part is to increase public safety by
- 29 requiring that new development be set back from pipeline
- 30 locations.
- 31 Subp. 2. Applicability. This ordinance applies to new
- 32 residential and other development. It does not apply to
- 33 development that has occurred or for which development permits
- 34 have been issued before the effective date of this part.

- 1 Subp. 3. Setback. Buildings and places of public assembly
- 2 subject to this ordinance must-be-designed-to-accommodate-a
- 3 setback-from-the-pipeline-equal-to-or-greater-than-the-pipeline
- 4 easement-boundaries shall not be constructed closer to the
- 5 pipeline than the boundary of the pipeline easement.
- 6 Subp. 4. Variances. Variance procedures adopted by the
- 7 local unit of government under Minnesota Statutes, sections
- 8 366.10 to 366.19, 394.21 to 394.37, or 462.351 to 462.365, shall
- 9 apply.
