5 Rules as Adopted

6 4290.0010 DEFINITIONS.

Subpart 1. Scope. The following terms used in parts
4290.0010 to 4290.0050 have the meanings given them.

9 Subp. 2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the 10 commissioner of the Department of Trade and Economic Development 11 or persons delegated to act in the commissioner's behalf.

Subp. 3. Department. "Department" means the Department of
 Trade and Economic Development.

Subp. 4. Eligible business. "Eligible business" means a 14 sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, 15 corporation, or other person engaged in, and determined by the 16 department to constitute, a tourism-related business providing 17 overnight lodging. In making its determination, the department 18 shall use the state industrial classification codes of 7011 and 19 7033 in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual, prepared 20 by the Executive Office of the President, Office of Management 21 and Budget, United States Government, and published in 1987. 22 This manual is incorporated by reference. It is available at 23 the state law library and at the Department of Trade and 24 Economic Development library, 500 Metro Square, 121 Seventh 25 Place East, Saint Paul, Minnesota. A copy of the relevant 26 sections of the manual may be obtained at no charge from the 27 department. The document is not subject to frequent change. 28 The business must be located within 1,000 feet from the 29 ordinary high water level of a lake, pond, or flowage, or 300 30 feet from a river or stream, or the landward extent of a 31 floodplain designated by ordinance on a river or stream, 32 whichever is greater. 33

34 Subp. 5. Eligible cost. "Eligible cost" means design,
35 engineering, excavation, construction, installation, and

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materials costs related to the replacement of existing septic
 systems.

3 Subp. 6. Eligible project. "Eligible project" means a 4 project that proposes to replace a failing or nonconforming 5 septic system or systems with a new sewage treatment system or a 6 connection to a sewer system.

7 Subp. 7. Septic system grant. "Septic system grant" means 8 a specific sum of money made available through June 30, 1995, by 9 the state to an eligible business for the replacement of failing 10 or nonconforming septic systems.

11 4290.0020 APPLICATION PROCESS FOR SEPTIC SYSTEM GRANTS.

12 Subpart 1. Eligibility of applicant. An eligible business 13 may apply for a septic system grant. To receive a grant, an 14 eligible business must satisfy the requirements in parts 15 4290.0010 to 4290.0050. An eligible business may receive only 16 one grant through the septic system grant program for the period 17 ending June 30, 1995. The application must be submitted by the 18 eligible business.

19 Subp. 2. Eligibility of project. A grant must be to an 20 eligible business for an eligible cost. The maximum state grant 21 may not be for more than 50 percent of the total eligible cost 22 of the project, with a maximum grant of \$10,000 for any one 23 business. Project-related costs incurred before July 1, 1993, 24 are ineligible.

Subp. 3. Application content and requirements. 25 The department shall make the application documents and information 26 available to all eligible businesses upon request. 27 The application materials shall include instructions for completing 28 29 and submitting the application. The completed application must be submitted in the format required and address all information 30 requested. The department may request additional information 31 from the applicant if it is necessary to clarify and evaluate 32 33 the application. A formal closing date for receipt of the 34 application shall be established by the department and included in the application materials provided. 35

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1 4290.0030 PROCEDURE FOR SEPTIC SYSTEM GRANT EVALUATION AND 2 APPROVAL. Subpart 1. Evaluation of eligibility. Upon receipt of the 3 completed application, the department shall make a determination 4 5 whether the business, project, and costs are eligible. If it is determined that the business, project, or costs are ineligible, б the application will not receive further evaluation and will not 7 be considered for funding. If it is determined that the 8 9 business, project, and costs are eligible, the department shall 10 evaluate the application according to the procedures and criteria in subpart 2. 11 Subp. 2. Evaluation of completed application. Upon 12 receipt of the completed application and a determination of 13 eligibility, the department shall evaluate the application based 14 on the criteria in items A to C: 15 16 A. Qualifying criteria are: (1) the ability of the eligible business to meet 17 the matching fund requirement and complete the project subject 18 to the reimbursement procedure of the program; and 19 20 (2) whether the proposed project could be 21 completed before July 1, 1995. 22 If the application does not adequately demonstrate that the qualifying criteria can be satisfactorily met, the application 23 24 will not receive further evaluation and will not be considered for funding. If the qualifying criteria are met, the department 25 26 shall proceed with the evaluation of the priority criteria in 27 items B and C. In completing its evaluation and ranking, the department shall place greater emphasis on the priority one 28 criteria in item B. 29 30 B. Priority one criteria are: 31 (1) the degree to which the proposed project. 32 would protect groundwater and surface water quality; 33 (2) the extent to which the proposed project 34 would correct existing health or safety problems related to 35 groundwater or surface water contamination;

[REVISOR ] CMR/KJ AR2260 06/14/93 (3) whether the system has been verified as a 1 failing system; and 2 (4) whether a written order has been issued by 3 local authorities to repair or replace the system. 4 Priority two criteria are: с. 5 (1) the extent to which the nonconforming status 6 of the existing system has impeded, or will likely impede, the 7 operation of the eligible business; 8 (2) the extent to which the proposed project 9 would contribute to the economic viability of the eligible 10 business; 11 (3) whether the proposed project represents a 12 different approach or technology for on-site treatment that 13 might have potential for adoption by other persons currently 14 using traditional individual septic systems and would be .15 permitted under state and local regulations; 16 (4) whether the proposed system would serve more 17 than one eligible business; and 18 (5) a determination of the reasonableness of the 19 estimated project costs. 20 Subp. 3. Competitive review, ranking, and allocation 21 process. A priority ranking shall be established, based on the 22 23 priority criteria for each application that meets the qualifying criteria. Grants shall be allocated to eligible businesses in 24 descending order of priority, as determined by the ranking, 25 26 until all funds are exhausted. Subp. 4. Notification. All applicants shall be notified 27 by the department about the disposition of their projects after 28 29 the competitive review, ranking, and allocation process has been completed and a funding determination has been made. 30 4290.0040 PROJECT AGREEMENT. 31 32 Upon approval, the department shall execute a project agreement with the applicant. The project agreement shall 33 specify the terms and conditions of the grant, including the 34 responsibilities of the grantor and the grantee. 35

1 4290.0050 DISBURSEMENT OF GRANT.

2 The applicant shall initially pay for the project costs as specified in the project agreement. The applicant shall submit 3 to the department a payment request for reimbursement of costs 4 incurred in the completion of the project. Upon receipt of the 5 payment request containing the documentation required in the 6 7 project agreement, the department shall audit the payment request documentation to determine the eligibility and propriety 8 of the costs incurred by the applicant. This documentation 9 10 shall include a letter or other written verification from the 11 local government official or officials responsible for certifying and/or approving the installation of the system that 12 the project has been completed in accordance with all applicable 13 14 regulations and requirements. The project site shall be subject to inspection by department personnel during the project period 15 and prior to final closeout of the grant to ensure that the 16 project has been completed in accordance with the project 17 agreement. 18
