- 6 6110.1200 NAVIGATION OF WATERCRAFT ON THE WATERS OF THE STATE;
- 7 SAFETY EQUIPMENT.

- 9 Subp. 3. Personal flotation (lifesaving) devices.
- 10 Flotation devices:
- 11 A. Every person on board a watercraft or duck boat
- 12 shall wear or have readily accessible a U.S. Coast Guard
- 13 approved Type I, II, or III personal flotation device. In
- 14 addition to these devices, watercraft and duck boats 16 feet or
- 15 more in length, except canoes and kayaks, must also carry at
- 16 least one U.S. Coast Guard approved Type IV personal flotation
- 17 device. A U.S. Coast Guard approved Type IV personal flotation
- 18 device may be carried in lieu of any personal flotation device
- 19 required by this part, on nonmotorized watercraft operated by
- 20 lifeguards within a marked swimming area, as defined in part
- 21 6110.1600.
- B. A U.S. Coast Guard approved Type V personal
- 23 flotation device may be carried in lieu of any personal
- 24 flotation device required in this rule, if the Type V personal
- 25 flotation device is approved:
- 26 (1) for the activity in which the watercraft is
- 27 being used; and
- 28 (2) as a substitute for the type of personal
- 29 flotation devices required to be on board the watercraft.
- 30 C. Persons being towed by a watercraft on water skis
- 31 or other devices shall be considered to be on board the towing
- 32 watercraft for the purpose of personal flotation device
- 33 requirements. A U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III
- 34 personal flotation device must be either carried in the towing
- 35 watercraft or worn by the person being towed.

Τ.	D. All personal flocation devices required by this
2	subpart shall be:
3	(1) approved by the United States Coast Guard;
4	(2) legibly marked with the approval number
5	issued by the United States Coast Guard;
6	(3) in serviceable condition free of tears, rot,
7	punctures, or waterlogging, and with all straps and fasteners
8	present and in good condition;
9	(4) either readily accessible or worn with
10	following exceptions:
11	(a) those Type V devices which are
12	required to be worn to be accepted as United States Coast Guard
13	approved;
14	(b) those cases designated by statute
15	where wearing a Coast Guard approved Type I, II, III or ${ t V}$
16	personal flotation device is mandatory; and
17	(c) Type IV personal flotation devices
18	must be immediately available.
19	"Readily accessible" means easily retrievable within a
20	reasonable amount of time in an emergency. "Immediately
21	available" means easily reached in time of emergency. Personal
22	flotation devices located in locked containers, under heavy
23	objects or left in shipping bags are not considered readily
24	accessible or immediately available;

26	wearer, if the device is designed to be worn.
