- 7 7521.0200 DETERMINATION OF CLAIMS.
- 8 Subpart 1. Filing claim. A claim for public safety
- 9 officer death benefits under Minnesota Statutes, section 299A.44
- 10 must be on a form provided by the commissioner of public safety
- 11 and must contain information relevant to the claimant's
- 12 eligibility for benefits.
- 13 Certified copies of reports, certificates, and affidavits
- 14 relevant to the claimant's eligibility for benefits must be
- 15 filed with the claim form in order for the claim to be
- 16 considered a complete claim.
- A claim is considered to be filed upon receipt by the
- 18 commissioner of a complete claim with the claim form signed by
- 19 the claimant or the claimant's representative.
- Subp. 2. Investigation by commissioner. When a complete
- 21 claim is filed, the commissioner shall determine whether the
- 22 claimant is eligible for benefits. The commissioner shall make
- 23 the inquiries or investigation necessary to make the
- 24 determination. The commissioner shall base the determination on
- 25 the information provided on the complete claim and by the
- 26 investigation of the claim.
- Subp. 3. Determination of eligibility. On determining
- 28 that the claimant is eligible for benefits, the commissioner
- 29 shall initiate the payment procedure and inform the claimant.
- 30 On determining that the claimant is not eligible for benefits,
- 31 or that there is insufficient information on which to make a
- 32 determination, the commissioner shall deny the claim and inform
- 33 the claimant of the grounds for denial. The commissioner shall
- 34 also give notice of a claim denial to the deceased officer's
- 35 former employer and to the deceased officer's labor

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- 1 organization, if the claimant has consented in writing to the
- 2 giving of this notice in the manner provided by Minnesota
- 3 Statutes, section 13.05, subdivision 4, paragraph (d).
- Subp. 4. Request for reconsideration. The claimant,
- 5 within 30 days after receiving a notice of denial from the
- 6 commissioner, may submit additional information to the
- 7 commissioner and request a reconsideration of the claim. Upon
- 8 receipt of the additional information, the commissioner shall
- 9 reevaluate the claim in light of the new information and shall
- 10 perform additional inquiries or investigation as necessary. The
- 11 commissioner shall affirm, modify, or reverse the previous
- 12 determination and shall notify the claimant of the determination
- 13 and its basis.
- Subp. 5. Starting a contested case hearing. A claimant
- 15 may request a contested case hearing under Minnesota Statutes,
- 16 chapter 14.
- 17 A claimant who has not requested reconsideration under
- 18 subpart 4 shall submit a written request for a contested case
- 19 hearing to the commissioner no-more-than-30-days-after-the
- 20 claimant-receives-the-notice-of-denial.
- 21 A claimant who has requested reconsideration under subpart
- 22 4 shall submit a written request for a contested case hearing to
- 23 the commissioner no-more-than-30-days-after-the-claimant
- 24 receives-the-notice-of-denial-upon-reconsideration.
