Approved offspring segregation plan. "Approved offspring segregation plan" means a plan by which swine are 14 weaned and isolated from the herd of origin under the direction 15 of the board. 16 [For text of subps 2 to 3b, see M.R.] 17 Subp. 3d. Finishing herd. "Finishing herd" means a herd 18 of feeder swine being raised on premises where there are no 19 breeding swine. For purposes of blood testing, swine must be in 20 21 the herd for at least 30 days. [For text of subps 4 to 5b, see M.R.] 22 23 Subp. 5c. Monitoring sample. "Monitoring sample" means a herd sampling procedure as follows: 24 if breeding swine are present, and there are: 25 Α. 26 (1) fewer than 11 breeding swine, test all; (2) 11 to 35 breeding swine, test ten; or 27 28 (3) 36 or more breeding swine, test 30 percent or 30 head, whichever is lower; or 29 30 if no breeding swine are present, and there are: B. - 5 swine" means breeding or feeding swine sold in Minnesota through
- 6 a swine concentration point.

- 8 1705.2430 INFECTED HERD QUARANTINE AND DISPOSAL PROCEDURES.
- 9 [For text of subpart 1, see M.R.]
- 10 Subp. 2. Epidemiological investigation. If species of
- ll animals other than swine have been diagnosed as having
- 12 pseudorabies, the state or federal district veterinarian shall
- 13 conduct an epidemiological investigation of any swine on the
- 14 premises. The investigation must include blood testing of a
- 15 monitoring sample of the swine herd. The owner shall pay the
- 16 fees associated with this testing unless state funds are
- 17 available for this purpose. If pseudorabies reactors are
- 18 disclosed, or if the owner refuses to cooperate in carrying out
- 19 the test, the swine herd must be quarantined in accordance with
- 20 the quarantine procedures of this part.
- Subp. 3. Permitted disposal. Swine from a quarantined
- 22 herd must be disposed of pursuant to item A or B.
- 23 A. Market or breeding swine or other infected or
- 24 exposed species may only be sold for slaughter via a federally
- 25 approved slaughter market, public stockyard, packer buying
- 26 station, or directly to a slaughter plant accompanied by an
- 27 owner's notice of shipment.
- B. Feeder pigs may only be sold, loaned, leased, or
- 29 moved for custom/contract feeding to an approved premises and
- 30 must be accompanied by an owner's notice of shipment. The
- 31 approved premises must be a feedlot where purchased quarantined
- 32 swine can be fed out in isolation from other domestic animals
- 33 and where a state or federal veterinarian has determined that no
- 34 breeding swine are on the premises, and the feedlot owner agrees
- 35 to sell all the swine from the feedlot directly for slaughter

- 1 accompanied by an owner's notice of shipment.

- 3 Subp. 4. Movement to another location. If movement is
- 4 otherwise allowable under parts 1705.2400 to 1705.2530,
- 5 quarantined swine may be moved from their farm of origin to
- 6 another location only with the prior approval of the district
- 7 veterinarian. The new location may not be within the northern
- 8 zone or within two miles of a qualified or controlled vaccinated
- 9 herd. The new location must be quarantined by the district
- 10 veterinarian and subject to the same restrictions as the
- ll original quarantined premises. All of the swine that are moved
- 12 except for those under an approved offspring segregation plan
- 13 must be vaccinated for pseudorabies and the herd must be on an
- 14 official herd cleanup plan.
- 15 1705.2434 APPROVED PREMISES PROCEDURES.
- Subpart 1. Qualifications. No person may accept feeder
- 17 swine from quarantined herds for purposes of feeding them out
- 18 unless a permit is obtained from the board. A person seeking a
- 19 permit must agree to provide the board's representative access
- 20 during business hours to the feedlot and records required by
- 21 this part. The board shall grant an approved premises permit
- 22 when otherwise authorized by this part. The permit allows the
- 23 person to whom it is issued to obtain feeder pigs from
- 24 quarantined herds and feed them out. The approved premises must
- 25 comply with the following requirements:

- 27 F. Hogs must be sold directly to slaughter
- 28 accompanied by an owner's notice of shipment as required in part
- 29 1705.2430, subpart 3, item A. One copy must be sent to the

- 33 1705.2440 RELEASE OF QUARANTINE.
- 34 Subpart 1. Methods. Swine herd quarantine release may be
- 35 accomplished by any of the methods in items A to D.

