- 6 6800.1150 ANNUAL RENEWAL, FEES, AND POSTING.
- 7 Each pharmacist license shall expire on March 1 of each
- 8 year and shall be renewed annually by filing an application for
- 9 license renewal on or before February 1 of each year, together
- 10 with a fee of \$75. Any pharmacist license renewal application
- ll submitted after March 1 shall be subject to a late filing fee of
- 12 an amount equal to 50 percent of the renewal fee in addition to
- 13 the renewal fee.
- 14 Each pharmacist shall post the license or renewal in a
- 15 conspicuous place within the pharmacy in which the pharmacist is
- 16 practicing. For community pharmacies, this place shall be a
- 17 place which is readily visible to the public.
- 18 6800.1250 APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE.
- 19 Subpart 1. Submitting. Applicants for licensure by
- 20 examination shall submit a completed application for examination
- 21 including affidavits of internship, a copy of applicant's birth
- 22 certificate, and a recent photograph. All applicants shall show
- 23 evidence of graduation with a bachelor of science degree or
- 24 doctor of pharmacy degree, as the first professional
- 25 undergraduate degree in pharmacy, from a college of pharmacy or
- 26 a department of pharmacy of a university approved by the board
- 27 and meeting at least the minimum standards set by the American
- 28 Council on Pharmaceutical Education in the current edition of
- 29 its accreditation manual. The evidence shall be shown by
- 30 submitting an official final transcript showing the date on
- 31 which degree was conferred. The above listed documents together
- 32 with a check for \$250 must be submitted to the board at least 45
- 33 days prior to the examination. An applicant who is a graduate
- 34 of a school or college of pharmacy located outside the United
- 35 States, which has not been recognized and approved by the board,

- l but who is otherwise qualified to apply for a license to
- 2 practice pharmacy in this state, is considered to have satisfied
- 3 the requirements of graduation if the applicant verifies to the
- 4 board the applicant's academic record and the applicant's
- 5 graduation. Before taking the licensing examination, a foreign
- 6 graduate applicant shall pass the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate
- 7 Equivalency Examination, which is recognized and approved by the
- 8 board, given by the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination
- 9 Commission and demonstrate proficiency in the English language
- 10 by passing the Test of English as a Foreign Language, which is
- 11 recognized and approved by the board, given by the Educational
- 12 Testing Service as a prerequisite to taking the licensure
- 13 examination.
- 14 Subp. 2. Retaking exam. Any applicant who has failed to
- 15 pass the examination required by Minnesota Statutes, section
- 16 151.06, 151.07, 151.10, or 151.12, may retake the examination
- 17 within the next ensuing 14 months, provided that no applicant
- 18 who has failed in three examinations shall be permitted to take
- 19 a further examination, except upon petition setting forth facts
- 20 acceptable to the board. The applicant shall, at least 45 days
- 21 before an examination, notify the board in writing of the
- 22 intention to retake the examination, certifying that information
- 23 furnished on the original application remains true and correct,
- 24 or reporting any changes therein, including additional education
- 25 and experience, and shall submit a fee of \$250 payable to the
- 26 Minnesota Board of Pharmacy. The board reserves the right to
- 27 request a full and complete application.

- 29 6800.1300 RECIPROCITY.
- 30 Subpart 1. Applications. Applications for reciprocal
- 31 licensure (licensure as a pharmacist on the basis of licensure
- 32 as a pharmacist in another state) together with a fee of \$175
- 33 shall be filed with the secretary of the board at least 30 days
- 34 before the date the application is to be considered by the
- 35 board. The board will consider applications for reciprocity in

- l at least January and June of each calendar year.
