- Subp. 11. Trophy animal. "Trophy animal" is defined for
- 2 deer, elk, and moose as an animal with antlers that meet or
- 3 exceed the score specified in items A to D when measured using
- 4 the Boone and Crockett Club's official scoring system for North
- 5 American big game trophies (Nesbitt, W.H. and J. Reneau, eds.,
- 6 Records of North American Big Game, Ninth Edition, The Boone and
- 7 Crockett Club, Dumfries, VA, 1988, 498 pp.). This scoring
- 8 system is incorporated by reference and is available through the
- 9 Minitex interlibrary loan system and is not subject to frequent
- 10 change:
- 11 A. white-tailed deer (typical), score of 135;
- B. white-tailed deer (nontypical), score of 160;
- 13 C. moose, score of 145; and
- 14 D. elk, score of 260.
- 15 Trophy animal is defined for black bear as an animal with a
- 16 skull that meets or exceeds a score of 20 using the Boone and
- 17 Crockett Club's official scoring system for North American big
- 18 game trophies (id.)
- 19 For the purposes of this chapter, antlers or skulls may be
- 20 measured at any time; no drying period is required.

- 16 Subpart 1. General. For fish species that do not have a
- 17 designated quality size, or for fish that have a total length
- 18 equal to or less than the designated quality size, the
- 19 restitution value is the base value shown in the following
- 20 table. For fish that have a length that exceeds the designated
- 21 quality size, the restitution value is the base value plus \$10
- 22 for every inch over the quality size.
