- 4830.8510 SCOPE. 7
- 8 Parts 4830.8510 to 4830.8575 apply to the program of state
- grants for prenursing students.
- 4830.8535 APPLICATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS FOR GRANTS. 10
- 11 Subpart 1. Participation by schools and programs. A
- 12 school or nursing program that desires prenursing grant funds
- 13 must sign an institutional participation agreement with the
- 14 executive director.
- Subp. 2. Modification of allocations. The executive 15
- director shall allocate funds equal to the school's or program's 16
- estimated need for funds if the estimated need is less than the 17
- amount determined by the allocation formula. 18
- 19 Subp. 3. Responsibility. Each participating school or
- 20 nursing program must:
- 21 A. establish procedures for students to apply for and
- receive grants; 22
- consider the likelihood of a student's success in 23 В.
- 24 completing the nursing educational program and the likelihood
- that the student will serve in a designated rural area; 25
- C. verify-that-the-student-does-not-have-a 26
- baccalaureate-degree-or-has-not-been-enrolled-on-a-full-time 27
- basis-for-eight-semesters,-12-quarters,-or-the-equivalent, 28
- 29 D. give priority to students with the greatest
- 30 financial need; and
- E. D. assist the executive director in monitoring 31
- recipient service status. 32
- Subp. 4. Renewal award allocation formula. The executive 33
- director shall calculate an allocation for renewal awards at 34
- eligible schools and nursing programs based on prior year 35

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- l information submitted by schools or nursing programs on the
- 2 Prenursing Grant Final Report. The following formula will be
- 3 used:
- 4 A. for schools and nursing programs located outside
- 5 the seven county metropolitan area, the sum of each school's or
- 6 nursing program's total prior year grant awards for current
- 7 academic year renewal students multiplied by at least 100
- 8 percent; plus
- 9 B. for schools and nursing programs located within
- 10 the seven county metropolitan area, the sum of each school's or
- ll nursing program's total prior year prenursing grant awards for
- 12 current academic year renewal students multiplied by at least
- 13 100 percent.
- Subp. 5. Prorating, reports, refunds, renewals, excess
- 15 funds. If insufficient funds are available to allocate funds to
- 16 all schools and nursing programs with renewal students, the
- 17 executive director shall give priority to schools or nursing
- 18 programs located outside the seven county metropolitan area when
- 19 prorating the available funds.
- 20 Schools or nursing programs with final reports correctly
- 21 completed and submitted to the executive director with any
- 22 applicable refunds by the first working day after August 9 will
- 23 be informed in writing by the executive director of their
- 24 allocations for renewal awards by the first working day after
- 25 August 30. The executive director shall withhold a school's or
- 26 nursing program's allocation for renewal awards if the reporting
- 27 deadline date is not met.
- Funds not needed for renewal awards may be used by the
- 29 school or nursing program for initial awards to eligible
- 30 students.
- 31 Subp. 6. Appropriation balance. The annual prenursing
- 32 grant appropriation minus the sum of subpart 4, items A and B,
- 33 equals the appropriation balance. The appropriation balance
- 34 will be allocated to schools and nursing programs as specified
- 35 in subpart 7.
- 36 Subp. 7. Initial award allocation formula. A second

