- 9 6305.0500 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE WITHOUT EXAMINATION.
- [For text of subps 1 to 6, see M.R.]
- Subp. 7. Current nursing education or acceptable nursing
- 12 practice. An applicant who has engaged in acceptable nursing
- 13 practice as defined in part 6310.2600, subpart 2, who has
- 14 graduated from an approved nursing program, or who has completed
- 15 a degree program with a major in nursing during the two years
- 16 immediately preceding application for licensure is exempt from
- 17 the continuing education requirements in subpart 8.
- 18 Verification of acceptable nursing practice must be submitted to
- 19 verify practice dates. If the applicant was employed by an
- 20 institution or agency, an employer shall complete the
- 21 verification. In lieu of an employer, a patient, volunteer
- 22 supervisor, patient's family or physician, instructor, or peer
- 23 can verify acceptable nursing practice. An affidavit of
- 24 graduation or evidence from the nurse licensing agency in
- 25 another jurisdiction or Canadian province must be submitted to
- 26 verify the graduation date.
- Subp. 8. Continuing education. An applicant who has not
- 28 engaged in acceptable nursing practice within the two years
- 29 preceding receipt by the board of the application for licensure
- 30 must comply with items A to D.
- 31 A. The applicant must report the number of months
- 32 since the last date of acceptable nursing practice.
- 33 B. The applicant must submit a verification of
- 34 acceptable nursing practice. If the applicant was employed by
- 35 an institution or agency, an employer shall complete the

- 1 verification. In lieu of an employer, a patient, volunteer
- 2 supervisor, patient's family or physician, an instructor, or a
- 3 peer may verify acceptable nursing practice.
- 4 C. The applicant must participate in and report
- 5 participation in acceptable continuing education as specified in
- 6 part 6310.2800, subparts 3, items A, B, C, E, and F, and 5. If
- 7 the applicant has not engaged in acceptable nursing practice for
- 8 ten years or more, the applicant must successfully complete a
- 9 refresher course or refresher course equivalent as defined in
- 10 part 6310.2600, subpart 9d. If the length of the refresher
- 11 course or its equivalent is less than the hours required in item
- 12 D, other acceptable continuing education must be completed to
- 13 meet the hour requirement. The applicant shall participate in
- 14 the continuing education or complete the refresher course or the
- 15 refresher course equivalent within the 24 months immediately
- 16 preceding board action on the application for licensure.
- D. The applicant must complete the required number of
- 18 contact hours of continuing education. The registered nurse
- 19 must complete one contact hour of acceptable continuing
- 20 education for each month that the applicant was not engaged in
- 21 acceptable practice. The licensed practical nurse must complete
- 22 one contact hour for every two months that the applicant was not
- 23 engaged in acceptable practice. The maximum hours required are
- 24 150 hours for a registered nurse applicant and 75 hours for a
- 25 licensed practical nurse applicant. The continuing education
- 26 must be reported on the form provided by the board.
- 27 If the applicant is required to successfully complete a
- 28 refresher course or its equivalent, the applicant shall report
- 29 the successful completion of the refresher course or refresher
- 30 course equivalent on an affidavit provided by the board. The
- 31 affidavit must be signed by the refresher course provider, the
- 32 preceptor, the instructor, an official of the nursing program,
- 33 or the employer.
- 34 Subp. 9. Clinical component permit to practice. The
- 35 applicant shall have a permit to practice to participate in the
- 36 clinical component of a refresher course or its equivalent with

- 1 the exception of degree granting programs. For the latter, a
- 2 permit may be issued if it is required by the degree granting
- 3 program. For the applicant who is not eligible for a permit
- 4 based on current licensure in another United States
- 5 jurisdiction, a permit shall be issued for use only in the
- 6 refresher course or its equivalent. To obtain this permit, the
- 7 applicant must submit the completed licensure application, fee,
- 8 and a statement of intent to participate in a refresher course
- 9 or refresher course equivalent. The statement of intent must be
- 10 signed by the refresher course provider, the preceptor, the
- 11 instructor, an official of the nursing program, or the
- 12 employer. The statement of intent must contain the request for
- 13 a permit. The board shall issue a permit after the application,
- 14 fee, and statement of intent have been received and evaluated
- 15 for compliance with this chapter. The board shall issue the
- 16 permit for no more than 90 days. This permit is valid only for
- 17 practice as a part of the refresher course or its equivalent.
- 18 While the permit is in effect, the registered nurse may use the
- 19 title registered nurse, abbreviated "RN," and a licensed
- 20 practical nurse may use the title licensed practical nurse,
- 21 abbreviated "LPN." If there is a delay in the completion of the
- 22 clinical portion of the refresher course or its equivalent, the
- 23 applicant shall return the expired permit and complete another
- 24 statement of intent. The board shall issue another permit for
- 25 no more than 90 days.

