6 7873.0110 APPROVAL OF PARI-MUTUEL POOLS.

7 [For text of subps 1 and 2, see M.R.]

8 Subp. 3. Live racing days; director of pari-mutuel racing  
9 authority. The director of pari-mutuel racing or the  
10 commission's director of pari-mutuels is delegated the authority  
11 to approve variation and changes in the pari-mutuel pools  
12 previously approved by the commission, placement of pools in the  
13 program, and simulcasts requested by the licensee that meet the  
14 criteria in subpart 2. The director of pari-mutuel racing or  
15 the commission's director of pari-mutuels is delegated the  
16 authority to approve changes in the placement of pari-mutuel  
17 pools in the program, the addition of approved pari-mutuel pools  
18 to the program, and changes in simulcasting requests by the  
19 licensee that meet the criteria in subpart 2. Before approving  
20 a change in the pick six, pick seven, twin trifecta, and  
21 super-tri wagering pools, the director of pari-mutuel racing or  
22 the commission's director of pari-mutuels must consult with the  
23 commission's executive committee.

24 7873.0120 PARI-MUTUEL BETTING.

25 Subpart 1. Deficiencies. In the event there is  
26 insufficient money available in a net pari-mutuel pool to return  
27 \$2.10 on each winning \$2 wager or \$1.05 on each winning \$1  
28 wager, the association conducting the pari-mutuel betting shall  
29 pay the deficiency from its share of the pool.

30 7873.0190 PICK SIX.

32 Subp. 9. Cancellation of race comprising pick six. In the  
33 event one or two of the races comprising the pick six are  
34 canceled for any reason, or in the event one or two of the races

1 comprising the pick six is declared as no contest by the  
2 stewards, 100 percent of the current program's net pari-mutuel  
3 pool shall be distributed among the holders of pick six tickets  
4 which correctly designate the most official winners of the  
5 remaining races comprising the pick six. The cumulative net  
6 pool from previous programs shall not be distributed in this  
7 case and will be carried over to the next consecutive race day.  
8 In the event of the cancellation of three or more races  
9 comprising the pick six pool after wagering has been accepted on  
10 that day, a full and complete refund must be made of the  
11 pari-mutuel tickets sold on the pick six on that day. One  
12 hundred percent of the remaining amount in the pick six  
13 pari-mutuel pool shall be carried over and included in the pick  
14 six pari-mutuel pool for the next succeeding racing date as an  
15 additional net amount to be distributed.

17 7873.0198 PICK SEVEN.

19 Subp. 9. **Cancellation of race comprising pick seven.** In  
20 the event three or fewer of the races comprising the pick seven  
21 is canceled for any reason, or in the event three or fewer of  
22 the races comprising the pick seven is declared as no contest by  
23 the stewards, 100 percent of the current program's net  
24 pari-mutuel pool shall be distributed among the holders of pick  
25 seven tickets which correctly designate the most official  
26 winners of the remaining races comprising the pick seven. The  
27 cumulative pool from previous programs shall not be distributed  
28 in this case and will be carried over to the next consecutive  
29 race day. In the event of the cancellation of four or more  
30 races comprising the pick seven pool after wagering has been  
31 accepted on that day, a full and complete refund must be made of  
32 the pari-mutuel tickets sold on the pick seven on that day. One  
33 hundred percent of the remaining amount in the pick seven  
34 pari-mutuel pool shall be carried over and included in the pick  
35 seven pari-mutuel pool for the next succeeding racing date as an

1 additional net amount to be distributed.

3 7874.0100 GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5 Subp. 4. Recapitulation. On each day that deposits are  
6 made by the association, a report must be filed with the  
7 commission containing the following recapitulation:

13 7877.0155 CONDITIONS PRECEDENT TO LICENSING.

14 Acceptance of a Class C license, including a temporary or  
15 emergency license, shall mean that the licensee consents and  
16 agrees to the following conditions:

18 E. The licensee will submit to inspections and  
19 searches as hereinafter provided:

20 (1) When investigating for violations of law or  
21 rules upon the grounds of an association, the commission or the  
22 stewards may designate the Minnesota Department of Public  
23 Safety, Gambling Enforcement Division or another appropriate law  
24 enforcement agency as having authority to conduct searches of  
25 any Class C licensee, or any employee or agent of a Class A, B,  
26 or D7-or-E licensee under the commission's jurisdiction. This  
27 authority shall extend to searches and inspections of persons  
28 and personal effects in and about grounds.

29 (2) Each applicant for a Class C license and each  
30 employee or agent of a Class A7 or B7-or-E licensee consents to  
31 such searches and inspections, and waives all claims or possible  
32 actions for damages that he or she believes he or she may have  
33 suffered in connection with any such search or inspection.

7 7878.0110 MINIMUM SELECTION STANDARDS.

8 Subpart 1. Applicant must meet selection standards. A  
9 person eligible to be licensed by the commission as a security  
10 officer must be an employee of a Class A, B, or ~~D7-or-E~~ licensee  
11 and shall meet the following minimum selection standards prior  
12 to being appointed a security officer. The appointing authority  
13 may certify that the applicant has already completed certain of  
14 these standards and provide documentation to that effect  
15 pursuant to subpart 2. In all cases, the security officer must:

27 unable to serve for any reason, the remaining stewards shall  
28 nominate a temporary steward to the commission for approval. In  
29 emergencies, the director of pari-mutuel racing may approve  
30 appointment of a temporary steward.
