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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Waste Pesticide Collection

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- 5 Rules as Adopted
- 6 1509.0010 AUTHORITY.
- 7 Parts 1509.0010 to 1509.0050 govern the waste pesticide
- 8 collection program pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section
- 9 18B.065. Parts 1509.0010 to 1509.0050 establish a process for:
- 10 (1) assessment schedule and payment; (2) cosponsor selection;
- 11 and (3) cooperative agreement.
- 12 1509.0020 DEFINITIONS.
- Subpart 1. Scope. The definitions in this part apply to
- 14 parts 1509.0010 to 1509.0050.
- Subp. 2. Collection site. "Collection site" means a
- 16 permanent or temporary designated location with scheduled hours
- 17 for authorized collections where pesticide end-users may bring
- 18 their waste pesticide.
- 19 Subp. 3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the
- 20 commissioner of agriculture or an agent authorized by the
- 21 commissioner.
- 22 Subp. 4. Container. "Container" means a package, can,
- 23 bottle, bag, barrel, drum, or other containing device used to
- 24 enclose a pesticide formulation for storage, transport, or other
- 25 handling.
- Subp. 5. Cosponsor. "Cosponsor" means the state or local
- 27 unit of government selected to enter into a cooperative
- 28 agreement with the commissioner to administer a waste pesticide
- 29 collection program.
- 30 Subp. 6. Pesticide end-user. "Pesticide end-user" means a
- 31 farmer or other person who uses, intends to use, or owns a
- 32 pesticide. Pesticide end-user does not include a dealer,
- 33 manufacturer, formulator, or packager.
- 34 Subp. 7. Pesticide formulation. "Pesticide formulation"
- 35 means a substance or mixture of one or more active ingredients

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- 1 and inerts that is used to mitigate or control pests.
- 2 Subp. 8. Waste pesticide. "Waste pesticide" means an
- 3 unusable-pesticide-including:--suspended;-canceled;-or-degraded
- 4 pesticide -- Waste-pesticide-does-not-include-other-materials
- 5 contaminated-with-pesticide-formulations a pesticide that the
- 6 pesticide end user considers a waste. A waste pesticide can be
- 7 a canceled pesticide, an unusable pesticide, or a usable
- 8 pesticide.
- 9 1509.0030 ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE AND PAYMENT.
- 10 Subpart 1. Assessment schedule. A pesticide end-user
- ll voluntarily participating in a collection authorized under
- 12 Minnesota Statutes, section 18B.065, may be assessed a portion
- 13 of the disposal costs based on gross weight in pounds of the
- 14 pesticide formulation and container collected, up to a maximum
- 15 of 2,200 pounds. The assessment of individual pesticide
- 16 end-users must be based on costs described in the current
- 17 hazardous pesticide waste packing, transportation and disposal
- 18 service contract and invoiced at the rates determined under
- 19 items A to C.
- 20 A. Agencies of government or their representatives
- 21 must be assessed costs equal to 125 percent of the disposal
- 22 price, but not less than \$7 per pound to participate in a waste
- 23 pesticide collection.
- B. Assessments for other participants must be based
- 25 on amounts for disposal at the following rate:
- 26 (1) no cost for disposal of 150 pounds or less;
- 27 (2) costs equal to 15 percent of the disposal
- 28 price, but not less than \$1 per pound for quantities greater
- 29 than 150 pounds, up to 300 pounds;
- 30 (3) costs equal to 50 percent of the disposal
- 31 price, but not less than \$3 per pound for quantities greater
- 32 than 300 pounds, up to 1,000 pounds; or
- 33 (4) costs equal to 100 percent of the disposal
- 34 price, but not less than \$6 per pound for quantities greater
- 35 than 1,000 pounds, up to a maximum of 2,200 pounds.

- 1 C. Assessments must be made based on the cumulative
- 2 poundage of pesticide formulation and its container collected
- 3 from each participant disposing of waste pesticides.
- 4 Subp. 2. Payment. The commissioner shall invoice
- 5 participants promptly for disposal costs based on the assessment
- 6 schedule in subpart 1.
- 7 1509.0040 PROGRAM OPERATION AND ADMINISTRATION.
- 8 Subpart 1. Cosponsor selection. A potential cosponsor
- 9 seeking sole or joint participation in the operation and
- 10 administration of a collection authorized under Minnesota
- 11 Statutes, section 18B.065, shall complete and return an
- 12 application form provided by the commissioner. Cosponsor
- 13 selection must be based on the following criteria:
- 14 A. a completed application;
- B. willingness to commit financial, physical, and
- 16 other resources to collection;
- 17 C. proposed collection site; and
- D. collection service area.
- 19 Subp. 2. Cooperative agreement. The commissioner and
- 20 cosponsor must agree to the terms of the cooperative collection
- 21 and sign a cooperative agreement defining responsibilities and
- 22 conditions of each party in conducting a waste pesticide
- 23 collection. Cosponsor roles and responsibilities may include:
- A. providing funds for local administration and
- 25 on-site operation;
- 26 B. obtaining a United States Environmental Protection
- 27 Agency hazardous waste generator identification number;
- 28 C. supplying necessary physical and human resources
- 29 for on-site operation;
- 30 D. reimbursing the commissioner for disposal costs;
- 31 and
- 32 E. other described responsibilities and conditions
- 33 agreed upon by the commissioner and cosponsor in the cooperative
- 34 agreement.
- 35 1509.0050 DEPOSIT OF FUNDS.

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- 1 Assessments collected under parts 1509.0030 and 1509.0040
- 2 must be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the
- 3 waste pesticide collection account according to Minnesota
- 4 Statutes, section 18B.065, subdivision 5.
