"Approved continuing education program" means an 14 в. 15 educational or training activity that meets the requirements of the Board of Veterinary Medicine Continuing Education Advisory 16 Committee for the granting of continuing education credits to 17 the recipients of the program. 18 19 Subp. 1d. [See repealer.] 20 Subp. le. Controlled substance. "Controlled substance" means a drug, substance, or immediate precursor in schedules I 21 to V of Minnesota Statutes, section 152.02, or schedules I to V 22 23 of the federal Controlled Substances Act. [For text of subp 2, see M.R.] 24 Housing facility. "Housing facility" means a 25 Subp. 3. structure, cage, building, or other facility used for housing 26 27 animals under veterinary care. 28 [For text of subp 3a, see M.R.] 29 Subp. 3b. Licensure renewal period. "Licensure renewal 30 period" is a two-year period beginning on March 1 and ending on the last day of February two years later. 31 32 [For text of subps 4 and 4a, see M.R.] Subp. 4b. Sponsor or approved sponsor. 33 34 Α. "Sponsor" means a person or entity who organizes a 35 continuing education activity.

Veterinary facility. 9 "Veterinary facility" means a building, shelter, Α. structure, or mobile unit in which licensed veterinarians 10 11 routinely engage in the practice of veterinary medicine. 12 "Emergency veterinary facility" means a facility в. 13 equipped and staffed to provide acute veterinary care during night, weekend, and holiday hours when most local daytime 14 15 veterinary practices are closed. C---"Full-service-veterinary-facility"-means-a 16 17 veterinary-facility-staffed-and-equipped-to-provide-sick-animal 18 diagnosis-and-treatment-and,-at-a-minimum,-minor-and-routine 19 surgical-procedures. Continuing education required. Commencing with license renewal for 1997, no license renewal may be issued to a 31 32 veterinarian, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 156.07,

33 until the veterinarian has certified to the board that the 34 veterinarian has completed at least 40 hours of approved

35 continuing education during the previous two years. Thereafter,

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1 each veterinarian possessing a license to practice veterinary medicine shall certify compliance at the time of each subsequent 2 biennial license renewal. Licensees with odd-numbered licenses 3 renewed in 1997 are required to have completed 20 credit hours 4 and thereafter 40 credit hours for subsequent biennial license 5 renewal periods. Licensees with even-numbered licenses are 6 required to have completed 40 credit hours at time of 1998 7 8 renewal.

9 Subp. 2. Purpose. The primary purpose of continuing 10 veterinary education is to assure the consumer of an optimal 11 quality of veterinary care by requiring veterinarians to attend 12 educational or training programs designed to advance their 13 professional skills, knowledge, and obligations.

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Subp. 3. Approved continuing education programs.

Courses, seminars, wet labs, and lectures 15 Α. sponsored by accredited colleges of veterinary medicine; the 16 17 AVMA and CVMA; state, regional, and local VMAs; AVMA recognized 18 specialty boards; academic or specialty groups; international 19 veterinary organizations; the Minnesota Academy of Veterinary Practice; the U.S. Animal Health Association; training programs 20 of the U.S.D.A. and Minnesota Board of Animal Health; and the 21 AAHA are automatically approved and do not require advance 22 23 approval on an individual program basis.

B. Sponsors of programs not automatically approved in item A must apply to the board's-continuing-education-advisory committee board for course approval at least 90 days prior to the anticipated presentation date.

(1) Applications for approval of a continuing education
program must be submitted on a form provided by the board
containing the following information:

(2)-Each-initial-application-for-course-approval 7 8 must-be-accompanied-by-a-\$50-payment-to-the-board---Subsequent 9 annual-renewal-applications-must-be-accompanied-by-a-\$25-payment-10 c. Program approval criteria: 11 (1) The criteria in units (a) to (d) must be used to determine approval of a continuing education program. 12 (a) The educational activities must have 13 14 significant intellectual or practical content dealing primarily with information on skills directly related to the practice of 15 veterinary medicine, to the professional responsibility or 16 ethical and legal obligations of the participants, or to 17 practice management concepts. 18 19 (b) Presenters must be qualified by 20 practical or academic experience to teach the subject covered. (c) The program must be conducted in a 21 22 suitable setting conducive to the learning process. 23 (d) Except for limitations due to space availability or instructor/pupil ratio or academic or experience 24 25 prerequisites, courses must be open to all licensed 26 veterinarians. (2) Licensees, within 30 days of attending a 27 nonpreapproved course, may apply to the continuing-education 28 advisory-committee board for credit by completing and submitting 29 30 an individual continuing education course approval form. The continuing-education-advisory-committee board is the final 31 32 determinator of credit to be allowed. (3) Courses not directly related to the practice 33 34 of veterinary medicine, such as estate planning, investments, and marketing of ancillary products, must not be approved for 35

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continuing education credit.

