2 Subp. 5a. Future requirements for renewal of certain 3 licenses. Notwithstanding subpart 5, after June 30, 2007, a 4 person who makes application for renewal of continuing licensure as an educational speech/language pathologist who does not hold 5 6 a master's degree in speech/language pathology must provide evidence that at least 24 quarter or 16 semester hours of 7 postbaccalaureate college credit in speech/language pathology or 8 related special education instruction and services have been 9 earned and otherwise comply with subpart 5. 10

Subp. 6. Effective date. After June 30, 1994, a person who makes application for initial licensure as an educational speech/language pathologist must hold a master's degree and comply with subpart 1.

Subp. 7. Baccalaureate degree. A person holding a baccalaureate degree who applies for initial licensure as an educational speech/language pathologist before July 1, 1994, must comply with the requirements of this part, except the requirement to have a master's degree. On July 1, 1994, this subpart is repealed.

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