- l allocation will be made to schools and nursing programs to make
- 2 awards for initial prenursing grant applicants using the
- 3 following formula:
- 4 A. each school's or nursing program's number of
- 5 eligible initial prenursing grant applicants for the current
- 6 academic year residing in designated rural areas, as defined in
- 7 part 4830.0100, subpart 3a, as proposed at 16 SR 1529,
- 8 multiplied by the prior year average award amount for prenursing
- 9 grant recipients from the postsecondary system applicable to the
- 10 school or nursing program, multiplied by at least 100 percent;
- ll plus
- B. each school's or nursing program's number of
- 13 eligible initial prenursing grant applicants for the current
- 14 academic year residing outside designated rural areas, as
- 15 defined in part 4830.0100, subpart 3a, as proposed at 16 SR
- 16 1529, multiplied by the prior year average award amount for
- 17 prenursing grant recipients from the postsecondary system
- 18 applicable to the school or nursing program, multiplied by at
- 19 least 100 percent.
- 20 Subp. 8. Priority for proration, second allocation. If
- 21 insufficient funds are available to allocate funds to all
- 22 schools or nursing programs, the executive director shall give
- 23 priority to schools or nursing programs located outside the
- 24 seven county metropolitan area with prenursing grant applicants
- 25 who reside within designated rural areas, as defined in part
- 26 4830.0100, subpart 3a, as proposed at 16 SR 1529.
- 27 The executive director shall notify all participating
- 28 schools and nursing programs in writing of their second
- 29 allocation amount by September 30 if the school or nursing
- 30 program has provided the information specified in subpart 9 by
- 31 the first working day after September 9.
- 32 Subp. 9. Applicant information data. By August 15 each
- 33 year, the executive director will provide each school or nursing
- 34 program with a prenursing grant applicant data form to be
- 35 completed and submitted to the executive director no later than
- 36 the first working day after September 9. Schools or nursing

- l programs that wish to be included in the second allocation
- 2 calculation specified in subpart 7 must provide the following
- 3 information on the data form provided by the executive director
- 4 by the specified deadline date.
- 5 The following information for the current academic year
- 6 will be requested on the data form:
- 7 A. the number of applications received from eligible
- 8 initial prenursing grant applicants who reside in designated
- 9 rural areas, as defined by the board;
- B. the number of applications received from eligible
- ll initial prenursing grant applicants who reside outside
- 12 designated rural areas, as defined in part 4830.0100, subpart
- 13 3a, as proposed at 16 SR 1529;
- C. the estimated amount of prenursing grant funds
- 15 needed to award applicants in item A; and
- D. the estimated amount of prenursing grant funds
- 17 needed to award applicants in item B.
- Subp. 10. Consequences of failure to report. Failure to
- 19 correctly complete and submit the requested information to the
- 20 executive director by the first working day after September 9
- 21 will result in the failure of the school or nursing program to
- 22 be included in the initial award allocation calculation.
- Subp. 11. Reallocation. If funds are available, the
- 24 executive director shall reallocate funds to schools or nursing
- 25 programs requesting additional prenursing grant funds according
- 26 to the formula in subpart 7.
- Subp. 12. Accountability. Each participating school and
- 28 nursing program is accountable for any money disbursed to
- 29 students for prenursing grants. The money may be used only
- 30 during the fiscal year of disbursement. If a student does not
- 31 use a grant because the student does not enroll or withdraws
- 32 from school, the school may use the funds for other eligible
- 33 students or must return the funds to the executive director.
- 34 Subp. 13. Unused funds. When requested by the executive
- 35 director, a school or nursing program shall report on its use of
- 36 funds and shall return unused funds. The executive director

- 1 shall reallocate unused funds to schools or nursing programs
- 2 that desire additional funds.
- 3 Subp. 14. Monitoring recipient service status. A
- 4 participating school or nursing program must assist the
- 5 executive director in monitoring the service status of each
- 6 prenursing grant recipient to determine whether the recipient is
- 7 fulfilling the service requirement specified in part 4830.8520.
- 8 The recipient must provide written documentation annually to the
- 9 executive director regarding current status as a nurse in a
- 10 designated rural area. The school or nursing program must
- 11 provide the executive director with each recipient's most
- 12 current permanent address and telephone number on record at the
- 13 school or nursing program upon graduation or termination of
- 14 enrollment. Upon request of the executive director, the school
- 15 or nursing program must also provide the name, address, and
- 16 telephone number for at least two persons listed on the
- 17 recipient's prenursing grant application as references.
- 18 4830.8540 RANKING APPLICANTS.
- 19 Subpart 1. Classification of applicants. Each applicant
- 20 must be placed in one of the following classifications:
- 21 A. renewal applicant residing in a designated rural
- 22 area;
- B. renewal applicant not residing in a designated
- 24 rural area;
- C. initial applicant residing in a designated rural
- 26 area, and has not previously been enrolled in any nursing
- 27 program or coursework; and
- D. initial applicant not residing in a designated
- 29 rural area, and has not previously been enrolled in any nursing
- 30 program or coursework.
- 31 Subp. la. Order; previous enrollees. Applicants will be
- 32 awarded in the order of the classifications listed in subpart
- 33 l. Initial applicants who have been previously enrolled in a
- 34 nursing program or who have completed some nursing coursework
- 35 are not eligible.

