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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Elevator Inspection; Fees

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- 5 Rules as Adopted
- 6 5226.0100 PERMITS AND FEES FOR INSTALLATIONS AND ALTERATIONS.
- 7 A person, firm, or corporation that seeks to install or
- 8 alter an elevator shall first obtain a permit from the
- 9 department, or with a municipality that is authorized by law to
- 10 issue a permit, before beginning installation or alteration. An
- 11 application for a permit must be submitted on forms from the
- 12 department or an authorized municipality. Plans and
- 13 specifications describing the permitted work must be submitted
- 14 with the application for a permit. A permit will be issued to
- 15 the applicant when the plans and specifications have been
- l6 approved and the appropriate permit fee has been paid. The
- 17 permit issued by the department or an authorized municipality is
- 18 only valid for work commenced within 12 months of issuance and
- 19 completed within two years of issuance.
- The department's fees for a permit to install or alter an
- 21 elevator are:
- 22 A. A permit fee to install or alter an elevator is
- 23 \$100, and \$500 if work that requires a permit is begun without a
- 24 permit.
- B. Inspection fees for installation and alteration of
- 26 permitted elevator work are 1-1/2 percent of the total cost of
- 27 the permitted work for labor and materials including related
- 28 electrical and mechanical equipment. The total inspection fee
- 29 shall not exceed \$1,000 per permit. The cost of special
- 30 decorative fixtures in the permitted work may be deducted from
- 31 the cost of the permitted elevator work up to a maximum of five
- 32 percent of the total cost of the permitted work upon approval of
- 33 the commissioner.
- 34 C. An elevator that passes department inspection will
- 35 be issued an operating permit by the department.

- D. Vertical reciprocating conveyors, (American
- 2 Society of Mechanical Engineers/American National Standards
- 3 Institute Standard B20.1) are subject to filing and inspection
- 4 fees for new and altered installations, but are exempt from
- 5 routine inspection by an elevator inspector.
- 6 5226.0200 FEES.
- 7 Subpart 1. Inspection fees. The fees for routine or
- 8 periodic inspection of existing elevators are:
- 9 A. two stop elevators, \$50;
- B. three stop elevators, \$75;
- 11 C. four stop elevators, \$100;
- D. five stop elevators, \$125;
- E. six or more stop elevators, \$150; and
- 14 F. escalators and moving walks, \$100.
- 15 Subp. 2. Exceptions. Vertical reciprocating conveyors,
- 16 endless belt lifts, dock hoists, stage lifts, special purpose
- 17 personal hoists, and mechanized garage parking devices are not
- 18 subject to routine or periodic inspection by the department
- 19 unless an accident occurs or a complaint is filed.
- Subp. 3. Elevator inspector application and renewal fees.
- 21 The fee for elevator inspector application is \$50. An annual
- 22 inspector certificate may be renewed for a fee of \$25. If a
- 23 certificate is not renewed within 30 days of the expiration
- 24 date, the fee for renewal is \$50.
- 25 5226.0300 CONTRACTOR LICENSE FEE.
- The fee for initial application and initial license of an
- 27 elevator contractor is \$500. The fee to renew a license is
- 28 \$125. A revoked license may be renewed by payment of the
- 29 initial application fee. The same fees are required for
- 30 elevator contractors operating under a temporary license. The
- 31 contractor is responsible for carrying all appropriate
- 32 insurance, meeting all bonding requirements, and meeting all
- 33 federal, state, and local law and code requirements.
