- 7 3100.3600 TRAINING AND EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS TO ADMINISTER
- 8 ANESTHESIA AND SEDATION.
- 9 Subpart 1. Prohibitions. Dental assistants may not
- 10 administer general anesthesia, conscious sedation, or nitrous
- 11 oxide inhalation analgesia. Dental hygienists may not
- 12 administer general anesthesia or conscious sedation.
- 13 Subp. 2. General anesthesia. A dentist may administer a
- 14 pharmacological agent for the purpose of general anesthesia only
- 15 pursuant to items A to C.
- 16 A. Beginning January 1, 1993, a dentist may
- 17 administer a pharmacological agent for the purpose of general
- 18 anesthesia only after satisfactorily completing the requirements
- 19 in clause (1) or (2) in addition to the requirements in clause
- 20 (3).

- 22 (3) an advanced cardiac life support course and,
- 23 at least every two years, an advanced or basic cardiac life
- 24 support course recognized by the American Heart Association, the
- 25 American Red Cross, or other agencies whose courses are

- 27 Cross courses.

- 29 Subp. 3. Conscious sedation. A dentist may administer a
- 30 pharmacological agent for the purpose of conscious sedation only
- 31 pursuant to items A to C.
- 32 A. Beginning January 1, 1993, a dentist may
- 33 administer a pharmacological agent for the purpose of conscious
- 34 sedation of a patient only after satisfactorily completing:

- 1 (2) an advanced cardiac life support course and,
- 2 at least every two years, complete an advanced or basic cardiac
- 3 life support course recognized by the American Heart
- 4 Association, the American Red Cross, or other agencies whose
- 5 courses are equivalent to the American Heart Association or
- 6 American Red Cross courses.

- 8 Subp. 4. Nitrous oxide inhalation analgesia. A dentist
- 9 may administer nitrous oxide inhalation analgesia only pursuant
- 10 to items A to D and subpart 5, items A to C. A dental hygienist
- ll may administer nitrous oxide inhalation analgesia only pursuant
- 12 to items C to E and subpart 5, item D.

- 14 C. A dentist or dental hygienist must, at least every
- 15 two years, complete an advanced or basic cardiac life support
- 16 course recognized by the American Heart Association, the
- 17 American Red Cross, or another agency whose courses are
- 18 equivalent to the American Heart Association or American Red
- 19 Cross courses.
- 20 D. A dentist or dental hygienist may only use
- 21 fail-safe anesthesia equipment capable of positive pressure
- 22 respiration.
- 23 E. A dental hygienist may administer nitrous oxide
- 24 inhalation analgesia only after satisfactorily completing a
- 25 course on the administration of nitrous oxide inhalation
- 26 analgesia from an institution accredited by the Commission on
- 27 Accreditation. The course must include a minimum of 16 hours of
- 28 didactic instruction and supervised clinical experience using
- 29 fail-safe anesthesia equipment capable of positive pressure
- 30 respiration.
- 31 Subp. 5. Notice to board. A dentist who administers a
- 32 pharmacological agent for the purpose of general anesthesia,
- 33 conscious sedation, or nitrous oxide inhalation analgesia shall
- 34 submit to the board the information in items A to C.

- 36 B. Beginning January 1, 1993, a dentist may

- 1 administer pharmacological agents for the purpose of general
- 2 anesthesia or conscious sedation only if the dentist has
- 3 submitted the following information to the board on forms
- 4 provided by it: the name, address, and telephone number of the
- 5 institution at which the dentist took the program or residency
- 6 that complies with subparts 2, item A, subitem (1) or (2); and
- 7 3, item A, subitem (1), a certified copy of the dentist's
- 8 transcript or other official record from the institution
- 9 verifying that the dentist satisfactorily completed the program,
- 10 residency, or course; and the name, address, and telephone
- 11 number of the institution or other agency at which the dentist.
- 12 successfully completed the advanced cardiac life support course
- 13 required by subparts 2, item A, subitem (3); and 3, item A,
- 14 subitem (2). After this initial submission, dentists shall
- 15 every year submit on their license renewal application or other
- 16 form provided by the board a statement of the most recent course
- 17 completed in advanced or basic cardiac life support.
- 18 C. Beginning January 1, 1993, a dentist not
- 19 previously registered with the board pursuant to subpart 5, item
- 20 A, may administer nitrous oxide inhalation analgesia only after
- 21 the dentist has submitted the following information to the board
- 22 on forms provided by it: the name, address, and telephone
- 23 number of the institution at which the dentist took the course
- 24 that complies with subpart 4, item B; a certified copy of the
- 25 dentist's transcript or other official record from the
- 26 institution verifying that the dentist has successfully
- 27 completed an advanced or basic cardiac life support course as
- 28 required by subpart 4, item C. After this initial submission, a
- 29 dentist shall every year submit on the license renewal
- 30 application or other form provided by the board a statement of
- 31 the most recent course completed in advanced cardiac life
- 32 support or basic cardiac life support.
- D. A dental hygienist may administer nitrous oxide
- 34 inhalation analgesia only after the dental hygienist has
- 35 submitted the following information to the board on forms
- 36 provided by it: the name, address, and telephone number of the

- 1 institution at which the dental hygienist successfully completed
- 2 the course required by subpart 4, item E; and a certified copy
- 3 of the dental hygienist's transcript or other official record
- 4 from the institution verifying that the dental hygienist has
- 5 successfully completed the advanced or basic cardiac life
- 6 support course as required by subpart 4, item E. After this
- 7 initial submission, the dental hygienist shall every year submit
- 8 on the license renewal application or other form provided by the
- 9 board a statement of the most recent course completed in
- 10 advanced or basic cardiac life support.

- 12 Subp. 8. Reporting of incidents required. A dentist or
- 13 dental hygienist shall report to the board any incident that
- 14 arises from the administration of nitrous oxide inhalation
- 15 analgesia or of a pharmacological agent for the purpose of
- 16 general anesthesia, conscious sedation, local anesthesia,
- 17 analgesia, or anxiolysis that results in a serious or unusual
- 18 outcome that produces a temporary or permanent physiological
- 19 injury, harm, or other detrimental effect to one or more of a
- 20 patient's body systems. The report shall be submitted to the
- 21 board on forms provided by it within ten days of the incident.

- 24 Subp. 2. Duties under indirect supervision. A dental
- 25 hygienist may perform the following procedures if a dentist is
- 26 in the office, authorizes the procedures, and remains in the
- 27 office while the procedures are being performed:
- 28 A. remove marginal overhangs;
- B. administer local anesthesia. Before administering
- 30 local anesthesia, a dental hygienist must have successfully
- 31 completed a didactic and clinical program sponsored by a dental
- 32 or dental hygiene school accredited by the Commission on
- 33 Accreditation, resulting in the dental hygienist becoming
- 34 clinically competent in the administration of local anesthesia;
