6 Rules as Adopted

7 3100.1400 APPLICATION FOR LICENSURE BY CREDENTIALS.

8 Any person who is already a licensed dentist or dental
9 hygienist in another state or Canadian province desiring to be
10 licensed to practice dentistry or dental hygiene in Minnesota
11 shall, in order to demonstrate the person's knowledge of dental
12 subjects and ability to practice dentistry or dental hygiene in
13 Minnesota, comply with the requirements in items A to N.

15 N. An applicant may apply for licensure by
16 credentials only once within any five-year period of time.

17 3100.4200 CDE SPONSORS.

19 Subp. 7. Denial or revocation of approval. The board
20 shall state in writing its reasons for denying any sponsor
21 application.

22 The board may deny approval of a specific course offered by
23 an approved sponsor if such a course does not meet the standards
24 of courses as specified by part 3100.4300, subpart 3.

25 The board may revoke its approval of any sponsor for
26 failure to comply with provisions of subparts 4, 5, and 6 , for
27 falsification of any information requested or required by the
28 board relating to the application for approval as a sponsor or
29 to the administration of courses of a sponsor, or for other just
30 cause.

31 3100.6300 ADEQUATE SAFETY AND SANITARY CONDITIONS FOR DENTAL
32 OFFICES.

34 Subp. 13. CPR training. A minimum of one person who has

1 completed, within the previous two years, an advanced cardiac
2 life support or basic cardiac life support educational program
3 provided by the American Heart Association, the American Red
4 Cross, or another agency whose courses are equivalent to the
5 American Heart Association or American Red Cross courses must be
6 present in the dental office when dental services are provided.

8 3100.7000 ADVERTISING DENTAL SPECIALTY PRACTICE.

10 Subp. 2. Postdoctoral course completion. Only licensed
11 dentists who have successfully completed a postdoctoral course
12 approved by the Commission on Accreditation in one of the
13 specialty areas, or who announced a limitation of practice prior
14 to 1967, or who have been approved by one of the following
15 specialty examining boards, may announce specialty practice and
16 may advertise as a specialist: American Board of Dental Public
17 Health, American Board of Endodontics, American Board of Oral
18 and Maxillofacial Surgery, American Board of Oral Pathology,
19 American Board of Orthodontics, American Board of Pediatric
20 Dentistry, American Board of Periodontology, and American Board
21 of Prosthodontics.

23 3100.8400 ASSISTANTS.

24 Subpart 1. Permissible duties. Assistants may: perform
25 all those duties not directly related with performing dental
26 treatment or services on patients; retract a patient's cheek,
27 tongue, or other parts of tissue during a dental operation;
28 assist with the placement or removal of a rubber dam and
29 accessories used for its placement and retention, as directed by
30 an operating dentist during the course of a dental operation;
31 remove such debris as is normally created or accumulated during
32 the course of treatment being rendered by a licensed dentist
33 during or after operative procedures by the dentist by the use
34 of vacuum devices, compressed air, mouthwash, and water; provide
35 any assistance, including the placement of articles and topical

1 medication in a patient's oral cavity, in response to a specific
2 direction to do so by a licensed dentist who is then and there
3 actually engaged in performing a dental operation as defined in
4 the act and who is then actually in a position to give personal
5 supervision to the rendition of this assistance; and aid dental
6 hygienists and registered dental assistants in the performance
7 of their duties as defined in subpart 2 and part 3100.8700.

9 3100.9300 REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION.

10 The board shall revoke or, if appropriate, refuse to renew
11 the registration of any corporation which no longer meets all
12 the requirements of the Minnesota Professional Corporations
13 Act. The corporation's eligibility to be registered or to
14 continue registration must be adjudicated under the applicable
15 provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, Minnesota
16 Statutes, chapter 14, and the rules of the Office of
17 Administrative Hearings, parts 1400.5100 to 1400.8401.

18 REPEALER. Minnesota Rules, part 3100.1850, subpart 4, is
19 repealed.
