- 7 9205.0400 SCOPE AND AUTHORITY.
- Parts 9205.0400 to 9205.0445 implement the pollution
- 9 prevention grant program created and described under Minnesota
- 10 Statutes, sections 115A.154, 115A.55, and 115D.05, by
- ll establishing the substantive criteria and procedural conditions
- 12 under which the director may award grants for waste source
- 13 reduction and pollution prevention projects.
- 14 9205.0410 DEFINITIONS.
- 15 Subpart 1. Scope. The terms defined in this part apply to
- 16 parts 9205.0400 to 9205.0445. For terms not defined in this
- 17 part, the definitions in Minnesota Statutes, sections 115A.03
- 18 and 115D.03, apply, unless the context requires otherwise.
- 19 Subp. 4. Director. "Director" means the director of the
- 20 Office of Environmental Assistance.

- 22 Subp. 10a. Office. "Office" means the Office of
- 23 Environmental Assistance established in Minnesota Statutes,
- 24 section 115A.055.
- 25 Subp. 11. Person. "Person" has the meaning given it in
- 26 Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.03, subdivision 23.
- 27 Subp. 16. Pollution prevention, prevent pollution, or
- 28 source reduction. "Pollution prevention," "prevent pollution,"
- 29 or "source reduction" means eliminating or reducing at the
- 30 source the quantity or toxicity intrinsic hazard of toxic
- 31 pollutants, hazardous substances, hazardous wastes, solid
- 32 wastes, or industrial wastes used, generated, or released.
- 33 Subp. 17. Release. "Release" has the meaning given it in
- 34 Minnesota Statutes, section 115D.03, subdivision 10.
- 35 Subp. 17a. Solid waste. "Solid waste" has the meaning

- 1 given it in Minnesota Statutes, section 116.06, subdivision 22.

- 3 9205.0420 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA.
- 4 Subpart 1. Eligible applicants. Eligible applicants are
- 5 persons who use, generate, or release toxic pollutants,
- 6 hazardous substances, hazardous wastes, solid wastes, or
- 7 industrial wastes in Minnesota, or individuals or organizations
- 8 in Minnesota that provide assistance to such persons and/or to
- 9 other persons affected by the generation of such pollutants or
- 10 wastes in Minnesota.
- 11 Subp. 2. Eligible projects. Eligible projects are
- 12 projects that primarily develop or implement pollution
- 13 prevention projects or practices.
- 14 Projects currently under development by the applicant and
- 15 new projects are eligible; however, grant funds shall only be
- 16 awarded for costs incurred after the effective date of the grant
- 17 agreement.
- Subp. 3. Eligible costs. Eligible costs are limited to
- 19 the costs of developing or implementing pollution prevention
- 20 projects or practices consistent with subpart 2. Eligible costs
- 21 are limited to a maximum of three-quarters of the total cost of
- 22 the project. The director may restrict the use of grant funds
- 23 for capital improvements or the purchase of equipment to a
- 24 percentage of the grant, if all such restrictions appear in the
- 25 Request for Proposals required by part 9205.0425 for the grant
- 26 round to which they apply.
- 27 9205.0425 REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS.
- To initiate the process for awarding a pollution prevention
- 29 grant, the director shall publish a Request for Proposals (RFP)
- 30 notice in the State Register advising eligible applicants of the
- 31 availability of pollution prevention grants. The RFP shall
- 32 describe the procedure for awarding grants and establish a
- 33 deadline by which applications must be submitted. In the RFP,
- 34 the director may limit or prioritize the types of projects for
- 35 which a grant would be awarded in the funding round initiated by