- A. Depopulation; repopulation: The entire herd may
- 2 be sold to slaughter accompanied by an owner's notice of
- 3 shipment. The premises must be cleaned and disinfected under
- 4 the direction of the board. The quarantine must be released 30
- 5 days after completion of the cleaning and disinfection. If
- 6 cleaning and disinfection are not done, the hog facility may
- 7 stand empty for 12 months and the quarantine must then be
- 8 released.

- 10 C. Offspring segregation: Under an approved
- ll offspring segregation plan, progeny of a quarantined herd may be
- 12 moved to a premises different from that of the herd of origin,
- 13 and themselves be quarantined. All of these pigs must be tested
- 14 for pseudorabies no sooner than 30 days after the isolation. If
- 15 100 percent of these tests are negative for pseudorabies, the
- 16 quarantine on the progeny herd must be released.

- 19 1705.2450 PSEUDORABIES TRACE TO SOURCE OR DESTINATION HERDS.

- 21 Subp. 2. Pseudorabies diagnosed in recently purchased
- 22 swine. If pseudorabies is diagnosed in breeding or feeder swine
- 23 which have been purchased from or sold to another swine producer
- 24 within the preceding 12 months, the board shall require a
- 25 pseudorabies test of a monitoring sample of the herd of the
- 26 seller or buyer.

- 28 1705.2460 INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF BREEDING SWINE.
- 29 Subpart 1. Health certificate. No person may sell, lease,
- 30 exhibit, loan, or move for contract farrowing any breeding swine
- 31 within the state except to slaughter unless the swine are
- 32 accompanied by a health certificate or test chart provided by
- 33 the seller which includes:
- A. identification by an eartag, tattoo, brand, or ear
- 35 notch recognized by a breed association; and

- 2 Subp. 2. Restricted-movement classification. Breeding
- 3 swine sold through a swine concentration point are
- 4 restricted-movement breeding swine.

- 6 Subp. 8. Other restricted-movement swine. All swine which
- 7 are maintained in contact with restricted-movement breeding
- 8 swine in the herd of destination are also restricted-movement
- 9 swine.
- 10 Swine classified as restricted-movement swine because of
- 11 exposure to restricted-movement breeding swine may not be resold
- 12 except to slaughter unless they are tested negative to
- 13 pseudorabies pursuant to subpart 7.

- 15 1705.2470 INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF FEEDER PIGS.

- Subp. 2. [See repealer.]
- Subp. 2a. Movement into northern zone. Feeder pigs may
- 19 only be moved into the northern zone, as described in part
- 20 1705.2472, subpart 1, if they otherwise meet the requirements of
- 21 this part.

- 23 1705.2472 CONTROL AND ERADICATION OF PSEUDORABIES.
- 24 Subpart 1. Zoning of state. For purposes of controlling
- 25 the spread of pseudorabies and eventually eradicating the
- 26 disease, the state is divided into two zones, a northern zone
- 27 and a southern zone. The northern zone includes the counties of
- 28 Washington, Ramsey, Hennepin, Wright, Meeker, Kandiyohi,
- 29 Chippewa, Swift, Big Stone, and all counties to the north of
- 30 them. The southern zone includes all counties not included in
- 31 the northern zone.
- 32 Subp. 2. Testing requirements.
- 33 A. Negative test before movement. Feeder swine
- 34 moving from the premises of origin must test negative for
- 35 pseudorabies within 30 days prior to movement unless they

