7 2500.0100 DEFINITIONS.

9 Subp. 3a. Blood borne diseases. "Blood borne diseases"
10 means diseases that are spread through the exposure to,
11 inoculation, or injection of blood; or exposure to blood
12 contained in body fluids, tissues, or organs. Blood borne
13 diseases include infection caused by such agents as the human
14 immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and hepatitis B virus (HBV).

15 Subp. 3b. Board. "Board" means the Minnesota Board of
16 Chiropractic Examiners.

18 Subp. 7a. Infection control. "Infection control" means
19 programs, procedures, and methods to reduce the transmission of
20 agents of infection for the purpose of preventing or decreasing
21 the incidence of infectious diseases.

23 2500.1200 CONTINUING EDUCATION.

25 Subp. 2. Biennial requirement. Except as otherwise
26 provided in this part, every person licensed to practice
27 chiropractic in this state shall, as a prerequisite for the
28 continued renewal of a license, attend a minimum of 40
29 continuing education units during the two preceding calendar
30 years of continuing education courses recognized and approved by
31 the board. At least six of the continuing education units shall
32 be devoted to radiographic safety, technique, and/or
33 interpretation. At least two of the continuing education units
34 must be in the subject of infection control, including blood
35 borne diseases. Continuing education in infection control is
