- 9 Subp. 7. American Red Cross advanced first aid personnel.
- 10 A person certified by the American Red Cross in advanced first
- 11 aid and emergency care may apply to the commissioner for
- 12 permission to enroll in an approved emergency care refresher
- 13 course, by providing documentation which evidences that the
- 14 person meets the criteria listed in subpart 8. An applicant
- 15 successfully completing all emergency care refresher course
- 16 requirements shall be issued an emergency care course
- 17 certificate by the commissioner.
- 18 Subp. 8. Required documentation. A person who submits the
- 19 following is eligible to enroll in an emergency care refresher
- 20 course:
- 21 A. evidence of holding a current American Red Cross
- 22 advanced first aid and emergency care certificate;
- B. evidence of being currently on the roster of an
- 24 ambulance service licensed by the commissioner and of having a
- 25 minimum of three years experience as a driver or attendant with
- 26 an ambulance service licensed by the commissioner; and
- 27 C. certification from the medical advisor or medical
- 28 director of the licensed ambulance service identified in item B
- 29 for whom the person is currently working, acknowledging that the
- 30 applicant has current knowledge, training, and skill proficiency
- 31 in the use of all basic equipment required in a basic life
- 32 support ambulance.
- 33 Subp. 9. Persons previously completing approved emergency
- 34 care refresher courses. The commissioner shall issue an