- l originate from one of the following source herds:
- 2 (1) pseudorabies-monitored herd;
- 3 (2) qualified pseudorabies-negative herd;
- 4 (3) pseudorabies-controlled vaccinated herd; or
- 5 (4) Stages III, IV, or V low-prevalence
- 6 pseudorabies areas.
- 7 C. Proof of origin. Proof of the status or location
- 8 of the herd of origin of all feeder pigs sold through a swine
- 9 concentration point must be submitted to the sales management by
- 10 the owner or the dealer who brings them in for sale.
- 11 D. Feeder pig identification. All feeder pigs sold
- 12 must be identified with a metal eartag or a legible pseudorabies
- 13 monitored herd number ear tattoo or eartag imprinted with the
- 14 monitored herd number assigned to that herd.
- 15 E. Prevention of exposure. While in transit through
- 16 marketing channels, all feeder pigs from monitored herds must be
- 17 maintained so that they are not exposed to swine of unknown
- 18 pseudorabies status or maintained in facilities or trucks
- 19 contaminated by those swine. Failure to do so causes them to
- 20 lose their monitored status.
- 21 F. Movement into northern zone. Only breeding swine
- 22 that have had a negative pseudorabies test within the last 30.
- 23 days or have originated from a qualified herd may be moved into
- 24 the northern zone.
- Subp. 3. Participation in the national pseudorabies
- 26 eradication program. For the purposes of the eradication of
- 27 pseudorabies in Minnesota:
- 28 A. Efforts must be made to maintain the northern zone
- 29 as a low-prevalence (Stage III) area. When such a status is
- 30 maintained, it will be permissible for the feeder pig producers
- 31 in that area to sell their feeder pigs without further testing.
- 32 B. In order to maintain the Stage III status, a
- 33 system of surveillance must be carried out annually.
- 34 1705.2474 PSEUDORABIES MONITORED HERD PROCEDURES.
- 35 Subpart 1. Attaining monitored status. In order for a

- 1 herd to attain a pseudorabies monitored herd status, a
- 2 monitoring sample of the herd must test negative for
- 3 pseudorabies. Testing must be done at the owner's expense
- 4 unless state funds are available for this purpose.
- 5 [For text of subp 2, see M.R.]
- 6 Subp. 3. Annual remonitoring. All herds must have an
- 7 annual negative test of a monitoring sample of the herd on a
- 8 date within 30 days of the anniversary date of the original
- 9 monitoring test as required in subpart 1.
- 10 For finishing herds that have completed an initial
- ll monitoring test, confirmation of all out status for the herd may
- 12 be accepted in lieu of an annual remonitoring test. The all out
- 13 status must be confirmed in writing by the board.

- 15 1705.2476 PSEUDORABIES SURVEILLANCE AND CONTROL OF SPREAD.
- 16 Subpart 1. Purpose. The surveillance and control programs
- 17 in this part are designed to eradicate pseudorabies from
- 18 Minnesota.
- 19 Subp. 2. Slaughter plant surveillance. The board shall
- 20 cooperate with the United States Department of Agriculture in
- 21 the pseudorabies testing of cull boars or sows at all slaughter
- 22 plants and in the identification of their herds of origin. All
- 23 herds determined to be pseudorabies-positive must be quarantined
- 24 under parts 1705.2430 to 1705.2450.
- Subp. 3. [See repealer.]
- Subp. 4. Circle testing around all new qualified or
- 27 controlled vaccinated herds. The board shall require a test of
- 28 a monitoring sample of swine in herds within a one and one-half
- 29 mile radius of all new Minnesota qualified pseudorabies-negative
- 30 or controlled vaccinated herds. At the time of the circle
- 31 testing, qualified, controlled vaccinated, or monitored herds
- 32 that have been tested within the last year need not be retested.
- 33 If positive titres are disclosed on this test, or the owner
- 34 refuses to allow the herd to be tested, the herd must be
- 35 considered to be an infected herd and must be quarantined. This

- l circle testing must be done at state expense if the funds are
- 2 available.
- [For text of subp 5, see M.R.]
- 4 Subp. 6. Circle testing around quarantined herds. The
- 5 board shall require a test of a monitoring sample of swine in
- 6 herds within a one and one-half mile radius of the following
- 7 herds:
- 8 A. all pseudorabies quarantined herds in the northern
- 9 zone; and
- 10 B. all new pseudorabies quarantined herds in any part
- ll of the state disclosed to be infected.
- 12 At the time of the circle testing, qualified, controlled
- 13 vaccinated, or monitored herds that have been tested within the
- 14 last year need not be retested. If positive titres are
- 15 disclosed on this test, or the owner refuses to test, the herd
- 16 must be considered an infected herd and placed under
- 17 quarantine. This testing must be done at state expense if the
- 18 funds are available.
- 19 Subp. 7. Mandatory herd monitoring. As part of the
- 20 national pseudorabies eradication program, all swine herds in
- 21 Minnesota must be annually monitored at the owners' expense. A
- 22 monitoring sample of each herd must be tested.
- The annual remonitoring may be discontinued when the area
- 24 in which the herd is located becomes a Stage III area.
- Subp. 8. Quarantined herd cleanup. The owners of all
- 26 quarantined herds in Minnesota must sign an approved official
- 27 pseudorabies herd cleanup plan.
- Herd cleanup testing must be paid for by state or federal
- 29 funds. If state or federal funds are not available, herd
- 30 cleanup is not mandated, but may be voluntarily done at the
- 31 owner's expense.
- 32 1705.2480 QUALIFIED PSEUDORABIES-NEGATIVE HERD PROCEDURES.
- 33 Subpart 1. Qualifications. To qualify a herd for
- 34 qualified pseudorabies-negative herd status:
- 35 A. the herd must have been free of pseudorabies for

