9 means all the following as they apply to emissions units in a  
10 stationary source (including requirements that have been  
11 promulgated or approved by the EPA or the agency through

13 compliance dates):

14 A. any standard, or other requirement provided for in  
15 Minnesota's implementation plan approved or promulgated by the  
16 EPA under title I of the act (Program and Activities), including

31 Subpart 1. **Testing required.** The owner or operator of an  
32 emission facility shall arrange to conduct a performance test to  
33 determine the characteristics and amount of emissions of air  
34 pollutants from any emission facility at the times required by

1 an applicable compliance document, federal regulation, or  
 2 Minnesota rule or statute and at additional times if the  
 3 commissioner requests a performance test in order to:

5 E. determine the compliance status of an emission  
 6 facility following a modification to the emission facility that  
 7 the commissioner determines could cause an increase in the  
 8 amount of emissions of any air pollutant from that facility; or

9 F. determine the relative accuracy of a continuous

11 ~~G. determine the compliance status of an emission~~  
 12 ~~facility when odorous emissions from that facility indicate the~~  
 13 ~~release of a regulated air pollutant.~~

14 EPA may request a performance test under this part for the  
 15 reasons listed in items A to G F. When EPA requires a  
 16 performance test under this subpart, and EPA directly  
 17 administers the performance test, EPA will make the decisions  
 18 that the commissioner makes under parts 7017.2001 to 7017.2060  
 19 for that performance test.

9 Subp. 3. Operation and maintenance manual. The owner or  
10 operator of a refuse-derived fuel processing facility must  
11 prepare an operation and maintenance manual and keep the manual  
12 at the facility. The manual must contain the information needed  
13 to operate the facility properly and meet the following  
14 requirements:

16 applicable provisions of parts 7011.2200 to 7011.2220 and