- 1 the RFP, may specify the maximum amount of funding to be awarded
- 2 to a project, and may set limitations on eligible costs as
- 3 described in part 9205.0420, subpart 3. In the RFP, the
- 4 director may establish application information requirements and
- 5 evaluation criteria that correlate to specific grant program
- 6 targets, in addition to the requirements of part 9205.0430,
- 7 subparts 2 and 5.
- 8 9205.0430 GRANT APPLICATION.
- 9 Subpart 1. [See repealer.]
- 10 Subp. 2. Applications. Following the publication of the
- 11 RFP in the State Register, applicants that seek assistance must
- 12 submit applications in the form specified by the director.
- 13 Applications must be received by the director by the deadline
- 14 established in the RFP. Each application must include the
- 15 following:
- 16 A. the names, qualifications, and addresses of the
- 17 applicant and other project participants;
- B. a description of the proposed project;
- 19 C. project information, including:
- 20 (1) a work plan that includes a list of each
- 21 project activity or task, an implementation schedule with
- 22 specific timelines, and persons involved in completing each
- 23 activity or task;
- 24 (2) the location of the proposed project;
- 25 (3) the type and source of pollution prevention
- 26 to be eliminated-or-reduced achieved by the proposed project;
- 27 (4) a discussion of whether implementation of the
- 28 proposed project is likely to minimize the transfer of pollution
- 29 from one environmental medium to another;
- 30 (5) a description or identification of the
- 31 potential applicability of the proposed project activities and
- 32 results to other persons or organizations in Minnesota;
- 33 (6) a description of the statewide significance
- 34 of the project; and
- 35 (7) a statement of the current status of the

- l proposed project;
- D. if relevant, information demonstrating that the
- 3 project will comply with applicable regulations, including a
- 4 list of permits required for the project;
- 5 E. a project budget that:
- 6 (1) identifies the total cost of the proposed
- 7 project and identifies each of the expenditures that make up
- 8 this cost; and
- 9 (2) states the amount of grant funds being
- 10 requested and the amount of matching funds being supplied by the
- 11 applicant or others. If a person other than the applicant is
- 12 providing matching funds, the application must identify the
- 13 sources of the additional funds; and
- 14 F. for projects addressing solid waste, evidence that
- 15 affected counties, regions, or districts have been notified of
- 16 the proposed projects; and
- 17 G. additional program-specific information as
- 18 established by the director in the RFP required in part
- 19 9205.0425.
- 20 Subp. 2a. Nonpublic data. Sales information or specific
- 21 data in the grant application that meets the definition in
- 22 Minnesota Statutes, section 13.37, subdivision 1, paragraph (b),
- 23 shall be handled as provided by Minnesota Statutes, section
- 24 115A.06, subdivision 13; however, all information developed as a
- 25 result of a pollution prevention grant shall be public data.

- Subp. 5. Evaluation of proposal. In order to determine
- 29 which projects should receive a pollution prevention grant, the
- 30 director shall evaluate each application using the following
- 31 criteria:
- A. clarity and completeness of application;
- B. potential of proposed project to prevent
- 34 pollution;
- 35 C. qualifications of the individuals who will perform
- 36 the work described in the project;

- D. potential of the proposed project to minimize the
- 2 transfer of pollution from one environmental medium to another;
- 3 E. if applicable, compliance of the proposed project
- 4 with regulatory requirements;
- 5 F. emphasis of the proposed project on prevention-of
- 6 pollution prevention over other methods of management;
- 7 G. cost-effectiveness of the proposed project;
- 8 H. assets and resources available to the applicant to
- 9 conduct the project;
- 10 I. innovativeness of the proposed project;
- J. applicability of the proposed project and future
- 12 dissemination of project results to other persons or
- 13 organizations in the state;
- 14 K. consistency of the proposed project with the
- 15 legislative goals and policies in Minnesota Statutes, sections
- 16 115A.02 and 115D.02; and
- 17 L. additional criteria specified in the RFP required
- 18 by part 9205.0425.
- 19 The director may request additional information from the
- 20 applicant by letter or interview during the evaluation process
- 21 to clarify the information provided pursuant to subpart 1.

