- 7 3515.6005 POSTSECONDARY RELATED SUBJECTS INSTRUCTOR.
- 8 Subpart 1. Licensure requirement. A person holding a
- 9 position as a postsecondary related subjects instructor must be
- 10 licensed under part 3515.5700 and this part when responsible for
- 11 instructing students in foundational areas or occupational
- 12 personal development areas in cooperation with instructional
- 13 personnel in major occupational areas.
- 14 Subp. 2. Licensure criteria for foundational areas
- 15 (mathematics, science, communications). An applicant:
- 16 A. must be a graduate of an accredited college with a
- 17 four-year degree, including a major in the area of licensure to
- 18 be taught, or the equivalent, as verified by a teacher education
- 19 institution that grants such degrees;
- B. shall have completed 4,000 hours of occupational
- 21 experience in an area other than education; and
- C. shall meet the requirements of the postsecondary
- 23 vocational teacher education sequence in parts 3515.1400 to
- 24 3515.2000.
- Subp. 3. Recency exemption. When applying for this
- 26 license, an applicant who qualifies under subpart 2 and who is
- 27 currently licensed and practicing as a postsecondary technical
- 28 college instructor in an occupational continuous program or
- 29 continuous general studies area need not comply with the recency
- 30 requirement listed in the special needs licensure chart in parts
- 31 3515.9940 to 3515.9942 and the recency requirement in part
- 32 3515.0100, subpart 25.
- 33 Subp. 4. License criteria for occupational personal
- 34 development (for example, job seeking, interviewing, personal
- 35 dynamics). Option one: An applicant:

- A. shall be a graduate of an accredited college with
- 2 a four-year degree, including a major in the area of licensure
- 3 to be taught (for example, industrial relations, personnel
- 4 management, employment counseling, business administration), or
- 5 the equivalent, as verified by an institution that grants such
- 6 degrees;
- 7 B. shall have completed 4,000 hours of occupational
- 8 experience in an area other than education; and
- 9 C. shall meet the requirements of the postsecondary
- 10 vocational teacher education sequence in parts 3515.1400 to
- 11 3515.2000.
- Option two: An applicant shall have completed 8,000 hours
- 13 of occupational experience in an area related to occupational
- 14 personal development other than education, and shall meet the
- 15 requirements of the postsecondary vocational teacher education
- 16 sequence in parts 3515.1400 to 3515.2000.
- 17 3700.0381 COMPUTER PROGRAMMING; COMPUTER OPERATIONS.
- 18 An applicant holding a postsecondary technical college
- 19 continuous program license in computer programming or computer
- 20 operations may apply for a license in microcomputer support and
- 21 network administration under the following conditions:
- 22 A. the applicant has a certificate of completion in
- 23 BME5390 Special Topics in Technical Updating: Advanced
- 24 Microcomputing Technology, from the University of Minnesota,
- 25 Business and Marketing Division; and
- 26 B. application is made to the licensing section of
- 27 the State Board of Technical Colleges within two years after
- 28 completing the course described in item A.

- 30 LICENSE TRANSFER. A person who at the time of the repeal
- 31 of Minnesota Rules, part 3700.0320 is holding a license issued
- 32 under part 3700.0320, may continue to use the license and the
- 33 license is fully effective until the time for renewal of the
- 34 license. At the time for renewal, the renewal must be issued
- 35 according to part 3700.0315, Banking and Finance Operations.

- 2 REENACTMENT AND VALIDATION. Minnesota Rules, parts
- 3 3515.5700, 3515.5900, 3515.6000, 3515.6100, 3515.6200, and
- 4 3515.6700 are reenacted effective March 18, 1990, to be
- 5 continuously in effect. Licenses issued since the effective
- 6 date of the reenactment are fully effective from the date of
- 7 their issuance.
- 8 REPEALER. Minnesota Rules, parts 3515.5050, 3515.6000, and
- 9 3700.0320, are repealed. Minnesota Rules, part 3700.0381, is
- 10 repealed June 30, 1993.