- 27 6310.2600 DEFINITIONS.
- 28 Subpart 1. Acceptable continuing education activity.
- 29 "Acceptable continuing education activity" means a learning
- 30 experience which meets the criteria established in part
- 31 6310.2800, subpart 3.
- 32 Subp. la. Acceptable nursing practice. "Acceptable
- 33 nursing practice" means employment or volunteer nursing in any
- 34 setting, participation in clinical nursing courses, or any
- 35 combination of these activities. Employment includes those

- 1 positions for which the individual is required to be a nurse.
- 2 For professional nursing practice, the practice must have
- 3 included one or more of the functions defined in Minnesota
- 4 Statutes, section 148.171, paragraph (3). For practical nursing
- 5 practice, the practice must have included one or more of the
- 6 functions defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.171,
- 7 paragraph (5).
- 8 Subp. lb. Blood borne diseases. "Blood borne diseases"
- 9 means diseases that are spread through the exposure to,
- 10 inoculation of, or injection of blood, or through exposure to
- 11 blood contained in human body fluids, tissues or organs. Blood
- 12 borne diseases include infection caused by such agents as the
- 13 human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and hepatitis B virus (HBV).

- 15 Subp. 3. Contact hour. "Contact hour" means 50
- 16 consecutive minutes, except in reference to the class period of
- 17 an educational institution. Class periods of no less than 45
- 18 minutes will be accepted as a contact hour. The number of
- 19 contact hours for a course are determined by the number of class
- 20 credits assigned to the course multiplied by the number of full
- 21 weeks in the term.
- 22 Subp. 4. Continuing education participation period.
- 23 "Continuing education participation period" means the 24-month
- 24 interval of time immediately before the registration renewal
- 25 deadline during which a licensee must fulfill the continuing
- 26 education requirements for registration renewal. The length
- 27 varies for a licensee's first registration period after
- 28 licensure or reregistration, beginning on the date of licensure
- 29 or reregistration and ending on the registration deadline date.
- 30 Subp. 5. Continuing education report form. "Continuing
- 31 education report form" means the printed document provided by
- 32 the board for use in reporting the information required in parts
- 33 6310.2800 to 6310.3000.
- 34 Subp. 5a. Deferment. "Deferment" means postponement of
- 35 participation in and reporting of all or part of the continuing
- 36 education activities required for renewal.

- 1 Subp. 5b. Infection control. "Infection control" means
- 2 programs, procedures, and methods to reduce the transmission of
- 3 agents of infection for the purpose of preventing or decreasing
- 4 the incidence of infectious diseases.

- 6 Subp. 7a. Licensee. "Licensee" means either a
- 7 professional or practical nurse who has been granted a license
- 8 by the board to practice professional or practical nursing in
- 9 Minnesota.
- [For text of subps 8 and 8c, see M.R.]
- 11 Subp. 9. Participation. "Participation" means to be
- 12 present at or in any other manner taking part in an acceptable
- 13 continuing education activity.
- 14 Subp. 9a. Permit. "Permit" means the document issued by
- 15 the board to an applicant for reregistration that authorizes
- 16 practice of professional or practical nursing in Minnesota
- 17 during participation in the clinical portion of a refresher
- 18 course or its equivalent.
- 19 Subp. 9b. Practical nurse. "Practical nurse" means a
- 20 person authorized by the board to engage in the practice of
- 21 practical nursing as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section
- 22 148.171, paragraph (5).
- 23 Subp. 9c. Professional nurse. "Professional nurse" means
- 24 a person authorized by the board to engage in the practice of
- 25 professional nursing as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section
- 26 148.171, paragraph (3).
- 27 Subp. 9d. Refresher course equivalent or equivalent.
- 28 "Refresher course equivalent" or "equivalent" when used to refer
- 29 to a refresher course means an educational activity that
- 30 includes a clinical component and can be used in lieu of a
- 31 refresher course. These activities include a preceptorship, an
- 32 orientation program, a program of study leading to a degree in
- 33 nursing, or a clinical course to enhance nursing skills in a
- 34 clinical area.

