- 7 7410.2610 INSULIN-TREATED DIABETES MELLITUS.
- 8 Subpart 1. Scope. This part applies to drivers and
- 9 applicants for drivers' licenses who have diabetes and are
- 10 treated with insulin.
- 11 Subp. 2. Definitions. The terms in this part have the
- 12 meanings given them in this subpart.
- 13 A. "Applying" means the completion of a department
- 14 initial application, renewal, or duplicate driver's license form.
- B. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of the
- 16 Department of Public Safety, acting directly or through
- 17 authorized officers and agents.
- 18 C. "Department" means the Department of Public Safety.
- D. "Driving-related episode" means an episode that
- 20 occurs while a person is driving, operating, or in physical
- 21 control of a motor vehicle.
- 22 E. "Episode" means loss of consciousness or voluntary
- 23 control due to hypoglycemia or hyperglycemia.
- 24 F. "Loss of consciousness or voluntary control" means
- 25 the inability to assume and retain an upright posture without
- 26 support or the inability to overcome diabetic symptoms without
- 27 the assistance of another.
- Subp. 3. Reporting diagnosis of insulin-treated diabetes
- 29 or episode. A person shall report a diagnosis of
- 30 insulin-treated diabetes or an episode, in writing, to the
- 31 department as follows:
- A. after a diagnosis of insulin-treated diabetes:
- 33 (1) at the time of applying for a driver's
- 34 license; or and
- 35 (2) within 30 days after the diagnosis;

- B. for a driving-related episode:
- 2 (1) within 30 days after the episode; and
- 3 (2) on a regularly scheduled physician's
- 4 statement as required in subpart 3a; and
- 5 C. for a non-driving-related episode, on a regularly
- 6 scheduled physician's statement as required in subpart 3a.
- 7 If a person has reason to know the requirements of items A
- 8 and B, and willfully fails to report or willfully makes a
- 9 material misrepresentation to the department concerning the
- 10 person's diabetic condition, the commissioner shall suspend the
- 11 person's driver's license for six months. The six-month
- 12 suspension period will begin within 30 days from the date the
- 13 department discovers the failure to report or misrepresentation.
- 14 Subp. 3a. Physicians statement required. A physician's
- 15 statement, on a form prescribed by the commissioner, is required:
- A. after the person:
- 17 (1) is diagnosed as having insulin-treated
- 18 diabetes; or
- 19 (2) has a driving-related episode under subpart
- 20 3; and
- 21 B. every six months until the person has been episode
- 22 free for a year; and then
- C. annually until the person has been episode free
- 24 for four years; and then
- D. every four years; and additionally
- 26 E. as recommended by the physician or by the
- 27 department.
- The six-month, one-year, or four-year period will begin
- 29 from the date the most recent physician's statement has been
- 30 received and approved by the department. During a period of
- 31 cancellation or suspension under this part, the department shall
- 32 not require a physician's statement until the end of the
- 33 cancellation or suspension period.
- 34 If a person fails to return a physician's statement to the
- 35 department within 30 days from the date of mailing, the
- 36 commissioner shall cancel the person's driver's license until

- 1 the physician's statement is submitted to the department and
- 2 accepted.
- 3 The physician's statement must indicate, at least, the date
- 4 of each of the person's episodes since the previous physician's
- 5 statement, the-cause-of-each-episode, whether the person is
- 6 cooperating in the treatment of the condition, the person's
- 7 prognosis for control of the person's diabetic condition, and
- 8 whether the person is medically qualified to exercise reasonable
- 9 and ordinary control over a motor vehicle on the public roads.
- 10 Subp. 4. [See repealer.]
- Subp. 5. [See repealer.]
- 12 Subp. 5a. Cancellation or denial. After a review of a
- 13 person's physician's statement, the commissioner shall cancel or
- 14 deny a person's driver's license under the conditions and for
- 15 the periods stated as follows:
- 16 A. If the commissioner receives a physician's
- 17 statement that indicates that the person is not medically
- 18 qualified to exercise reasonable and ordinary control over a
- 19 motor vehicle, the period of cancellation or denial will be
- 20 based on the recommendation of the physician and the department
- 21 unless the cancellation period in item B or C applies. If the
- 22 department and the treating physician do not agree on the
- 23 cancellation period, the physician's statement and the person's
- 24 medical history will be submitted to the Medical Review Board
- 25 for its recommendation upon the request of the individual or,
- 26 the physician, or the department.
- B. If a person has a driving-related episode, the
- 28 person's driver's license will be canceled for a period of six
- 29 months from the date of the episode.
- 30 C. If a person has a driving-related episode that
- 31 resulted from the use of alcohol or a controlled substance, the
- 32 person's driver's license will be canceled for a period of one
- 33 year from the date of the episode.
- 34 Subp. 5b. Notice. The commissioner shall notify a person
- 35 whose driver's license has been or is subject to cancellation,
- 36 suspension, or denial. The notification must be in writing and

- 1 be personally served or sent by first-class mail to the person's
- 2 last known address shown on department records. The notice must
- .3 contain:
- 4 A. the reason for the cancellation, suspension, or
- 5 denial;
- 6 B. the length of withdrawal;
- 7 C. a statement that a person has a right to an
- 8 administrative review; and
- 9 D. the requirements for reinstatement of the person's
- 10 driver's license.
- 11 The notice is deemed received three days after mailing by
- 12 the department to the last known address of the person shown on
- 13 department records.
- 14 Subp. 6. Reinstatement or issuance. The commissioner
- 15 shall reinstate or issue the driver's license of a person whose
- 16 license has been suspended, canceled, or denied when:
- A. the period of suspension, if any, has expired;
- B. the person has paid the suspension reinstatement
- 19 fee as required by statute;
- 20 C. no withdrawal of the person's driver's license is
- 21 outstanding;
- D. the requirements that resulted in suspension,
- 23 cancellation, or denial have been completed; and
- 24 E. the person submits a physician's statement, on a
- 25 form prescribed by the commissioner, indicating:
- 26 (1) the date of each of the person's episodes
- 27 since the previous physician's statement;
- 28 (2) the-cause-of-each-episode;
- 29 (3) the person is cooperating in the treatment of
- 30 the condition;
- (4) (3) a favorable prognosis for the control of
- 32 the person's diabetic condition; and
- (5) (4) the person is medically qualified to
- 34 exercise reasonable and ordinary control over a motor vehicle on
- 35 the public roads.
