7 2500.0100 DEFINITIONS.

8 [For text of subps 1 to 4a, see M.R.]

9 Subp. 4b. **Diagnosis.** "Diagnosis" means the physical,  
10 clinical, and laboratory examination of the patient, and the use  
11 of X-ray for diagnostic purposes within the scope of practice  
12 described in Minnesota Statutes, sections 148.01 to 148.10.

14 Subp. 5a. **Good standing.** "Good standing" means any  
15 license which is not the subject of current disciplinary action  
16 as identified in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.10,  
17 subdivisions 1, 3, and 4. The pendency of a complaint shall not  
18 cause a license to lose good standing unless and until the  
19 complaint results in disciplinary action under Minnesota  
20 Statutes, section 148.10 or pursuant to a stipulation and  
21 order. A license shall be restored to good standing upon the  
22 satisfactory completion, expiration, or other agreed upon  
23 termination of all terms of a stipulation and order. An  
24 agreement for corrective action as described under Minnesota  
25 Statutes, section 214.103, subdivision 6, shall not cause a  
26 license to lose good standing.

28 Subp. 8a. **Intern.** "Intern" means an unlicensed graduate  
29 of a board-approved chiropractic college who assists in the care  
30 of patients outside the confines of the clinic of a chiropractic  
31 college.

33 Subp. 9a. **License.** "License" means a license issued by  
34 the board to practice chiropractic including an original license  
35 or renewal license.

1 Subp. 9b. Practice of chiropractic. "Practice of  
2 chiropractic" means the diagnosis, prognosis, and treatment by  
3 chiropractic methods that include those procedures preparatory  
4 to and complementary to an adjustment and the normal  
5 chiropractic regimen and rehabilitation of the patient as taught  
6 in accredited chiropractic schools and colleges.

7 ~~Subp. 9c. Preceptor. "Preceptor" means a supervising  
8 licensed chiropractic physician approved by the board.~~

9 ~~Subp. 9d. Preceptorship training program. "Preceptorship  
10 training program" means a board approved program by which an  
11 intern may practice chiropractic under the direct supervision of  
12 a licensed chiropractic physician for one 12-month period.~~

13 Subp. 9e. 9c. Private practice. "Private practice" means  
14 a privately owned chiropractic business held individually or by  
15 incorporation operating without the interest of any hospital,  
16 teaching facility, or insurance company.

18 2500.0600 BOARD CERTIFICATION ADVERTISING.

19 A licensee who represents in any advertisement the  
20 possession of any credential, certification, or registration  
21 shall ~~include in the advertisement the name of~~ identify the  
22 board, agency, or other body which issued the additional  
23 credential, certification, or registration.

24 2500.1250 CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAM APPROVAL.

25 A list of all programs to be provided, including amendments  
26 or additions to said list, must be submitted by the sponsor to  
27 the board no less than 45 calendar days prior to the  
28 presentation date of the first such program. Failure to do so  
29 may result in disapproval of each program scheduled to be  
30 presented 45 days or less from the submission date.