- 36 Subp. 11. Registration renewal. "Registration renewal"

- l means the periodic process whereby a licensee who is licensed
- 2 and registered with the board requests and obtains registration
- 3 for the next registration period.
- 4 [For text of subp 12, see M.R.]
- 5 Subp. 13. Registration certificate. "Registration
- 6 certificate" means the document issued by the board to a
- 7 licensee who meets registration or reregistration requirements.
- 8 [For text of subp 14, see M.R.]
- 9 Subp. 15. Registration period. "Registration period"
- 10 means the interval of time for which a registration certificate
- 11 is issued. The initial registration period following licensure
- 12 or reregistration is from six to 29 full calendar months
- 13 starting on the day of licensure or reregistration and ending on
- 14 the last day of the licensee's month of birth in an
- 15 even-numbered year if the year of birth was an even-numbered
- 16 year or in an odd-numbered year if the year of birth was in an
- 17 odd-numbered year. Subsequent registration periods are 24-month
- 18 periods. For registration renewal, the period starts on the
- 19 first day of the month following expiration of the previous
- 20 registration period. The period ends the last day of the
- 21 licensee's month of birth in an even- or odd-numbered year
- 22 according to the licensee's year of birth.

- 24 6310.2700 PURPOSE.
- Parts 6310.2600 to 6310.3100 establish the requirements and
- 26 procedures for registration for professional nurses and
- 27 practical nurses including continuing education.
- Parts 6310.3100 and 6310.3200 establish the requirements
- 29 and procedures for reregistration. Parts 6310.3300 to 6310.3700
- 30 establish requirements and procedures for change of name and
- 31 address, duplicate and replacement documents, and verification
- 32 of Minnesota license.
- 33 6310.2800 REGISTRATION RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS.
- 34 Subpart 1. Renewal application. A licensee shall submit
- 35 an application for renewal by the deadline for renewal of

- 1 registration. Failure to receive the registration renewal
- 2 application mailed by the board does not relieve the licensee of
- 3 the obligation to renew registration by the deadline.
- 4 Subp. 2. Fee. The licensee shall pay the fee specified in
- 5 part 6310.3600, subpart 1.
- 6 Subp. 3. Continuing education. Continuing education
- 7 requirements for the licensed practical nurse begin for
- 8 registration periods that begin on or after November 1, 1993.
- 9 The report of continuing education is due by the application
- 10 deadline for subsequent renewals of registration. A registered
- 11 nurse shall participate in the ratio of at least one contact
- 12 hour of acceptable continuing education for each month of
- 13 registration. A licensed practical nurse shall participate in
- 14 the ratio of at least one contact hour of acceptable continuing
- 15 education for each two months of registration.
- 16 Continuing education in infection control is required for
- 17 registration periods that begin on or after November 1, 1993.
- 18 During each registration period, two of the contact hours must
- 19 be on the subject of infection control, including blood borne
- 20 diseases. For registration periods of less than 24 months, one
- 21 contact hour in infection control is required.
- 22 For a continuing education activity to be acceptable for
- 23 renewal of registration, the criteria in items A to G must be
- 24 met.
- 25 A. The content must be designed to enhance the
- 26 licensee's ability to practice nursing. The content may include
- 27 such topics as those included in a nursing curriculum. For
- 28 licensees who are not engaged in direct patient care but who are
- 29 required to be licensed as a nurse in their employment, the
- 30 content may include topics that may assist the licensees in the
- 31 performance of their responsibilities. Unacceptable content
- 32 includes subject matter that is inaccurate, outdated, or not
- 33 generally accepted within the health care community.
- 34 B. The activity must last at least one contact hour.
- 35 Licensees may report an activity that lasts more than one
- 36 contact hour but less than an additional contact hour.