- Subp. 7. No grant awards. If the director determines that
- 24 no proposed project has sufficient potential to prevent
- 25 pollution in Minnesota, the director shall not award any
- 26 grants. The director may then reinitiate the process for
- 27 awarding grants by publishing the RFP under subpart 1.
- Subp. 8. Consultation. In the director's evaluation of an
- 29 application, the director may solicit and consider any
- 30 recommendations provided by Office of Environmental Assistance
- 31 advisory councils, task forces, citizen groups, or any
- 32 independent consultant hired by the director to assist in the
- 33 review of applications.
- 34 9205.0432 FEDERAL GRANT MATCHES.
- 35 The director may award grants as a match to obtain federal

- l pollution prevention grants without issuing a RFP under part
- 2 9205.0425, if the following conditions are met:
- A. the applicant is eligible under part 9205.0420,
- 4 subpart 1;
- B. the project is eligible under part 9205.0420,
- 6 subpart 2;
- 7 C. a proposal is submitted to the director by the
- 8 applicant containing all of the elements described in part
- 9 9205.0430, subpart 2;
- 10 D. the proposed project meets the criteria outlined
- 11 in part 9205.0430, subpart 5; and
- 12 E. the grant awarded under this part makes up no more
- 13 than 25 percent of the total project costs.
- 14 9205.0435 LIMITATIONS.
- 15 Subpart 1. Reduced grant awards. The director may ask an
- 16 applicant to document the impacts of reduced financial
- 17 assistance before finalizing an award for less than the eligible
- 18 amount requested by an applicant or less than the maximum award
- 19 established in the RFP under part 9205.0425. Reduced funds
- 20 shall be awarded where the director determines:
- 21 A. program resources are insufficient to provide full
- 22 assistance to all applicant to which the director intends to
- 23 award grants or loans; or
- 24 B. the applicant could operate the project at a
- 25 reduced level and still achieve project objectives.

- 27 9205.0445 GRANT AGREEMENT.
- 28 A grant agreement shall:
- [For text of items A and B, see M.R.]
- 30 C. require that the recipient provide periodic
- 31 written and oral reports to the director on the progress and

results of the project, and a one-page project summary at the

- 33 conclusion of the project, in a format specified by the
- 34 director;

- 1 F. provide that the results of the project performed
- 2 under this agreement are public data;

- 4 SOLID WASTE REDUCTION LOAN PROGRAM
- 5 9210.0700 SCOPE AND AUTHORITY.
- 6 Parts 9210.0700 to 9210.0770 implement the solid waste
- 7 source reduction loan program created and described under
- 8 Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.55, by establishing the
- 9 substantive criteria and procedural conditions under which the
- 10 director may award loans for solid waste source reduction
- 11 projects.
- 12 9210.0710 DEFINITIONS.

- 14 Subp. 2. Director. "Director" means the director of the
- 15 Office of Environmental Assistance.
- [For text of subp 2a, see M.R.]
- 17 Subp. 3. Office. "Office" means the Minnesota Office of
- 18 Environmental Assistance established in Minnesota Statutes,
- 19 section 115A.055.
- [For text of subp 4, see M.R.]
- 21 Subp. 5. Program. "Program" means the Solid Waste Source
- 22 Reduction Loan Program.
- 23 [For text of subps 6 and 7, see M.R.]
- 24 9210.0720 APPLICATION PROCEDURES.
- 25 Subpart 1. Notification by director. To initiate the
- 26 process for awarding loans for solid waste source reduction
- 27 projects, the director shall publish a notice in the State
- 28 Register advising eligible applicants of the availability of
- 29 solid waste source reduction loans. The notice shall describe
- 30 the maximum amount of funding available for a project, and
- 31 establish a deadline by which proposals must be submitted. In
- 32 the notice, the director may also limit the types of projects
- 33 for which a loan would be awarded in the funding round initiated
- 34 by the notice.