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(4) Providers, in advertisements for approved 1 2 programs, must use the following phrase: "This program has been approved by the Minnesota Board of Veterinary Medicine for 3 ..... (insert appropriate number) continuing education 4 credit hours." 5 6 . (5) Providers must maintain records of attendance for a minimum of three years and must verify individual 7 attendance to the board upon request. 8 9 Subp. 4. Continuing education advisory committee. 10 A six-member continuing education advisory Α. 11 committee is established to assist and advise the board in continuing education matters. Two members of the committee must 12 13 be designated by the Minnesota Academy of Veterinary Practice; 14 two must be members of the board; one member must be designated by the College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Minnesota; 15 16 and one member must be designated by the Minnesota Veterinary Medical Association. The executive director of the board shall 17 serve as secretary of the committee. 18 19 Β. Responsibilities and-duties of the continuing education advisory committee include: 20 21 (1) reviewing proposed continuing education programs for approval and determining recommending the number of 22 23 continuing education credit hours that will be awarded; (2) reviewing individual licensee requests for 24 25 continuing education credit approval and determining 26 recommending the number of credit hours to be awarded; 27 (3) hearing-appeals-for-and--if-necessary-28 granting-hardship-extensions-for-licensees-unable-to-meet 29 continuing-education-credit-hour-requirements; 30 (4)-determining,-if-necessary, reviewing the 31 validity of individual requests for a waiver of continuing education requirements; and 32 33 (5) (4) assisting and advising the board staff in administering the continuing education program. 34 C. All recommendations of the continuing education 35 36 advisory committee must be approved by the board.

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1 Subp. 5. Requirements for relicensure. Each licensee must 2 obtain 40 hours of approved continuing education credit in the 3 two years immediately preceding the biennial license renewal 4 deadline.

A. Thirty of the 40 required hours of continuing education credit must be obtained from interactive sources, such as lectures, seminars, wet labs, interactive television, or as a presenter of a continuing education topic or author of a referred journal article or contributing author for a recognized textbook.

B. For self study, such as journal reading, audio/visual tape instruction, or other noninteractive study, three hours of study must be awarded one hour of continuing education credit. Not more than ten hours of continuing education credit from noninteractive sources must be accepted toward the 40-hour continuing education credit requirement for licensure renewal.

18 C. Not more than ten hours of continuing education 19 credit must be accepted for courses, seminars, or training 20 sessions focused on practice management.

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Subp. 6. Credit determination.

A. Ten hours of continuing education credit must be granted for authoring a scientific paper or book chapter published in a scholarly journal or book.

B. <u>Up to</u> ten hours of continuing education credit must be granted on a one-time basis for a paper or exhibit presented before a professional veterinary or allied health audience. <u>Two hours of credit must be given for each hour of</u> presentation, to a maximum of ten credit hours.

C. One hour of continuing education credit must be given for each period of not less than 50 minutes of attendance at an approved continuing education program. Credit for attendance at combined scientific, business, and social conventions must be given only for the actual number of hours spent participating in continuing education programs. Subp. 7. Extension and waivers of continuing education

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1 requirements.

A. For good cause, a licensee may apply to the continuing-education-advisory-committee <u>board</u> for a six-month extension of the deadline for obtaining the required number of continuing education credits. No more than two consecutive extensions may be granted. Extensions may be granted for unforeseen hardships such as illness, family emergency, and military call-up.

9 B. Waiver of continuing education requirements must 10 be granted to licensees enrolled in a graduate or residency 11 program leading to an advanced degree or certification in a 12 specialty or academic field related to veterinary medicine.

C. Waiver of continuing education requirements must be granted to licensees who are members in current good standing of academies and specialty boards that have continuing education requirements equal to or higher than board requirements.

D. Waiver of continuing education requirements must be granted to licensees who practice and maintain licensure in another United States or Canadian jurisdiction that has continuing education requirements equal to or higher than board requirements.

22 E. Continuing education requirements are waived for 23 the time period immediately preceding the first license renewal 24 date.

F.--Veterinarians-retired-but-maintaining-a-license
 are-exempt-from-meeting-continuing-education-requirements.
 Subp. 8. Certification procedure.

A. The board, at the time of license renewal, must furnish each licensee a form upon which the licensee must certify fulfillment of the required number of continuing education hours for the two-year period preceding the license renewal date or that they qualify for waiver of requirements as specified in items B to F E.

34 B. Licensees are responsible for maintaining 35 documentation of continuing education attendance for a minimum 36 of four years. The board may, at its discretion, require

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licensees to furnish additional evidence as is necessary to 1 2 verify compliance with board continuing education requirements. 3 Upon board request, whether as part of a routine audit or as part of an individual complaint investigation, a licensee must 4 furnish, within 30 days, proof to the board of satisfactorily 5 meeting the required number of continuing education hours 6 7 established by the board or of qualifying for a waiver. 8 (1) Proof in the form of attendance certificates, diplomas, canceled checks, or class rosters accompanied with a 9 10 course program, or other documentation acceptable to the board must be submitted. 11 12 (2) The continuing-education-committee board is the final determining authority as to the acceptability of 13 specific continuing education documentation or waiver 14 qualification. 15 The following acts are unprofessional conduct and 16 C. 17 are subject to disciplinary action under Minnesota Statutes, section 156.081, subdivision 2, clause (11): 18 19 (1) failure to meet minimum continuing education 20 credit hour requirements for biennial license renewal; (2) failure to submit adequate proof of 21 22 continuing education attendance within 30 days of a board request; and 23 (3) falsification of attendance documentation. 24 25 D. Excess continuing education credit hours may not be banked or carried forward into the next license renewal cycle. 26 27 For disciplinary purposes, the board may direct a Ε. licensee to take additional continuing education, in specific 28 disciplines, over and above the general continuing education 29 requirements for relicensure. 30 Reinstatement of expired license. Subp. 9. 31 A person wishing to reinstate an expired license under Minnesota 32 33 Statutes, section 156.071, shall furnish proof that the person meets continuing education requirements of their current state 34 of residency and that those requirements are equal to Minnesota 35 requirements, or otherwise provide documentation to the board of 36

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having met Minnesota continuing education requirements for each year the license was expired, up to five years maximum, or provide proof of enrollment in a qualified graduate or residency program during the period the license was expired.