- 1 Licensees shall not claim contact hours in which they did not
- 2 participate, for example, if they arrived late or left early.
- 3 C. There must be written objectives which describe
- 4 what a licensee can expect to learn.
- 5 D. The activity must be completed during the
- 6 licensee's continuing education participation period.
- 7 E. The activity must be taught by someone other than
- 8 the licensee.
- 9 F. The instructor must be qualified to teach the
- 10 content. Qualifications include education, preparation of
- 11 information related to the objectives for the activity, or
- 12 experience.
- G. The following information regarding the continuing
- 14 education activity must be obtainable by the licensee:
- 15 (1) the written objectives;
- 16 (2) the name and qualifications of the
- 17 instructor;
- 18 (3) the contact hours or their equivalent
- 19 assigned to the activity;
- 20 (4) the dates of the activity;
- 21 (5) the title of the activity; and
- 22 (6) an attendance statement that verifies that
- 23 the licensee was present at or participated in the activity.
- 24 Subp. 4. Exceptions. If the continuing education activity
- 25 has been approved by another health licensing board or
- 26 association or if the licensee is currently certified by a
- 27 national professional nursing organization, only the criteria
- 28 for acceptability in item A or B must be met.
- 29 A. If the activity has been approved by another
- 30 health licensing board or association, the criteria in subitems
- 31 (1) to (5) must be met.
- 32 (1) The activity must last at least one contact
- 33 hour. Licensees may report an activity that lasts more than one
- 34 contact hour but less than an additional contact hour.
- 35 Licensees shall not claim contact hours in which they did not
- 36 participate, for example, if they arrived late or left early.

- 1 (2) The activity must be completed during the
- 2 licensee's continuing education participation period.
- 3 (3) The activity must be taught by someone other
- 4 than the licensee.
- 5 (4) The instructor must be qualified to teach the
- 6 content. Qualifications include education, preparation of
- 7 information related to the objectives for the activity, or
- 8 experience.
- 9 (5) The following information regarding the
- 10 continuing education activity must be obtainable by the licensee:
- 11 (a) the name and qualifications of the
- 12 instructor;
- 13 (b) the contact hours or their equivalent
- 14 assigned to the activity;
- 15 (c) the dates of the activity;
- 16 (d) the title of the activity; and
- 17 (e) an attendance statement that verifies
- 18 that the licensee was present at or participated in the activity.
- B. If the licensee has a current certificate from a
- 20 national professional nursing organization, the criteria in
- 21 subitems (1) to (6) must be met.
- 22 (1) The initial certification must be based on
- 23 predetermined standards for specialty certification assuring
- 24 that the licensee has acquired knowledge and skill in the
- 25 specialty.
- 26 (2) If the current specialty certificate is a
- 27 recertification certificate, it must be based on meeting
- 28 periodic continuing education or other current competency
- 29 certification requirements.
- 30 (3) The certificate must be issued by a national
- 31 nursing or medical organization.
- 32 (4) A copy of the certificate must be submitted
- 33 and it must be current at the time of submission.
- 34 (5) The infection control contact hours must be
- 35 met and reported.
- 36 (6) The licensee shall not use the practice

- 1 specialty certificate as a substitute for any previously
- 2 deferred contact hours.
- 3 Subp. 5. Other acceptable continuing education
- 4 activities. A licensee may do one of the following within the
- 5 licensee's participation period and apply up to ten contact
- 6 hours to the activity:
- 7 A. publish an article or book on nursing or health
- 8 care related issues;
- 9 B. deliver a professional paper related to nursing or
- 10 health care;
- 11 C. participate on a professional panel that addresses
- 12 nursing or health care related issues;
- D. participate in quality assurance or risk
- 14 management studies; or
- E. engage in nursing or health care related research.
- Subp. 6. [See repealer.]
- Subp. 6a. Deadline for submission. The renewal
- 18 application, fee, and continuing education report must be
- 19 received in the board office on or before the last day of the
- 20 month preceding the licensee's registration expiration. This
- 21 receipt deadline is referred to as the application deadline. If
- 22 the application deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, receipt
- 23 by the board on the following business day constitutes timely
- 24 submission.
- 25 If the licensee's application is received in the board
- 26 office after the application deadline, a late application fee is
- 27 required. If the application is received after the licensee's
- 28 registration expires, the applicant is not eligible for renewal
- 29 of registration.
- 30 Subp. 7. True information. The licensee shall submit
- 31 true, complete, and accurate information. Falsification of any
- 32 evidence for any registration period or falsification or
- 33 omission of information provides grounds for disciplinary action.
- 34 Subp. 8. Retention of information. Each licensee shall
- 35 keep information documenting each continuing education activity
- 36 submitted to meet registration renewal requirements. The