- 1 the previous six months;
- B. all breeding stock six months of age or older must
- 3 be negative to an official pseudorabies test;
- 4 C. the offspring over four months of age must be
- 5 negative for pseudorabies using the following testing schedule:
- 6 [For text of subitems (1) to (3), see M.R.]
- 7 D. the herd owner must sign an agreement to comply
- 8 with parts 1705.2400 to 1705.2530.
- 9 [For text of subp 2, see M.R.]
- 10 Subp. 3. Requalification testing. The pseudorabies status
- 11 of a qualified pseudorabies-negative herd must be monitored and
- 12 its status maintained by having a negative test of at least 25
- 13 percent of the breeding herd every 80 to 100 days. All breeding
- 14 swine must be subject to at least one official test once a
- 15 year. No swine may be tested twice in one year to comply with
- 16 the 25 percent test requirement.
- 17 All qualified herds must use one of the following herd
- 18 testing schedules:
- 19 A. Test 25 percent of the breeding herd and test
- 20 offspring every 90 days as outlined in subpart 1, item C; or
- B. Test ten percent of the breeding herd every 30
- 22 days and test offspring every 90 days as outlined in subpart 1,
- 23 item C.
- 24 If there are ten or fewer swine at least six months of age
- 25 in the herd at any quarterly requalification test, all swine at
- 26 least six months of age must be tested.
- 27 If the breeding herd or offspring is maintained on more
- 28 than one premises, the appropriate percentage of the animals on
- 29 each premises must be tested for each requalification.

- 31 1705.2490 PSEUDORABIES-CONTROLLED VACCINATED HERD PROCEDURES.
- [For text of subps 1 to 3, see M.R.]
- 33 Subp. 4. Sale of animals. Unvaccinated progeny from a
- 34 pseudorabies-controlled vaccinated herd may be sold in Minnesota
- 35 for breeding or feeding purposes without further testing.

- Vaccinated animals from a pseudorabies-controlled
- 2 vaccinated herd may be sold for breeding purposes only with a
- 3 negative official pseudorabies test within 30 days prior to the
- 4 sale.
- 5 Subp. 5. Quarantine. If a pseudorabies-controlled
- 6 vaccinated herd is determined to be infected with pseudorabies,
- 7 the herd must be quarantined and the owner must comply with part
- 8 1705.2440 to have the quarantine released.
- 9 Subp. 6. Epidemiological evaluation. If one of the
- 10 herd-monitoring tests discloses in one or more animals low
- 11 titres (1:8 or less) which may be caused by vaccination maternal
- 12 antibodies, an epidemiological evaluation must be conducted by
- 13 the district veterinarian. This evaluation may include a retest
- 14 of the titred swine in 30 days and a test of 20 other
- 15 unvaccinated animals over four months of age.
- During the process of this epidemiological evaluation,
- 17 swine from this herd are temporarily ineligible for sale except
- 18 to slaughter.
- 19 Failure to allow this evaluation will result in herd
- 20 quarantine and the loss of pseudorabies-controlled vaccinated
- 21 herd status.
- The final determination of the status of the herd must be
- 23 made by the district veterinarian involved.
- 24 1705.2510 EXHIBITION OF SWINE.

- Subp. 5. Out-of-state swine. Out-of-state swine, when
- 27 exhibited in Minnesota, must meet Minnesota's importation
- 28 requirements in parts 1700.2600 to 1700.3000, exhibition
- 29 requirements in parts 1715.0100 to 1715.0190, and the exhibition
- 30 requirements of this part.
- 31 RENUMBER. In the next and subsequent editions of Minnesota
- 32 Rules, the revisor of statutes shall renumber the part numbers,
- 33 subparts, and items in column A to the corresponding part
- 34 numbers and subparts in column B.