- 2 Subp. 3. Insufficient funds. If insufficient funds are
- 3 available to meet the needs of all eligible applicants, the
- 4 school or nursing program shall make awards to applicants in the
- 5 order specified in subparts 1, la, and 2.
- 6 Subp. 4. Transfer student. A student who received a
- 7 prenursing grant at one school or nursing program and transfers
- 8 to another school or nursing program must be considered a
- 9 renewal applicant for ranking purposes at the school or nursing
- 10 program to which the student transferred. The student must
- 11 continue to demonstrate financial need and complete the
- 12 application process. If no funds are available at the time the
- 13 student transfers, the school or nursing program must give
- 14 priority to the renewal transfer student over an initial
- 15 applicant if funds become available.
- 16 4830.8550 AWARDS.
- 17 Subpart 1. Award calculation. The amount of the grant
- 18 award is a percentage of the sum of the student's Pell grant and
- 19 state grant for which the student is currently eligible. The
- 20 percentage must be determined annually by the executive director
- 21 based upon the money available to the program from state
- 22 appropriations and the estimated financial need of students. If
- 23 the student is not eligible for a Pell grant or state grant for
- 24 the current academic year, the student is not eligible for a
- 25 prenursing grant award.
- 26 Subp. 2. Application of award and disbursement. A
- 27 recipient's total prenursing grant award must be divided by the
- 28 number of terms in the academic year and disbursed accordingly.
- 29 The school or nursing program shall apply each disbursement to
- 30 the recipient's educational costs in the following order:
- 31 tuition, fees, books, supplies, and other expenses. The costs
- 32 must be prorated for each term of the academic year.
- 33 Subp. 3. Minimum award. The minimum award amount for
- 34 full-time attendance is \$100 per academic year.
- 35 Subp. 4. Adjustments to awards. If a recipient's award

- 1 amount decreases because of an adjustment in the student's Pell
- 2 grant or state grant award, the prenursing grant award must be
- 3 reduced. If a recipient's award amount increases because of an
- 4 adjustment in the student's Pell grant or state grant award, the
- 5 prenursing grant award must be increased, if funds are available.
- 6 4830.8570 RECIPIENT RESPONSIBILITIES.
- 7 Subpart 1. Change of address. Until graduation or
- 8 termination of enrollment, the recipient must notify the school
- 9 or nursing program in writing of a change of address within 30
- 10 days of the change. From the time of graduation or termination
- 11 of enrollment until five years after the nursing license is
- 12 received, the recipient must notify the executive director in
- 13 writing of a change in address within 30 days of the change.
- Subp. 2. Service status verification. Each year for up to
- 15 five years after a nursing license is received, on request of
- 16 the executive director, a grant regipient must complete and
- 17 return to the executive director a service status verification
- 18 form provided by the executive director.
- 19 4830.8575 REPORTS BY SCHOOLS OR NURSING PROGRAMS.
- The school or nursing program must collect demographic and
- 21 program activity data as specified by the executive director.
- 22 The school or nursing program shall provide the executive
- 23 director with individual student data upon request.
- 24 End of year program activity and student data reports are
- 25 required by the executive director. The school or nursing
- 26 program must correctly complete and submit those reports and any
- 27 applicable refunds to the executive director no later than the
- 28 first working day after August 9. If the reports are not
- 29 completed correctly and submitted by the deadline, the executive
- 30 director shall withhold the subsequent year's allocation until
- 31 reporting requirements are fully met.
