- 26 7b), E, and F. Priority must be given to students enrolled for

- 33 Subp. 3. Hourly wages. Beginning July 1, 1993, not less
- 34 than 25 percent of the amount earned by a student shall be paid

- 1 by the employer, with the actual percentage determined by the
- 2 school in consultation with the employer. A student shall be
- 3 paid for hours actually worked at an hourly rate agreed to by
- 4 the employer and the student, with the approval of the school.
- 5 However, the student must be paid at least the state minimum
- 6 wage, if the federal minimum wage is not applicable. Student
- 7 earnings must be paid according to federal regulations governing
- 8 payment of student earnings under the federal work-study program.
- 9 Subp. 4. Replacement of permanent employee. A public
- 10 employer other than the institution may not terminate, lay off,
- 11 or reduce the working hours of a permanent employee to hire a
- 12 work-study student, or replace a permanent employee who is laid
- 13 off from the same or substantially the same job by hiring a
- 14 work-study student.