- 1 licensee shall retain the information for two years after the
- 2 continuing education activities are reported to the board on the
- 3 continuing education report form.
- 4 Subp. 9. Variance. On presentation of convincing evidence
- 5 by a registration or reregistration applicant, the board shall
- 6 grant a variance from the following requirements:
- 7 A. for a receipt deadline, evidence of mail delay;
- 8 B. for a fee, evidence of financial hardship;
- 9 C. for document submission, evidence of loss of records
- 10 through fire or other disaster; and
- 11 D. for the required number of continuing education contact
- 12 hours, evidence of unexpected illness or personal tragedy.
- 13 6310.2900 REGISTRATION RENEWAL PROCEDURES.
- 14 Subpart 1. Application. The board shall mail a
- 15 registration renewal application at least three full calendar
- 16 months before a licensee's registration expiration date to the
- 17 licensee's last known address. Placing the registration renewal
- 18 application in first class United States mail, postage prepaid,
- 19 and addressed to the licensee at the licensee's last known
- 20 address constitutes valid service. Failure to receive the
- 21 registration renewal application mailed by the board does not
- 22 relieve the licensee of the obligation to renew registration by
- 23 the deadline.
- The licensee shall submit the completed, signed
- 25 application, fee, and continuing education report to the board
- 26 in time for the application to be received in the board office
- 27 by the application deadline.
- The board shall return an application that is received
- 29 without a fee or an application that is incomplete. The
- 30 licensee must resubmit the application and fee within 30 days or
- 31 by the licensee's registration expiration date, whichever is
- 32 later. The board shall record on the application the date
- 33 mailed and calculate the 30 days from that date. The board
- 34 shall determine timely submission by receipt date.
- 35 Subp. 2. Fee. The licensee shall submit the fee with the

- 1 application for renewal by the application deadline. The fee
- 2 must be made payable to the Minnesota Board of Nursing. The
- 3 board shall return a fee that is received without an application
- 4 or is made out incorrectly. The licensee shall resubmit the fee
- 5 with an application within 30 days or by the licensee's
- 6 registration expiration date, whichever is later. The board
- 7 shall record on the notice the date mailed and calculate the 30
- 8 days from that date. The board shall determine timely
- 9 submission by receipt date. If the requirements for renewal of
- 10 registration are not met, the fee is not refundable.
- 11 Subp. 3. Report of continuing education. The report of
- 12 continuing education shall be a part of the renewal of
- 13 registration application. The board shall require the name of
- 14 the activity, the date of the activity, and the number of
- 15 contact hours for each of the activities. The board shall
- 16 provide a section on the continuing education report form for
- 17 the licensee to report participation in infection control
- 18 continuing education.
- 19 Licensees shall report the required information on the
- 20 continuing education report form. Every licensee shall report
- 21 participation in the required amount of infection control
- 22 continuing education. A professional nurse who has been
- 23 certified in a nursing specialty may submit a copy of the
- 24 practice specialty certificate in lieu of reporting
- 25 participation in the remaining required number of contact hours.
- 26 Each licensee shall verify that the continuing education
- 27 activities met all the criteria in part 6310.2800 and that the
- 28 information contained on the continuing education report form is
- 29 true in every respect. The licensee shall sign and date the
- 30 application and continuing education report form.
- 31 Subp. 4. Application deadline. The application and fee
- 32 must be received in the board office by the last day of the
- 33 month preceding the month in which the licensee's registration
- 34 expires. If the last day of the month falls on a weekend or
- 35 holiday, the application must be received in the board office by
- 36 the next working day. If the application and fee are received