- 1 Subp. 2. Proposals. Following the publication of a notice
- 2 in the State Register, eligible applicants that seek assistance
- 3 must submit proposals to the director. Proposals must be
- 4 received by the director by the deadline established in the
- 5 notice. Upon the request of the applicant, the office shall
- 6 handle specific information as nonpublic data pursuant to
- 7 Minnesota Statutes, section 115A.06, subdivision 13; however,
- 8 all information developed as a result of a loan shall be made
- 9 available to persons through the office's public information
- 10 program. Proposals for loans under part 9210.0770 shall contain
- 11 the information in part 9210.0770, subpart 5.
- 12 [For text of subps 3 and 4, see M.R.]
- Subp. 5. Evaluation of proposal. The director shall
- 14 evaluate each proposal that is determined to be eligible and
- 15 complete using the criteria in part 9210.0770, subpart 6.
- 16 Subp. 6. Award of loans. The director shall award loans
- 17 for those projects that the director determines best satisfy the
- 18 criteria applicable to the program under which the applicant is
- 19 requesting financial assistance. The director shall notify
- 20 those applicants that do not receive loan awards. An applicant
- 21 that does not receive an award may resubmit a proposal upon
- 22 future notice by the director under subpart 1.
- 23 Subp. 7. No loan awards. If the director determines that
- 24 no proposal will provide sufficient assistance to the state in
- 25 achieving its solid waste source reduction goals, the director
- 26 may decide not to award any loan. The director may then
- 27 reinitiate the process for awarding loans by publishing a notice
- 28 under subpart 1.
- 29 Subp. 8. Consultation. In the director's evaluation of
- 30 the proposal, the director shall consider recommendations
- 31 provided by advisory councils to the office.
- 32 9210.0730 LIMITATIONS.
- 33 Subpart 1. Reduced loan awards. The director shall ask an
- 34 applicant to document the impacts of reduced financial
- 35 assistance before awarding funds less than the eligible amount

- 1 requested by the applicant or less than the maximum award
- 2 established in the notice under part 9210.0720, subpart 1.
- 3 Reduced funds shall be awarded where the director determines
- 4 that:
- 5 A. program resources are insufficient to provide full
- 6 assistance to all applicants to which the director intends to
- 7 award loans; or
- B. the applicant could operate the project at a
- 9 reduced level and still achieve project objectives.
- 10 Subp. 2. Limitations on disbursal of funds. No loan funds
- 11 shall be disbursed until the recipient has executed a written
- 12 loan agreement with the director.
- 13 9210.0740 LOAN AGREEMENTS.
- 14 A loan agreement shall:
- 15 A. incorporate by reference the proposal submitted to
- 16 the director;
- B. provide that any cost overruns incurred in the
- 18 development and implementation of the proposed project shall be
- 19 the sole responsibility of the recipient;
- 20 C. require that the recipient provide periodic
- 21 written reports to the director on the implementation and
- 22 results of the project;
- D. identify the interest rate and repayment
- 24 obligations for the loan recipient;
- 25 E. authorize the director to determine that the loan
- 26 recipient is in default and require that loan recipient
- 27 immediately repay the loan in full if the director determines
- 28 that, due to the bad faith of the loan recipient, a project has
- 29 not been developed and implemented according to the terms and
- 30 conditions of the loan agreement;
- 31 F. authorize the director to cease making further
- 32 disbursements to the loan recipient and to recover the unspent
- 33 funds if the director determines that, for reasons other than
- 34 bad faith, a project has not been developed and implemented
- 35 according to the terms and conditions of the loan agreement and

- 1 amendment of the agreement is not justified;
- 2 G. require that the recipient perform and complete
- 3 project activities according to the work plan in the proposal
- 4 submitted to the director and incorporated into the loan
- 5 agreement;
- 6 H. require that the recipient provide objective,
- 7 detailed information in its final report listing the solid waste
- 8 source reduction achieved during the project in terms of:
- 9 (1) changes in disposed volume when measured
- 10 under uncompacted conditions;
- 11 (2) changes in disposed weight;
- 12 (3) cost changes in purchase and handling of
- 13 materials;
- 14 (4) cost changes in solid waste disposal; and
- 15 (5) changes in toxicity, if any;
- 16 I. require that all information developed as a result
- 17 of a loan shall be made available to other persons through the
- 18 office's public information program;
- J. require that the recipient maintain detailed
- 20 records of all expenditures related to the project; and
- 21 K. establish other conditions or terms needed to
- 22 manage or implement the loan agreement.
