7 3100.0100 DEFINITIONS.

9 Subp. 11a. Faculty dentist. "Faculty dentist" has the  
10 meaning given it in Minnesota Statutes, section 150A.01,  
11 subdivision 6a.

13 Subp. 18a. Resident dentist. "Resident dentist" has the  
14 meaning given it in Minnesota Statutes, section 150A.01,  
15 subdivision 8a.

17 3100.1150 LICENSE TO PRACTICE DENTISTRY AS A FACULTY DENTIST.

18 Subpart 1. Licensure.

19 A. In order to practice dentistry, a faculty member  
20 must be licensed by the board.

21 B. The board must license a person to practice  
22 dentistry as a faculty dentist if:

23 (1) the person completes and submits to the board  
24 an application furnished by the board;

25 (2) the person is not otherwise licensed to  
26 practice dentistry in Minnesota;

27 (3) the dean of a school of dentistry ~~or the~~  
28 ~~director of an advanced dental education program~~ accredited by  
29 the Commission on Accreditation certifies to the board, in  
30 accordance with the requirements of item C, that the person is a  
31 member of the school's faculty and practices dentistry; and

32 (4) the person has not engaged in behavior for  
33 which licensure may be suspended, revoked, limited, modified, or  
34 denied on any of the grounds specified in Minnesota Statutes,  
35 sections 150A.08, 214.17 to 214.25, 214.33, subdivision 2, or



1 part 3100.6100, 3100.6200, or 3100.6300.

2 C. The board must accept an applicant as a faculty  
3 dentist if the dean of a school of dentistry ~~or-the-director-of~~  
4 ~~an-advanced-dental-education-program~~ accredited by the  
5 Commission on Accreditation provides to the board the following  
6 information:

7 (1) the applicant's full name;

8 (2) the applicant's social security number;

9 (3) the applicant's home and work address;

10 (4) a statement that the applicant is a member of  
11 the faculty and practices dentistry within the school or its  
12 affiliated teaching facilities, but only for purposes of  
13 instruction or research;

14 (5) the dates of the applicant's employment by  
15 the school of dentistry;

16 (6) a statement that the applicant has been  
17 notified of the need to be licensed by the board as a faculty  
18 dentist; and

19 (7) a statement that the information provided is  
20 accurate and complete.

21 Subp. 2. Termination of licensure.

22 A. A person's license to practice dentistry as a  
23 faculty dentist is terminated when the person is no  
24 longer practicing dentistry as a member of the faculty of a  
25 school of dentistry ~~or-when-the-person-discontinues-practicing~~  
26 ~~dentistry.~~

27 B. A person licensed to practice dentistry as a  
28 faculty dentist must inform the board when the licensee is no  
29 longer practicing dentistry as a member of the faculty of a  
30 school of dentistry ~~or-when-the-person-discontinues-practicing~~  
31 ~~dentistry.~~

32 C. A person who fails to inform the board as required  
33 in item B is deemed to have committed fraud or deception within  
34 the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, section 150A.08, subdivision  
35 1, clause (1).

1 3100.1160 LICENSE TO PRACTICE DENTISTRY AS A RESIDENT DENTIST.

2 Subpart 1. Licensure.

3 A. In order to practice dentistry as directly related  
4 to a respective graduate or advanced educational clinical  
5 experience, an enrolled graduate student or a student of an  
6 advanced education program must be licensed by the board.

7 B. The board must license a person to practice  
8 dentistry as a resident dentist if:

9 (1) the person completes and submits to the board  
10 an application furnished by the board;

11 (2) the person is not otherwise licensed to  
12 practice dentistry in Minnesota;

13 (3) the person provides evidence of having  
14 graduated from a dental school;

15 (4) the person provides evidence of being an  
16 enrolled graduate student or a student of an advanced dental  
17 education program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation;  
18 and

19 (5) the person has not engaged in behavior for  
20 which licensure may be suspended, revoked, limited, modified, or  
21 denied on any of the grounds specified in Minnesota Statutes,  
22 section 150A.08.

23 Subp. 2. Termination of licensure.

24 A. A person's license to practice dentistry as a  
25 resident dentist is terminated when the person is no longer an  
26 enrolled graduate student or a student of an advanced dental  
27 education program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation.