- 1 after the deadline, the board shall return the application and
- 2 fee to the licensee. The licensee shall pay the late
- 3 application fee, the amount specified in part 6310.3600, subpart
- 4 1. If the application and fee are received after the expiration
- 5 of registration, the board shall return the renewal application
- 6 and fee. The board shall mail a reregistration application to
- 7 the licensee.
- 8 Subp. 5. Incomplete application; notice. The board shall
- 9 notify the licensee within 30 calendar days of receipt by the
- 10 board of any deficiency. On the deficiency notice, the board
- 11 shall note if the application, the continuing education report,
- 12 or the fee submitted by a licensee is incomplete, incorrect, or
- 13 not in compliance with part 6310.2800 and this part. The board
- 14 shall record the mailing date on the deficiency notice. The
- 15 licensee shall correct the deficiency within 30 calendar days of
- 16 the date recorded on the notice or by the licensee's
- 17 registration expiration date, whichever is later. The renewal
- 18 application, fee, and other documents will be retained by the
- 19 board whenever possible.
- 20 Subp. 6. Insufficient hours. If a licensee does not have
- 21 enough contact hours of acceptable continuing education to
- 22 report, the licensee has the following options listed in items A
- 23 to C.
- 24 A. Complete the required number of contact hours
- 25 during the month following the application deadline in which
- 26 case this month shall not be used as part of the subsequent
- 27 continuing education participation period.
- 28 B. Defer the number of contact hours that the
- 29 licensee is lacking. The deferred hours shall be added to the
- 30 contact hours required in the immediately succeeding continuing
- 31 education period. Hours may be deferred if there are no current
- 32 deferred contact hours required of the licensee. If the
- 33 licensee does not renew for the continuing education
- 34 participation period that included the deferred hours, the
- 35 deferred hours shall be required for reregistration.
- 36 C. Allow registration to expire and reregister.

- 2 Subp. 7. Noncompliance with continuing education
- 3 requirement. A licensee provides grounds for disciplinary
- 4 action if the licensee cannot meet one of the options for
- 5 insufficient hours or fails an audit and is not eligible to
- 6 defer.
- 7 Subp. 8. Nullification of incomplete registration renewal.
- 8 The board shall return a renewal application and fee received
- 9 after the licensee's registration expiration date unless the
- 10 expiration date falls on a weekend or holiday. The board shall
- 11 mail a reregistration application to the licensee. The board
- 12 shall nullify incomplete registration renewal applications that
- 13 are not completed, returned, and received by the board within 30
- 14 days following notification of the deficiency or by the
- 15 licensee's expiration date, whichever is later. For a nullified
- 16 application, the fee shall be forfeited and the application and
- 17 other documents may be destroyed according to Minnesota
- 18 Statutes, section 138.17, subdivision 7.
- 19 Subp. 9. Removal of name from list. The names of
- 20 licensees who do not return the complete renewal application,
- 21 renewal fees, and late application fees by the registration
- 22 expiration date shall be removed from the list of individuals
- 23 authorized to practice professional or practical nursing.
- 24 Subp. 10. Initial registration. An individual who is
- 25 issued a license by the board shall also be registered by the
- 26 board. The licensure fee shall serve as payment for the initial
- 27 registration period.
- 28 6310.3000 SUBSTANTIATION OF PARTICIPATION IN CONTINUING
- 29 EDUCATION.
- 30 Subpart 1. Substantiation of continuing education
- 31 activity. At the time of renewal, the board shall randomly
- 32 select a sample of licensees and require substantiation of
- 33 participation in the activities that the licensees reported on
- 34 their continuing education report form. The licensee shall
- 35 submit documents or written statements that verify the following:

- 1 A. the name of the activity;
- B. the date of the activity;
- 3 C. the number of contact hours or hours equivalent to
- 4 contact hours;
- 5 D. the objectives;
- E. the name and qualifications of the instructor; and
- 7 F. presence at or participation in the activity.
- 8 Licensees who used their advanced nursing practice
