6 7861.0020 LICENSED ORGANIZATION.

8 Subp. 8. Renewals. The following items apply to license
9 renewals:

10 A. To renew a license at the end of a term, an
11 organization must submit to the board a complete renewal
12 application on a form prescribed by the board at least 60 days
13 before the expiration of the organization's existing license. A
14 renewal application is not complete until it contains the
15 information required by subparts 3 and 4 and a completed expense
16 calculation on a form prescribed by the board.

17 Complete applications received by the board less than 60
18 days before the expiration of the applicant's existing license
19 will be considered pursuant to this part but, if the applicant
20 is entitled to a renewed license, the license will not be
21 renewed by the director until the first day of the month
22 following the expiration of 60 days after the board has received
23 the complete application. An organization shall not continue
24 gambling after the expiration of its license unless and until it
25 receives a renewed license.

27 D. An organization that the director determines has
28 failed to submit a complete renewal application at least 60 days
29 before the expiration of its existing license may appeal that
30 determination by filing a written request for a contested case
31 hearing with the board before the expiration of the
32 organization's existing license. The director shall schedule a
33 contested case hearing before an administrative law judge
34 pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14. The hearing must be
35 held less than 30 days after the service of a Notice and Order

1 for Hearing if allowed by the chief administrative law judge
2 pursuant to part 1400.5600, subpart 3. The board must issue its
3 final decision within 30 days after receipt of the
4 administrative law judge's report and subsequent exceptions and
5 argument under Minnesota Statutes, section 14.61. The sole
6 issue at the hearing is whether the applicant submitted a
7 complete application at least 60 days before the expiration of
8 the applicant's existing license.

9 An organization whose renewal application has been denied
10 may appeal that denial by requesting a contested case hearing
11 pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14. The request must be
12 made in writing and received by the board no later than ten days
13 after the organization receives the denial of its renewal
14 application. Upon receipt of the request, the director shall
15 schedule a contested case hearing before an administrative law
16 judge pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14. The hearing
17 must be held less than 30 days after the service of Notice and
18 Order for Hearing if allowed by the chief administrative law
19 judge pursuant to part 1400.5600, subpart 3. The board must
20 issue its final decision within 30 days after receipt of the
21 administrative law judge's report and subsequent exceptions and
22 argument under Minnesota Statutes, section 14.61.

24 7861.0030 GAMBLING MANAGER.

26 Subp. 11. **Renewals.** The following items apply to renewals
27 of a gambling manager's license:

28 A. To renew a license at the end of a term, a
29 licensed gambling manager must submit a complete renewal
30 application on a form prescribed by the board to the board at
31 least 60 days before the expiration of the gambling manager's
32 existing license. A renewal application is not complete until
33 it contains the information required by subparts 5 and 6.

34 Complete applications received by the board less than 60
35 days before the expiration of the applicant's existing gambling

1 manager's license will be considered pursuant to this part but,
2 if the applicant is entitled to a renewed license, the license
3 will not be renewed by the director until the first day of the
4 month following the expiration of 60 days after the board has
5 received the complete application. A person shall not continue
6 acting as a gambling manager after the expiration of the
7 person's license and until the person has received a renewed
8 license.

10 D. Appeals:

11 (1) A gambling manager whom the director
12 determines has failed to submit a complete renewal application
13 at least 60 days before the expiration of an existing license
14 may appeal that determination by filing a written request for a
15 contested case hearing with the board before the expiration of
16 the gambling manager's existing license. The director shall
17 schedule a contested case hearing before an administrative law
18 judge pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14. The hearing
19 must be held less than 30 days after the service of a Notice and
20 Order for Hearing if allowed by the chief administrative law
21 judge pursuant to part 1400.5600, subpart 3. The board must
22 issue its final decision within 30 days after receipt of the
23 administrative law judge's report and subsequent exceptions and
24 argument under Minnesota Statutes, section 14.61. The sole
25 issue at the hearing is whether the applicant submitted a
26 complete application at least 60 days before the expiration of
27 the applicant's existing license.

30 7861.0040 PREMISES PERMITS.

32 Subp. 10. Renewals. The following items apply to renewals
33 of premises permits:

34 A. To renew a permit at the end of a term, an
35 organization must submit to the board a complete renewal

1 application on a form prescribed by the board at least 60 days
2 before the expiration of the organization's existing permit. A
3 renewal application is not complete until it contains the
4 information required by subparts 3 and 4, the fee required by
5 subpart 7, and local approval in the manner required by subpart
6 8.

7 Complete applications received by the board less than 60
8 days before the expiration of the applicant's existing permit
9 will be considered pursuant to this part but the permit will not
10 be renewed by the director until the first day of the month
11 following the expiration of 60 days after the board has received
12 the complete application. An organization shall not conduct
13 gambling at a site where an existing permit has expired unless
14 and until it receives a renewed permit.

16 D. Appeals:

17 (1) An organization that the board determines has
18 failed to submit a complete renewal application at least 60 days
19 before the expiration of its existing premises permit may appeal
20 that determination by filing a written request for a contested
21 case hearing with the board no later than 30 days before the
22 expiration of the organization's existing premises permit. The
23 director shall schedule a contested case hearing before an
24 administrative law judge pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, chapter
25 14. The hearing must be held less than 30 days after the
26 service of a Notice and Order for Hearing if allowed by the
27 chief administrative law judge pursuant to part 1400.5600,
28 subpart 3. The board must issue its final decision within 30
29 days after receipt of the administrative law judge's report and
30 subsequent exceptions and argument under Minnesota Statutes,
31 section 14.61. The sole issue at the hearing is whether the
32 applicant submitted a complete application at least 60 days
33 before the expiration of the applicant's existing premises
34 permit.