28 B. A person licensed to practice dentistry as a  
29 resident dentist must inform the board when the licensee is no  
30 longer an enrolled graduate student or a student of an advanced  
31 dental education program accredited by the Commission on  
32 Accreditation.

33 C. A person who fails to inform the board as required  
34 in item B is deemed to have committed fraud or deception within  
35 the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, section 150.08, subdivision  
36 1, clause (1).

1 3100.1700 TERMS AND RENEWAL OF LICENSURE AND REGISTRATION;  
2 GENERAL.

3 Subpart 1. **Requirements.** The requirements of this part  
4 apply to the terms and renewal of licensure or registration of  
5 an applicant other than a faculty or resident dentist. The  
6 requirements for the terms and renewal of licensure as a faculty  
7 or resident dentist are specified in part 3100.1750.

8 Subp. 1a. **Terms.** An initial license or registration  
9 issued by the board is valid from the date issued until renewed  
10 or terminated in accordance with the procedures specified in  
11 this part. An annually renewed license or registration issued  
12 by the board is valid from January 1 of the year for which it  
13 was issued until renewed or terminated in accordance with the  
14 procedures specified in this part.

16 3100.1750 TERMS AND RENEWAL OF LICENSURE; FACULTY AND RESIDENT  
17 DENTISTS.

18 Subpart 1. **Requirements.** The requirements of this part  
19 apply to the terms and renewal of licensure as a faculty or  
20 resident dentist.

21 Subp. 2. **Terms.** An initial license issued by the board is  
22 valid from the date issued until renewed or terminated in  
23 accordance with the procedures specified in this part. An  
24 annually renewed license issued by the board is valid from July  
25 1 of the year for which it was issued until renewed no later  
26 than the following June 30 or terminated in accordance with the  
27 procedures specified in this part.

28 Subp. 3. **Renewal applications.**

29 A. A faculty or resident dentist must complete and  
30 submit to the board an application form furnished by the board,  
31 together with the applicable annual renewal ~~and-late-fees~~ <sup>fee</sup>, no  
32 later than June 30 ~~of-the-year-preceding-the-year~~ for the  
33 12-month period for which licensure renewal is requested. The  
34 ~~board-must-not-accept-a-renewal-application-received-by-the~~  
35 ~~board-after-the-first-workday-following~~ Applications for renewal

1 will be considered timely if received by the board no later than  
2 June 30 or postmarked on June 30. If the postmark is illegible,  
3 the application will be considered timely if received in the  
4 board office via United States first class mail on the first  
5 workday after June 30.

6 B. An applicant must submit on the application form  
7 the following:

- 8 (1) the applicant's signature;
- 9 (2) the applicant's institutional addresses;
- 10 (3) the applicant's license number; and
- 11 (4) any additional information requested by the  
12 board.

13 3100.2000 FEES.

14 Subpart 1. **Application fees.** Each applicant for licensure  
15 as a dentist or dental hygienist or for registration as a  
16 registered dental assistant or for a limited registration as a  
17 dental assistant under part 3100.8500, subpart 3, shall submit  
18 with a license or registration application a fee in the  
19 following amounts:

- 20 A. dentist application, \$140;
- 21 B. faculty dentist application, \$140;
- 22 C. dental hygienist application, \$55;
- 23 D. resident dentist application, \$55;
- 24 E. dental assistant application, \$35; and
- 25 F. limited registration application, \$15.

26 Subp. 2. **Annual license or registration fees.** Each  
27 dentist, dental hygienist, and registered dental assistant, and  
28 dental assistant with a limited registration under part  
29 3100.8500, subpart 3, shall submit with an annual license or  
30 registration renewal application a fee as established by the  
31 board not to exceed the following amounts:

- 32 A. dentist, \$168;
- 33 B. faculty dentist, \$168;
- 34 C. dental hygienist, \$59;
- 35 D. resident dentist, \$59;

- 1 E. registered dental assistant, \$40; and  
2 F. dental assistant with a limited registration, \$12.

4 Subp. 4. Annual license or registration late fee.

5 Applications for renewal of any license or registration received  
6 after the time specified in part 3100.1700 or 3100.1750 are  
7 subject to a late fee equal to 50 percent of the annual renewal  
8 fee.
