D. a written or oral examination. 15 Subp. 2. Prohibition on purchasing or making restricted 16 17 use pesticides available to uncertified persons. A person must not purchase a restricted use pesticide for or make a restricted 18 use pesticide available for use by a person who is not licensed 19 or certified. 20 As used in this subpart, "purchase" means to buy or obtain 21 a restricted use pesticide in exchange for money or something 22 23 else of value. A purchase has not been completed under this part unless the restricted use pesticide is picked up by or 24 25 delivered to a person. Subp. 3. Restrictions on taking possession of restricted 26 use pesticides by uncertified persons. A person who is 27 28 uncertified may take possession of a restricted use pesticide from a pesticide dealer by pick up, delivery, or similar 29 30 activity for use by a licensed or certified person if: the licensed or certified person to whom the 31 Α. 32 restricted use pesticide is being made available has a valid license or certification as verified by providing the original 33 or facsimile of the licensed or certified person's applicator 34 card to the pesticide dealer, or by providing the licensed or 35

B. the uncertified person discloses the person's nameand address to the pesticide dealer.

5 1505.1100 RESTRICTED USE PESTICIDE DISPLAY; SALES AND6 DISTRIBUTION; RECORDKEEPING.

7 Subpart 1. Display for sale. No person shall display for 8 sale any restricted use pesticides in any public area of a store 9 or other place to which the general public has access unless 10 displayed by a sign or placard bearing the following statement 11 in capital letters not less than two inches high: "RESTRICTED 12 USE PESTICIDES -- USER MUST BE CERTIFIED."

Subp. 2. Sale and distribution to unlicensed or uncertified persons. A pesticide dealer licensed under Minnesota Statutes, section 18B.31, may offer for sale, sell, and as provided in subpart 3 make restricted use pesticides available to an unlicensed or uncertified person for application by a person licensed or certified under Minnesota Statutes, sections 18B.29 to 18B.36.

Subp. 3. Making restricted use pesticides available;
recordkeeping.

A. <u>A restricted use pesticide is considered to be</u>
<u>made available when it is picked up by or delivered to a person.</u>
<u>B.</u> At the time a restricted use pesticide is made
available to a person, the pesticide dealer or a person working
under the supervision of the pesticide dealer must obtain:

(1) the date that the restricted use pesticide ismade available;

(2) the name and address of the person to whom
the restricted use pesticide is made available if the person is
not licensed or certified under Minnesota Statutes, sections
18B.29 to 18B.36;

(3) the name and the license or certification
number of the applicator who will be applying the restricted use
pesticide, the expiration date of the applicator's license or

1 certification, and the original or a facsimile copy of the 2 applicator license or certification card if the applicator is 3 licensed or certified by a state other than Minnesota; and 4 (4) the pesticide product brand name, EPA 5 registration number, and amount of restricted use pesticide

B. C. All information required under item A B must be recorded, either manually or on a computer, by the end of the business day in which a restricted use pesticide is made available to a person. All records must be kept on forms provided by the commissioner. Records may be kept by computer if all information required in item A B is included in the computer record.

14 C. D. Records must be submitted to the commissioner 15 no later than December 1 of the calendar year in which they 16 occur.
